A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN
ROUBLE NOTES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS it is desirable to prohibit the
importation of certain Rouble Notes
into the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by
and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to
issue this Our Royal Proclamation in pur-
suance of Section 43 of the Customs Consolida-
tion Act, 1876, and of all other powers enabling
Us in that behalf, and We do hereby proclaim,
direct and ordain as follows:—

The importation into the United Kingdom
of all Rouble Notes (other than Rouble Notes
issued by the Caisse d'Emission of the Provi-
sional Government of Archangel) is hereby
prohibited:

Provided always, and it is hereby declared,
that this prohibition shall not apply to any
such Notes which are imported under licence
given by or on behalf of Our Treasury and
subject to the provisions and conditions of such
licence.
