A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ROUBLE NOTES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS it is desirable to prohibit the importation of certain Rouble Notes into the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue thus Our Royal Proclamation in pursuance of Section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, and We do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

The importation into the United Kingdom of all Rouble Notes (other than Rouble Notes issued by the Caisse d'Emission of the Provisional Government of Archangel) is hereby prohibited:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such Notes which are imported --nder licence given by or on behalf of Our Treasury and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Pro-

hibition of Import (No. 30) Proclamation, 1919, and shall come into operation from the date hereof.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Ninth year of Our Reign.

ENGLAND AND WALES, SOUTH AND WEST COASTS.

Portland Bill to Bardsey Island—Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No 74 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I.—REGULATION RESPECTING SMALL CRAFT.

Oil, motor spirit, petrol, or other goods may not be shipped on board craft of any description, whether coasting or foreign, either as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel, or as merchandise, except at places which are under the supervision of a Customs Officer. Such goods must be properly preentered before shipment, and a clearance must be obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915. Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or other similar substances, exceeding 4 gallons.

II.—REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO COMMERCIAL FISHERMEN.

The following Regulations are to be complied with by all fishing vessels and boats on

the coast of England and Wales from Portland Bill westwards to Bardsey Island (hereinafter referred to as the South-Western Area).

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3. (i.) By day and night, the laying of nets, or of crab or any other pots, trawling, long-lining, drifting, or anchoring is prohibited within the area bounded:

On the North: By a line joining the following places and points, viz.:—The Longships—the Runnelstone—a point 4 miles 164° (South Mag.) from St. Michael's Mount tower—a point one mile 164° (South Mag.) from Lizard head—a point half a mile 164° (South Mag.) from Black head—a point 2 miles 164° (South Mag.) from Dodman point—Rame head—Mewstone buoy—a point one mile 164° (South Mag.) from Bolt head—a point one mile 164° (South Mag.) from Prawle point—a point one mile 119° (S. 45° E. Mag.) from Start point—Skerries bell-buoy—

On the South: By a line from Wolf rock to a position in lat. 49° 46′ N., long. 5° 12′ W.—thence to a position in lat. 50° 06′ N., long. 4° 16′ W.—thence to a position in lat. 50° 05′ N., long. 3° 33′ W.

On the East: By the meridian of Skerries

buoy (long. 3° 33' W.).

On the West: By a line joining the Longships and Wolf rock.

(ii) The above prohibition does not apply to vessels sailing across the prohibited area, or whiffing with handlines without anchoring.

(iii.) Anchoring for the purpose of handlining, and fishing with longlines, is permitted within 2½ miles of the Eddystone.

(iv.) Drift nets, lobster lines, etc., are liable to be swept up by mine sweepers, and should not be laid in certain areas which are promulgated by Port Fishery Orders

(v.) Pending the complete withdrawal of the regulations, permission to fish in the areas prohibited as and when they are cleared will be promulgated by Port Fishery Orders

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5.	Local	regulations	are	in	force	as	\mathbf{follow}

(i.) Port Fishery Orders are in force at Brixham, Plymouth, Newlyn and Mousehole, St. Ives, Padstow, Swansea, and Milford Haven. Vessels fishing out of those ports, and out of such other ports as may be placed under Port Fishery Orders, are to fish in organised fleets under the orders of the Port Fishery Officer.

(111.) Fishing in Prohibited Areas:

(a) Special permission has been, and may from time to time be, granted by Port Fishery Orders for vessels fishing out of certain ports to engage in specified forms of fishing within specified portions of the prohibited areas defined in paragraph 3 above. This permission can be obtained only from the Inspector of Fisheries for the S.W. Area, through the Port Fishery Officer of the port concerned, to whom application should be made in the first place.

(b) Orders permitting fishing within the prohibited areas are to be strictly com-

plied with in every respect.

(iv.) Whitsand Bay. Night fishing is permitted in Whitsand Bay inshore of the northern line of the prohibited area, as defined in paragraph 3 (i.) above, provided that:

(a) During the hours of "official night" no vessel, approaching Plymouth, may cross to the eastward of a line drawn 231° (S. 67° W. Mag.) from

Rame Head; and

(b) Except on Sundays, no boat may approach within three miles of the coast between Tregantle and Portwrinkle up to the hour of 12.0 midnight, or such later hour as may be ordered.

