DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) REGULATING THE SALE AND SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR ON GOOD FRIDAY IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating

to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following General Order:—

Areas to which the Order applies.

1. This Order applies to all areas or parts of areas situate in England or Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

Hours during which intoxicating Liquor may be Sold on Good Friday.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may (subject to the provisions of Article 3 hereof) be sold and supplied on Good Friday in licensed premises and clubs whether for consumption on or off the premises shall be as follows:—

(a) In the Welsh Area and the West Gloucestershire Area, the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. for consumption on the premises, and the hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. for consumption off the premises.

(b) In each of the other areas the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the Orders of the Board for the said areas such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is permitted on Sundays.

And Article 2 of each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

Sale of Spirits for Consumption off the Premises Prohibited.

3. No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club or be dispatched or taken therefrom on Good Friday, and Article 3 of each of the said Orders shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

The provisions of the Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Orders shall not apply to any movement in connection with hunting of the Staghounds kept at the Kennels, Exbridge, in the county of Somerset, or to the Hounds while being so moved.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 7TH APRIL 1919.)

CORNWALL AND DEVON (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order; and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.

Restriction of Movement of Dogs out of Cornwall and Devon.

1.—(1) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement signed by an officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the Scheduled District to another place outside the Scheduled District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the Scheduled District.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or any Order hereby revoked or having been moved with a licence under any such Order is not detained and isolated as required by the conditions of the licence (if any), an Inspector of the Board may seize the dog, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Board think necessary or expedient.

(2) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Board may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the said dog from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or of any Order hereby revoked, he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i.) for prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog;

(ii.) for prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated;

(iii.) for regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention;

(iv.) for prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare;

(v.) for prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog;

(vi.) for prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii.) for prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

4.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6. No exhibition or show of dogs, whether for sale or otherwise, shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Board, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article (1) of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the

consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds or causes or permits to be held any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8. In this Order—

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

"Disease" means rabies, "diseased" means affected with rabies, and "suspected" means suspected of rabies.

"Public place" includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

Revocation of existing Orders.

9. The restrictions imposed by this Order are substituted for those imposed by the Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Orders of 1918 (Nos. 6 to 11), and the Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919, and those Orders are accordingly hereby revoked.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of April, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2).

MONMOUTHSHIRE AND DISTRICT (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 5.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain Areas.

1.—(1) No dog shall be moved:—

(i) out of a district described in the First Schedule hereto; hereinafter referred to as a "Scheduled District"; or

(ii) out of the area described in the Second Schedule hereto;

unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through a Scheduled District or through the said area by railway from a place outside the District or area to another place outside the District or area without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District or area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within a Scheduled District or the said area, and partly outside the District or area, as the case may be, the whole shall be deemed to be within the District or area, except that where any farm (excluding any detached part) extends to two Scheduled Districts the whole shall be deemed to be within that Scheduled District in which are situate the farm buildings.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or any Order hereby revoked or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Board may seize the dog, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Board think necessary or expedient.

(2) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Board may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the dog from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or of any Order hereby revoked, he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled Districts.

4.—(1.) A dog in a Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) Whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; and shall also, whilst in or on any such place in the Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog in a Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained,

slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in a Scheduled District.

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in a Scheduled District except with a licence of the Board, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in a Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated, or otherwise dealt with, as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Revocation of existing Orders.

10.—The restrictions imposed by this Order are substituted for those imposed by the Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 2 to 4), and those Orders are accordingly hereby revoked.

Commencement.

11.—This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of April, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title.

12.—This Order may be cited as the Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 5).

(Construction of Tramways; Acquisition of Lands for Tramway Purposes; Further Tramway Powers; Application of Birmingham Corporation Acts, 1903, 1912 and 1914; Street Improvements and New Streets; Extension of Time for Construction of Tramways and Purchase of Lands Authorized by Birmingham Corporation Act, 1914; Acquisition of Lands for Construction of Tramways and Street Works; Power to take parts of Premises; Modification of Lands Clauses Acts; Borrowing of Money; Incorporation, Repeal and Amendment of Acts; and other matters.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Birmingham (hereinafter called "the Corporation") for an Act for all or some of the purposes hereinafter mentioned:—

1. In the descriptions contained in this notice where any distance is given with reference to any street which intersects or joins another street the distance (unless otherwise stated) is to be taken as measured along the centre of the street from the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets and (if necessary) continued would intersect each other. In Gravelly-hill and Salford Bridge-road on the south side between points respectively 0.88 chain and 1.47 chains north-east of Leamington-road.

