COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

In pursuance of Section 33 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, I hereby make the following Order:—

As from 1st April, 1919, Clause 2 of the Safety Lamps Glasses Order of the 25th October, 1918, shall take effect as if the following proviso were added at the end of the clause.

“ Provided further that glasses manufactured in the United Kingdom prior to 25th October, 1918, and complying with the requirements of this Order in all respects except that they bear a trade mark approved under previous Orders made under Section 33

of the Act but not under this Order, may be used until further order.”

This Order may be cited as “ The Safety Lamps Glasses Order of the 29th March, 1919.”