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8.	il, motor spirit, petrol,

and other goods in fishing vessels is subject to the Customs Regulations for the time being.

9. Admiralty Orders for British fishing vessels are in all cases to be obeyed: See the current Notices to Fishermen (the "Green Book '') issued free to fishermen at Mercantile Marine and Customs Offices.

Notes.

Wrecks.—Fishermen 1. Reporting notified that all wrecks found by them should be buoyed and reported to the local Naval Authorities in order that their positions may be recorded with a view to their being charted, and also that the wreck may, if practicable, be destroyed.

2. Amateur fishermen and pleasure craft and fishing craft may not navigate or fish in areas, or at times, or in any manner forbidden

to commercial fishermen.

3. Fishery Officer means an officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, a Port Fishery Officer, or other person duly appointed

to issue fishing permits.
4. Charts of prohibited areas and of areas affected by Port Fishery Orders can be seen by fishermen on application to Port Fishery

5. Complaints on the part of the fishing community, and questions of doubt, should be referred in the first instance to the local Fishery Officer, or direct to the Inspector of Fisheries attached to the area.

III.—PLYMOUTH.

Neutral vessels are now permitted to enter the Port of Plymouth.

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PART II .- MOVEMENTS WITHIN THE PORT.

9. The movements of all merchant ships, fishing vessels, or boats of any kind, are subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, for the Sound, and the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, for the Hamoaze, whose orders are to be immediately

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Approach to Govern	nment Vessels and

Establishments. 12. No merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) will be allowed to approach any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government Dockyard or Establishment, without special permission.

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Prohibited Areas.

15. When anchoring, care must be taken to be well clear of the fairway.

The Bridge.—The passage the "bridge" is entirely closed. No vessel, boat, or craft of any kind is at any time allowed to be within 200 yards of the obstructions which are placed across the "bridge."

Mount Batten Breakwater.—All small craft are warned that they should not approach within 200 yards of Mount Batten Breakwater, it being necessary to keep this area clear for seaplanes going out and returning.

Fishing is now permitted by night in Whitsand bay, subject to the following regulations:

(a) No fishing at night is to take place east of a line drawn in a 231° (S. 67° W. Mag.) direction from Rame head._

(b) Except on Sundays, no night fishing is to take place within three miles of the coast between Tregantle and Portwrinkle up to the hour of 12 midnight, or such later hour as may be ordered.

A limited number of moorings for yachts may be laid in the following places and nowhere else:

On West Hoe—on application to King's Harbour Master, Plymouth; in the Cattewater above Turnchapel-on application to the Harbour Master of Cattewater.

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18. Merchant vessels (including those engaged in the coastal trade) must on no account leave the Dockyard ports of Devonport and Plymouth without permission.

Vessels in the Hamoaze must obtain such permission from the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, at his office in the Dockyard; those at berths in the waters of the Sound, Cawsand bay, Cattewater, Sutton pool, or Milbay docks, must obtain permission from the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, at Longroom, Stone-

It is also necessary for ships to obtain permission from the Collector of Customs, at the Barbican, Plymouth

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PART IV.—BOOM DEFENCE AND NAVIGATION of Narrow Waters.

The boom defence has now been dismantled, and the two boom defence vessels which were moored between Devil's point and Wilderness point have been removed. These vessels have been moored at swinging moorings laid to the north-westward of the entrance to Millbrook lake. Position of mooring-buoy is 286° (N. 68° W. Mag.), 575 yards from Cremyll obelisk. The vessels being The vessels being moored out of the fairway, no lights will be displayed on them by night, and all vessels and boats are cautioned to keep well clear of them.

22. Vessels are warned to pay strict attention to Clause 9, Order in Council, 4th September, 1918, Regulations for the Dockyard Ports of Plymouth and Devonport, and no merchant vessel, whether navigating with or against the tide, is to attempt to pass a man-of-war in the "Narrows" when she is flying the "Red Ensign" over "M" Commercial by day, or a red light by night, at the fore

'A vessel navigating against the tide should ease her engines and wait until any other vessel going with the tide has passed clear.

The following signals are hoisted at Mount Wise, Longroom, and South dockyard signal station:

Signal and Signification.

Ball over Red Burgee.—Large ships coming from Sound to Hamoaze; all traffic outwards between Rubble bank and Melampus lightbuoy is to cease while this signal is flying.

