ORDER OF THE TREASURY FIXING A MAXIMUM PRICE FOR SILVER BULLION SOLD IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The KING has been graciously pleased to make a posthumous award of the Decoration of the Albert Medal in recognition of the gallantry of Mr. David Falconer, Chief Engineer of the Steamship "War Knight" of London.

On the 24th March, 1918, the British S.S. "War Knight" was proceeding up Channel in convoy, in company with the United States Oil Carrier "O. B. Jennings." About 2.30 a.m.

the "War Knight" struck the other vessel on the starboard side abreast the bridge. Flames and fumes of naphtha appear to have spurted out of the "O. B. Jennings," rushed the whole length of the "War Knight," and set her on fire. The after part of the "O. B. Jennings" also was soon burning furiously and the ships swung together, the "War Knight" being to leeward of the "O. B. Jennings" and consequently completely enveloped in the smoke, fumes and flames from the weather ship.

Immediately after the collision flames swept across the top of the engine-room through the open skylight. Mr. Falconer stood in the flames and shut the skylights down to prevent the fire from entering the engine-room.

Later on, when the third engineer and a fireman, who had remained below, made their way on deck, the former was severely burnt and gassed, and Mr. Falconer dragged both men to a place where there were less flames and fumes, and then put them into the engineers' mess-room with others whom he had collected from their bunks, and by breaking the skylight he assisted them all to get on to the boat deck.

Finally, although he could not swim, he took off his own lifebelt and put it on the third engineer, and did not leave the ship until he was satisfied that there were no others in need of assistance.

Mr. Falconer displayed the greatest gallantry in rendering these services; but he was so injured that he subsequently succumbed in hospital.

To empower the Board, and any Company formed or to be formed for the purpose (*inter alia*) of producing gas and extracting residuals from coal, to enter into and carry into effect agreements for the supply to the Board of gas for the purposes of their gas undertaking, upon and subject to such terms and conditions as may be agreed; to authorize the Board to supply such gas, and wholly or partially to discontinue their gasworks; to authorize the parties to any such agreement to execute any necessary works, and lay down mains in highways and elsewhere, whether within or beyond the Board's limits of supply, and to confirm every such agreement and make provision for carrying it into effect.

3. To empower the Board to purchase coke-oven gas or gas in crude or unpurified form, from any company, body or person producing the same, and whether in bulk or otherwise, and to utilise any gas so purchased for the purposes of the gas undertaking and other purposes of the Board, and to supply any such gas to any authority, company or person within the Board's limits of supply for

heating, manufacturing, power or other purposes, and to empower the Board, for the purposes of obtaining, procuring, conveying, utilising and supplying any such gas, to erect, maintain, use, lay down, repair, alter and renew mains, pipes and culverts within the Board's limits of supply, and within the urban districts of Wath-upon-Dearne and the rural district of Rotherham.

4. To authorize the Board to borrow money for the purposes of the Bill upon the security of their rates and revenues and upon the district funds and general district rates of the urban districts of Swinton and Mexborough, and to apply the provisions of the Swinton and Mexborough Gas Board Act, 1909 (herein referred to as the Act of 1909) to any such borrowing.

5. To limit the deficiency to be made good by any constituent authority, and to enable the Board to carry forward any deficiency beyond such limit, and otherwise to amend the financial provisions of the Act of 1909.

6. To alter, vary or amend the Act of 1909, and any other Act or Order relating to the Board.

7. To incorporate with the Bill, with such variations as may be considered desirable, the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871.

(e) The purchase of property, compensation, works and incidental expenses (including the rehousing of persons of the working classes displaced) in connection with the following improvements and works, that is to say:—

New street (Holborn to Strand) authorized by the London County Council (Improvements) Act, 1899, and the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1910.

Widenings of Stanstead-road, Catford-hill, Catford-road, Dalston-lane and Graham-road authorized by the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1911.

Widenings of High-street, Wandsworth, and East-hill, Wandsworth, authorized by the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1913.

Widenings of High-street, Eltham, and Eltham-road authorized by the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1914.

(f) Asylums, mental hospitals and institutions and the care of the insane or mentally afflicted or deficient.

(j) Pumping stations, outfalls, machinery, sewers and other purposes of main drainage.

(k) The construction, reconstruction and equipment of tramways; the provision of buildings, power stations, machinery and rolling stock; the purchase of lands and other purposes in connection with Acts relating to tramways.

(l) The exercise of any powers which may be conferred upon the Council by any Act or Acts which may be passed by Parliament in the present Session.

(m) Generally all other subjects in respect of which capital expenditure may be necessary.

To empower an Extraordinary Court of Directors of the Society from time to time during the period between the 31st day of December, 1918, and the date of the next succeeding periodical investigation of the