4. To empower the Corporation to acquire the following lands and to use and appropriate the same for the purposes of tramway depôts and other purposes of the Corporation's tramway undertaking:—

(a) A piece of land situate in the parish of Birmingham, in the city bounded on the east by Oak Tree-lane, on the north-west by Bristol-road and on the south-west by lands belonging or reputed to belong to John Throgmorton Middlesmore, M.P., and on the south-east by lands belonging to or reputed to belong to the Birmingham Diocese and Trustees Registered.

(b) A piece of land situate in the parish of Birmingham, in the city bounded on the north and east by Cock Hill-lane and on the south by Bristol-road and on the west by Cock Hill Side-lane.

(c) A piece of land situate partly in the parish and city of Birmingham and partly in the parish of Cofton Hackett, in the rural district of Bromsgrove, in Worcestershire, bounded on the north, east and south by lands belonging or reputed to belong to Charles Conrad Shaw, and on the west by Lickey-road, and containing the following parcels of land numbered 108, 109, 7249 and 7250 on the 1st Edition Ordnance Sheet (1916 edition), XIXa, 14, Warwickshire, and (1904 edition), XVI-2, Worcestershire.

(d) A piece of land situate in the parish of Birmingham, in the city bounded on the north-east by Steel-road, on the south-east

by land belonging or reputed to belong to F. Nevett, on the south-west side by gardens of certain dwelling-houses and Hawkesley Mill-lane, and on the north-west by Bristol-road, and containing the parcels of land numbered 6679, 6680 and part of 6683 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Sheet (1917 edition), Warwickshire XIXa, 11.

5. The tramways are intended to be constructed on a gauge of 3 feet 6 inches, and the motive power proposed to be employed will be mechanical power (including electric, steam, and every other power not being animal power), or animal power or partly one such power and partly another.

6. To provide that the proposed tramways and works shall form part of the tramway undertaking of the Corporation, and to extend and apply the provisions of Part III. (Tramways) of the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1903, and the enactments incorporated with that Act (with such exceptions and modifications as may be indicated in the intended Act) to the proposed tramways as if they had been authorized by that Act or were Corporation tramways within the meaning of that Act, and to apply thereto some of the provisions of the Birmingham Corporation Act, 1912, and of the Act of 1914.

7. To provide that where tramways authorized by the Act of 1914 or the intended Act are on separate tramway tracks, such tracks shall not be highways, and to exclude therefrom the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870 and of the enactments incorporated with or applied by the intended Act relative to roads and to prohibit persons trespassing on such tracks, and to impose penalties in respect thereof.

8. To empower the Corporation to make and maintain the new street, street widenings, improvements and other street works herein-after described, with all proper approaches, embankments, bridges, arches, girders, retaining walls, works or conveniences connected therewith or incidental thereto. The said works (except Work No. 7) will be wholly situate in the city in the parish of Birmingham and in the county of Warwick, and are:—

Work No. 1.—A widening of Bristol-road on the north-western side, commencing at Lodge Hill-road and terminating at a point 1.75 chains north-east of the private road leading to St. Mary's Church.

Work No. 2.—A widening of Bristol-road on the western side, commencing at the extreme southern end of the south-eastern boundary of the dwelling-house known as "Gwynfa," and terminating at Weoley Park-road.

boundary of the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel adjoining Chatham-road, and terminating at Longbridge-lane.

Work No. 6.—A widening of Bristol-road on the north-west side commencing at a point 1 furlong 4.14 chains from the intersection of the centre lines of the last mentioned road and Chatham-road and terminating at a point 1.89 chains north-east of the intersection of the centre lines of Bristol-road and Steel-road.

the provisions relating to the modification of the Lands Clauses Acts.

10. To empower the Corporation to deviate laterally and vertically from the lines and levels of the intended works shown on the deposited plans and sections.

11. To authorize the Corporation to break up, alter, widen, divert, stop up (either temporarily or permanently) and interfere with streets, roads, highways, footpaths, water-courses, sewers, drains, pavements, mains, pipes, wires, telegraphs, telephones and apparatus, and to raise, sink and alter the position of steps, areas, cellars, windows, pipes, spouts and drains, and to remove any obstructions within the city, parishes and counties aforesaid.

12.