Red Burgee over Ball.—Large ships coming

from Hamoaze to Sound; all traffic inwards between Melampus lightbuoy and Rubble bank

is to cease while this signal is flying.

It must be clearly understood that when either of the above signals is hoisted, no merchant vessel is allowed to be under way within the limits defined hereunder, unless permission has previously been obtained from the Naval authorities.

Limits.

The Northern limit being a line drawn 90° and 270° (S. 74° E. Mag. and N. 74° W. Mag.) through the north Rubble buoy, and the Southern limit being a line joining Dunstone point and Melampus light-buoy.

Ordinary Port Regulations.

23. The ordinary Regulations of the Port, except as affected by this Notice, are to be strictly adhered to.

2. Vessels of all descriptions are prohibited from anchoring in St. Helen's roads to the westward of a line drawn in a 162° (S. 3° E. Mag.) direction from Noman's fort.

IV. PORTLAND HARBOUR APPROACH —SPECIAL REGULATIONS

1. No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland bill with St. Alban's head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage, or as stated in succeeding paragraphs.

2. Seine and line fishing by night as well as by day may now be carried out in the areas

laid down.

3. Fishing (including the use of trawls) may be carried out by night as well. as by day within two miles of the shore, between Wor-Fbarrow head and Weymouth pier, but vessels must keep clear of the obstruction which extends from a position 1½ miles, 193° (S 28° W. Mag.), from Whitenose to the southward.

- 4. Fishing (including the use of trawls) may be carried out in the area enclosed by a straight line drawn from a point 5 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill to a point 8½ miles, 180° (S. 15° W. May.), from St. Alban's head, thence to a point 30 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from St. Alban's head, thence to a point 30 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill, thence to a point 5 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill.
- 5. To authorize the Corporation to purchase or acquire compulsorily or by agreement the lands in the parish and county borough of Leicester, comprising the property known as Freemen's Meadows, containing 35 acres 2 roods and 28 poles, or thereabouts, bounded on the north by a road called St. Mary's-road, on the east partly by Aylestone-road and partly by land belonging to the Corporation, known as Raw Dikes, on the south by the Burton branch of the Midland Railway, and on the west by the River Soar

To empower the Corporation and their officers and employees to enter upon the said lands for the purposes of survey and valuation.

manner provided by the Bill of questions of disputed compensation arising under the intended Act, and to render mapplicable to the settlement of such questions the provisions of the Land Clauses Acts relating to the settlement of cases of disputed compensation by justices or a jury, and to vary or amend the said Acts accordingly in their application to the Corporation.

To authorize the Corporation either unconditionally or subject to conditions to construct, provide, lay down, alter, renew, maintain, enlarge, work and use upon the said lands, stations and works for the generation, storage, transformation, distribution, conversion and supply of electricity with buildings, engines, dynamos, batteries, machinery, apparatus, railway sidings, works and appliances.

To provide that for purposes of accounts or for those purposes, and all or any other purposes, the existing and any future generating stations owned by the Corporation for the purposes of their electrical undertaking authorized by the Leicester Electric Lighting Order, 1890, as amended by subsequent Acts, and the existing and any future generating stations owned by them for the purposes of their tramway undertaking, shall be deemed to form part of one undertaking for the generation supply and distribution of electrical energy.

To authorize the connection of the intended generating station with the existing generating stations of the Corporation, or any of them, and the supply of electrical energy from any of such stations to any other thereof for use either for general purposes or for particular purposes, and the laying of cables, wires and apparatus for the purposes of such connection, and the breaking up of streets and roads therefor.

To make special provisions as to the price to be charged in the accounts of the Corporation relating to their tramway undertaking for electrical energy generated by them and used for the purposes of that undertaking.

To empower the Corporation to retain, hold and use or to sell, lease, exchange or otherwise dispose of, in such manner and for such consideration and purpose, and on such terms and conditions as they may think fit, and either in consideration of the execution of works or of the payment of a gross sum, or of an annual rent, or of any payment in any other form any lands, or interest in lands, acquired, or to be acquired, under the intended Act or any other Act, whether local or general, or any Provisional or other Order, and to sell, exchange or dispose of any rents reserved on the sale, lease, exchange or disposition of such lands or interests, and to make, do and execute deeds, acts and things for those purposes, and to give or take money for equality of exchange and for the purposes aforesaid, or any of them, to vary the rights and obligations of the Corporation under the Lands Clauses Acts or the Public Health Act,

To make provisions as to the application and disposal of capital moneys received by the Corporation on the re-sale, exchange or leasing of lands

To extend the time as now limited by an Order dated the 3rd day of October, 1918, and made by the Board of Trade under the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, for the construction of Tramways Nos 2, 2A, 3, 3A, 3B, 4, 4A, 4B, 5, 5A, 5B, 6, 7, 7A, 7B, 8B and 8c described in and authorized by the Leicester

Corporation Act, 1913, and to vary the provisions of the last mentioned Act accordingly.

Tramway No. 2, commencing by a junction with the existing tramway in Gray's Inn-road, at a point $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains northward of the junction of Gray's Inn-road with High Holborn, passing thence into High Holborn, and along Holborn, across Holborn-circus, and along Charterhouse-street into and terminating in Farringdon-road by a junction with Tramway No. 1 hereinbefore described, at a point 1 chain northward of the junction of Charterhouse-street with Farringdonroad.

Tramway No. 2A, commencing by a junction with Tramway No. 2 hereinbefore described, at a point $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains westward of the junction of Farringdon-road with Charterhouse-street, and terminating by a junction with Tramway No. 1 hereinbefore described, at a point 1½ chains southward of the junction of Charterhouse-street with Farringdonstreet.

Tramways Nos. 2 and 2a will be made. or pass in, through, or into the following parishes and places, or some of them: -The parish of St. Andrew and St. George, Holborn, and the Liberty of Saffron Hill, in the metropolitan borough of Holborn, and the county and parish of the City of London.

Aldgate Terminus to Aldgate Station.

Tramway No. 3, commencing in Aldgate High-street at a point 1 chain eastward of the junction of Minories with Aldgate Highstreet, passing thence along Aldgate Highstreet and Whitechapel High-street and terminating in the last-named thoroughfare by a junction with the existing tramway therein at a point 2 chains eastward of the junction of Mansell-street with Whitechapel Highstreet.

Tramway No. 3 will be made or pass in, through, or into the following parishes and places or some of them:—The county and parish of the City of London, and the parish of Whitechapel, in the metropolitan borough of S**tepney**,

Hampstead-road to Oxford-street.

Tramway No. 4, commencing in Hampstead-road by a junction with the existing tramway therein at its point of termination at the southern end of Hampstead-road, passing thence along Tottenham Court-road, and terminating in that thoroughfare at a point 1 chain north-westward of its junction with Oxford-street.

Tramway No. 4 will be made or pass in, through, or into the following parishes and places, or some of them: -The parish of St. Pancras in the metropolitan borough of St. Pancras, the parish of St. Giles in the Fields in the metropolitan borough of Holborn and the parish of St. Marylebone in the metropolitan borough of St. Marylebone.

Seven Sisters-road to Stamford Hill

Tramway No. 5, commencing in Seven Sisters-road by a junction with the existing

tramway therein at a point 1 chain southwestward of the junction of Seven Sistersroad with Amhurst Park, passing thence along Amhurst Park to and terminating in Clapton Common by a junction with the existing tramway therein at a point 1 chain eastward of the junction of Amhurst Park with Stamford Hill.

5a, No. Tramway commencing Amhurst Park by a junction with Tramway No. 5, hereinbefore described, at a point I chain westward of the junction of Stamford Hill with Amhurst Park and terminating in Stamford Hill by a junction with the existing tramway therein at a point 1 chain southward of the junction of Amhurst Park with Stamford Hill.

Tramways Nos. 5 and 5A will be made or pass in, through, or into the following parishes and places, or some of them: -The parish of St. Mary, Stoke Newington, in the metro-politan borough of Stoke Newington, and the parish of St. John, Hackney, in the metropolitan borough of Hackney.

New Oxford-street to Southampton-row.

Tramway No. 6, commencing in Hartstreet at a point ½ a chain eastward of the junction of Museum-street with Hart-street, passing thence along Hart-street, Bloomsbury-square and Vernon-place, to and terminating in Theobald's-road by a junction with the existing tramway therein at a point 2 chains eastward of the junction of Southampton-row with Theobalds-road.

Tramway No. 6 will be situate in the parish of St. George, Bloomsbury, in the metropolitan borough of Holborn.

To empower the Council to alter or reconstruct (which expression includes the laying of the reconstructed tramway in a different position in the street from that occupied by the existing tramway) certain existing tramways or parts of tramways in the county of London, which, when reconstructed (hereinafter referred to as "the reconstructed tramways"), will consist of the following (that is to say):-

Victoria Embanhment and Blackfriars Bridge.

So much of the tramway of the City Corporation on the Victoria Embankment and Blackfriars Bridge as lies between a point 4 chains eastward of John Carpenter-street and a point 61 chains southward of William-

The part of the tramway to be reconstructed will be situate in the county and parish of the city of London.

Seven Sisters-road at Amhurst Park.

So much of the tramway of the Metropolitan Electric Tramways Limited in Seven Sisters-road as lies between points respectively 2 chains south-westward and 1 chain north-eastward of the junction of Amhurst Park with Seven Sisters-road.

The part of the tramway to be reconstructed will be situate in the parish of St. Mary, Stoke Newington, in the metropolitan borough of

Stoke Newington.

Narrow Places.

It is proposed to lay the tramways in the following cases so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath, on the side or sides of the street or road hereinafter mentioned and the nearest rail of the tramway: -

Tramway No. 1-

On Blackfriars Bridge on the western side thereof-

Between points respectively 5 chains and 5½ chains southward of William-street.

Tramway No. 1a— On the Victoria Embankment on south-western side thereof-

Between points respectively 2½ chains and 5 chains eastward of John Carpenter-street.

Tramway No. 2-

In Gray's Inn-road, on the eastern side thereof-

* Between High Holborn and a point $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains northward thereof.

In Holborn, on the northern side thereof— * Between Gray's Inn-road and a point $\frac{1}{2}$

Tramway No. 4-

a chain eastward thereof.

In Tottenham Court-road, on the northeastern side thereof—

* Between Bayley-street and Great Russell-street.

On the south-western side thereof—

Between Euston-road and a point 4 chains south-eastward thereof.

* Between a point 1 chain south-eastward of Percy-street and a point 1 chain southeastward of Hanway-street.

Tramway No. 5-

In Seven Sisters-road, on the north-western side thereof-

Between Amhurst Park and a point 1 chain south-westward thereof.

In Amhurst Park, on the southern side

*Between points respectively 1½ chains and 4 chains westward of Stamford Hill.

Tramway No. 5a-

In Amhurst Park on the southern side thereof-

* Between Stamford Hill and a point 1 chain westward thereof.

In Stamford Hill on the western side there-

* Between Amhurst Park and a point 1 chain southward thereof.

Tramway No. 6-In Hart-street, on the northern side there-

* Between Museum-street and the western side of Bloomsbury-square.

On the southern side thereof-

*Between Bury-street and a point opposite the western side of Bloomsbury-square. In Bloomsbury-square, on the southern side

thereof-* Between Southampton-street and a point opposite the western side of the said square. In Vernon-place, on the northern side thereof-

*Between Southampton-row and a point 11 chains westward thereof.

In Theobald's-road on the northern side thereof-

*Between Southampton-row and a point 2 chains eastward thereof.

The Reconstructed Tramways.

On the Victoria Embankment on the southern side thereof-

Between points respectively 4 chains and 6 chains eastward of John Carpenter-street. On Blackfriars Bridge and the northern approach thereto on the western side thereofBetween a point $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains southward of William-street and a point 6 chains eastward of John Carpenter-street.

In Seven Sisters-road, on the north-western side thereof---

Between points respectively 1 chain northeastward and 2 chains south-westward of Amhurst Park.

On the south-eastern side thereof-

*Between Amhurst Park and a point 2 chains south-westward thereof.

[Note.—Powers will be sought by the intended Act for widening the carriageway of such of the foregoing portions of streets or roads as are marked with an asterisk * by reducing the width of the footway at the side or sides thereof, and if such powers are obtained and exercised (but not otherwise) a space of 9 feet 6 inches or upwards will intervene between the outside of the footpath on the side of the street and the nearest rail of the Except as above stated it is intramway. tended that no tramway shall be made or reconstructed in any part of a street so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath on the side of the street and the nearest rail of the tramway.]

The tramways and the reconstructed tramways will be laid on a gauge of 4 feet 8½ inches, and it is not intended to run thereon carriages or trucks adapted for use upon railways, and the motive power proposed to be employed thereon will be either animal power or electrical or other mechanical power.

To provide that notwithstanding the provisions of section 23 of the London County Tramways (Electrical Power) Act, 1900, all or some of the tramways, including the reconstructed tramways, may be constructed, reconstructed and worked upon the overhead trolley system of electric traction or such other system as the intended Act may prescribe.

To empower the Council to make, maintain, alter and remove cross-overs, passing-places, sidings, junctions, and other works (in

addition to those particularly specified in the intended Act) for working the tramways and reconstructed tramways and for providing access to warehouses, stables, carriage-houses or works of the Council, and to lay down double lines in lieu of single or interlacing lines or single lines in lieu of double or interlacing lines, or interlacing lines in heu of double or single lines on any tramways of the Council which may for the time being be authorized, or made, and to alter the position in the road of any such tramways or any part thereof, and, in exercising the powers aforesaid, to lay rails at a less distance from the outside of the footpath than 9 feet 6 inches, on either or both sides of the road, and to confer upon the Council such other powers as may be necessary or convenient for the purposer aforesaid.

STREET WORKS.

To empower the Council to make the following street works, viz.:—

Widenings at Charterhouse-street and Farringdon-road.

A widening of Charterhouse-street, in the Liberty of Saffron Hill, in the metropolitan borough of Holborn, on the northern side thereof, between Farringdon-road and a point 1 chain westward thereof

A widening of Farringdon-road, in the said Liberty of Saffron Hill, on the western side thereof, between Charterhouse-street and a point 1 chain northward thereof.

Widening at Vernon-place.

A widening of Vernon-place, in the parish of St. George, Bloomsbury, in the metropolitan borough of Holborn, on the northern side thereof between the eastern side of Bloomsbury-square and a point $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains eastward thereof.

To empower the Council to make the widenings described in the next following table of the carriage way of the portions of streets or roads specified in the said table by reducing the width of the existing footway at the side or sides of such carriage way also specified in the said table:—

GENERAL PROVISIONS AS TO WORKS.

To enable the Council in connection with any of the intended works to erect hoardings or other works in streets, to alter and remove any drinking troughs, lamp-posts, railings, ventilators, refuges, public conveniences and other buildings and erections upon, in, or under the streets or lands shown on the plans to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned, and to divert, alter or stop up and appropriate or to make other provisions as to the vesting of the sites, materials and soil of any streets, courts, passages, thoroughfares or alleys shown upon

the said plans.

To authorize the Council in laying down the tramways and reconstructed tramways, placing, laying, repairing and maintaining posts, cables, wires, conduits, tubes, pipes, coverings, inspection boxes and appliances, and for any other purposes of the intended Act to open and break up the surface of and to alter, divert, stop up, remove otherwise interfere with any streets, roads, footpaths, steps, areas, sewers, drains, mains, pipes, wires, tubes and other apparatus, to attach brackets, wires and apparatus to any buildings, and to prescribe the terms and conditions on which the same may be attached, to appropriate and use the subsoil and under-surface of streets and public places, and to make provision for the maintenance and repair of the street or road or parts of the street or road in which the said tramways or any of them will be situate.

To enable the Council in connection with or for the purposes of the intended works to construct subways and to make junctions with streets, and diversions and alterations of streets, and of any tramway therein, both as regards line and level, and to apply to any such subways both during and after construction provisions of the London County Council (Subways) Act, 1893, and bye-laws made or to be made by the Council thereunder.

To make provision for the underpinning, supporting or otherwise strengthening of walls and buildings near to or which may be affected by any of the intended works without being under obligation to purchase the same.

To provide for the maintenance, repair and lighting of the streets to be widened oraltered under the intended Act, and to charge the cost thereof upon any funds, revenues, or rates, of or leviable by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commons of the City of London (in this notice called "the Corporation"), or leviable within the city of London or upon the rates of the metropolitan borough within which such streets are respectively situate.

To enable the Council to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels shown upon the plans and sections to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned.

MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

To empower the Council to provide, equip, maintain and run motor omnibuses within and beyond the administrative county of London, and in particular to provide and maintain motor-omnibus services for the purpose of linking up the tramways of the Council and affording traffic facilities in extension of or in connection with or supplementary to such tramways, and to, from and through localities in which housing or town planning schemes of the Council or other authorities have been or may be carried out, or districts which are in course of development.

To empower the Council to exercise, in relation to motor omnibuses, any powers which they possess or may obtain under the intended Act in relation to their tramway undertaking, including among other matters the taking of tolls, rates and charges and making bye-laws and regulations, acquisition of lands and provision and indication of stopping places, waiting rooms, shelters, buildings and conveniences, the enforcement of the queue system, through omnibuses, reserved omnibuses, special letting of omnibuses and special charges, and, if thought fit, to provide that the motor omnibus undertaking shall, for such purposes as may be specified in the intended Act, form part of the tramway undertaking of the Council.

To empower the Council and any county or local or road authority of any county, borough or district traversed by the said omnibuses, or any company, body or person owning railways, tramways or omnibuses, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with reference to the working and user of the omnibuses of the Council, and to the interchange and delivery of traffic with any such authority, company, body or person.

LANDS.

To enable the Council to purchase by compulsion or agreement and to hold and use lands, houses and other property in the before-mentioned and other parishes and places for the purposes of the intended Act, or for the erection of houses or buildings, or for purposes of recoupment or exchange, and for the purposes aforesaid to enter upon and use any such lands, houses and property

temporarily.

To incorporate with and apply to the purposes of the intended Act with or without modifications and variations the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or some or one of those Acts, and to enable the Council to purchase so much only of, or such easement or right in, under, over or affecting any property as may be required for the purposes of the intended Act without being compellable to take any greater part or the whole of such property, and to exempt the Council from the operation of sections 92, 127 and 133 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To provide that, notwithstanding anything contained in the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, any claim for compensation made under the intended Act or any Act incorporated therewith in respect of any interest in lands not greater than that of a lessee or tenant for any term of which not more than eighteen months remain unexpired at the time when the claim is made, shall be determined by justices in the manner provided by section 121 of the said Act of 1845, and that any disputed claim for compensation or purchase-money arising under the intended Act, or any Act incorporated therewith, shall be referred to and determined by a single arbitrator, and also to provide for the appointment of such arbitrator, and as to the conduct of proceedings before him

To make provision as to the payment of costs in certain cases of disputed compensation by persons claiming compensation from the Council, and as to determining the purchase-money and compensation payable in respect of lands and property required for the purposes of the intended Act, and for limiting the amount thereof in cases of recent improvements, alterations and buildings and recently created

interests in such lands or property.

To enable the Council to enter into and carry into effect agreements to sell lands and property not required for the purposes of the intended Act, and to take in consideration or part consideration for any such sale any other lands or property required for such purposes.

To enable the Council and their officers to enter upon, survey and value at any time lands and buildings shown on the plans to be

deposited as hereinafter mentioned

To enable the Council to sell, convey, lease, exchange and otherwise dispose of lands and property, or any easement, right or privilege in, under, through or over the same acquired by or vested in them under the powers and not required for the purposes of the intended Act, and to sell and dispose of any building, paving or other materials.

To enable the Council, in selling or disposing of lands and property to attach and enforce by re-entry penalties or otherwise conditions as to

the use thereof.

MISCELLANEOUS AND FINANCIAL.

To repeal section 14 of the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1912, which limits the hours during which the tramway in Tooley-street authorized by that Act may be used.

To constitute the tramways and reconstructed tramways part of the tramway undertaking of the Council, to authorize the Council to provide, maintain, and work carriages on the said tramways; to make provision for the working of the said tramways by electrical power, to incorporate in the intended Act and to extend and apply to the said tramways and the construction, reconstruction and working thereof all or some of the provisions of the London County Tramways Act, 1896, the London County Tramways (Electrical Power) Act, 1900, and the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Acts, 1901, 1907 and 1911, or any of those Acts, with or without modification or exception.

To incorporate in the intended Act and to apply to the Council, with or without alteration, all or some of the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, and especially so far as may be thought necessary the provisions of that Act with respect to the breaking up, reinstatement and repair of streets and roads, to gas and water companies, to sewers, to the use of flanged-wheeled carriages, &c., to bye-laws and to offences; and to confer upon the Council with respect to the tramways and the reconstructed tramways such powers, rights and privileges as may be defined in the intended Act, including the exemption of the Council from the provisions of section 43 of the said Act of 1870 with respect to certain of the tram. ways.

To authorize the Council and the Corporation to enter into and carry into effect agreements and arrangements as to the construction, maintenance, ownership and working of Tramways Nos. 1, 1A, 2, 2A or 3, or any of them, or any parts thereof, and all works connected with or incidental to such tramways, or any of them, and the formation and use of junctions between the said tramways and any other tramways, and as to paying the whole or any part of the cost of executing or maintaining such tramway or works, or any of them, and generally as to all such matters and things incidental to or in connection with or consequent on all or any of the matters aforesaid, as may be deemed necessary or expedient.

To confirm and give effect to any such agreement as aforesaid which may have been or may be entered into, and to authorize and empower the parties to any such agreement to do all such acts and things as may be necessary or expedient for giving full effect to the provisions of such agreement.

To authorize and if thought fit to require contributions towards the cost of the street works and widenings to be executed by the Council under the powers of the intended Act by the Council of the metropolitan borough in which the same are situate.

To make provision for raising any moneys required for any contributions to be made to the Council or expenses to be incurred by the council of any such metropolitan borough for any of the purposes of the intended Act, to confer powers for collecting and recovering or for borrowing any such moneys, and for charging the amount thereof by such council upon the rates leviable within the metropolitan borough, or in such portions thereof as may be defined in the intended Act, or as may be determined thereunder, and for such purposes to

vary or amend any Acts relating to the raising

of moneys by any such council.

To enable the Council to raise money by the creation and issue of consolidated stock to such amount as may be necessary for the pulposes of the intended Act, or of any agreement made thereunder, or to resort to the Consolidated Loans Fund, or otherwise to raise such money, in each case in accordance with the provisions of the Acts regulating the raising of money for capital purposes by the Council, and to make provisions as to the redemption of such stock and repayment of loans and the payment of interest or dividend thereon out of the Consolidated Loans Fund and County Rate.

To provide for constituting the motor omnibus service part of the tramway undertaking of the Council, or a separate undertaking as the Council may determine, or the

intended Act prescribe.

To provide for carrying any surplus of revenue! derived from the tramways or any motor omnibus service of the Council to a reserve fund or to the Special County Account of the County Fund, as the Council may determine, and for making good the deficiency of revenue (if any) on such tramways or omnibus services, or either of them, out of such reserve fund, or out of the County Rate as payments for special county purposes as the Council may determine.

To provide that all costs and expenses of the Council in the execution of the powers of the intended Act (except so far as they may be otherwise provided for) shall be defrayed as payments for general or special county purposes within the meaning of the Local Government Act, 1888, as the Council may decide, or as may be defined in the intended Act, and to make provisions as to the application of any moneys arising from or received in respect of the intended works, as to the method of keeping accounts with reference to the tramways and works, and the motor omnibus service, and as to allocation of capital expenditure between different accounts.

To repeal, after and amend, so far as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid, the several Acts hereinbefore referred to, the Metropolis Management Acts, 1855 to 1893, the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, Acts relating to metropolitan stage carriages, and any other Acts relating to the Council and the local management of the county.

To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Act and to confer other rights and privileges.

Duplicate plans and sections describing the line, situations and levels of the tramways and reconstructed tramways and street works and plans showing the lands, houses and other property in or through which the works will be made, or which may be taken under the powers of the intended Act, together with a book of reference to such plans and a copy of this Notice, will, on or before the 31st day of March instant, be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of London at the Sessions House, Clerkenwell Green, E.C., and with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of the City of London at the Sessions House, Old Bailey, E.C., and on or before the same day a copy of so much of the said plans, sections and book of reference as relates to the City of London, and to each of the metropolitan boroughs hereinafter mentioned, together with a copy of this Notice, will be deposited as follows, viz.:-

The city of London, with the Town Clerk at the Guildhall, E.C.; the metropolitan borough of Finsbury, with the Town Clerk at the Town Hall, Rosebery-avenue, E.C.; the metropolitan borough of Hackney, with the Town Clerk at the Town Hall, Marestreet, E.; the metropolitan borough of Holborn, with the Town Clerk at the Municipal Offices, 197, High Holborn, W.C.; the metropolitan borough of St. Marylebone, with the Town Clerk at the Town Hall. Marylebone-lane, W.; the metropolitan borough of St. Pancras, with the Town Clerk at the Town Hall. Pancras-road, N.W.; the metropolitan borough of Stepney, with the Town Clork at the Municipal Offices, 15, Great Alie-street, Whitechapel, E.; the metropolitan borough of Stoke Newington, with the Town Clerk at the Town Hall, Milton-road, N.
