Falmouth, November 9.

He 5th instant arrived here the Good Hope of this place from Wales, from whence the came out in company of about 50 fail, bound for feveral parts to the Eastward 5 the same day came in here near 30 fail of Merchant Ships from Tarmouth, Wejmeuth, and other Ports; bound for the French Coasts, and the next day put to lea again with a fair wind in purfuance of their Voyage. The 8th instant arrived the 2 Maries from London, to lade Pilchards for the Streights.

Plymouth, Novemb. 10. The Fleet of thips which were lately put in here outwards bound, are gone out again to fea with a fair wind; one ship onely bound for the Canaries

having sprung a leak, continues yet here to testi.

Lisbonne, Offob. 11. On Sunday last a rived here 9 of our expected Brazille Fleet, bringing in with them about 5000 Chefts of Sugar and large quantities of Tobacco, and with them two ships from the East-Indies richly laden, to the value of about 2 Millions of Crufado's; with whom is arrived Don Autonio de Meio de Castro the Viceroy of

Venice, Nov. 4. By a vessel lately arrived at Otranto from the Levant, we have a confirmation of the late success of the Garison in Gandra against the Turks, with these particulars; That the Marquis de St. Andre Montbrus, having advice brought to him of the arrival of the French fuccors at Zante about the end of September last r and that they might in few days be expected at Candia; he im mediately communicated the good news to the Gurilon. to rai'e their spirits, which had a little before been much dejected by the sudden departure of the Popes and Maltha squadron, by which means the Turks had taken an advantage to reinforce their Army with several thousand men, with which addition they promifed themselves in little time to make themselves mast-rs of the City, and consequently the whole Kingdom of Candia: at the appearance of the French succors before the Town, the Marquis de \$1, Andre, to give a diversion to the Turks, the better to fayour the landing of those welcome succors, with a strong party of German soldiers (which a little before were there arrived) ordered a flout fally to be made upon the Enemy ornicoreal quarters of the Town; in every one of which, they had so good success, that they best the Enemy from their Posts, and did considerable execution upon them, especially on the sides of the Sabienera. and St. Andre. The next day, the Furks in revenge of the affront they had received, prepared themselves for a general Assault, in which they employ d about 30 thouland men, pressing on in all places with great obstinacy, under the desence of Woolfacks which they carried before them to defend them from the small shot which was plentisully poured on them from the several Fores; which the Defendants perceiving, Order was immediately given for drawing she Great Guns to the breaches, which being pointed upon them, Isden with Cale-shot, did such extraordinary execution, that the Turks unable to endure it, were forces to retire, leaving about 30.0 of their men dead upon the place. Upon this fuccels, and the fresh courage received by the happy, arrival of the French adistance; the Desendants made another lafty fally upon the Enemy, purfuing their difordered com-panies with incredible Aughter; infomuch, that in these shree days action, the Emphy was supposed to have lost . neer to thouland men.

Since this, they affure us, the Rains have fallen in great abundance for leveral days together; so that the Tucks finding their Mines drowned, their Works moultring, and the Sol-diers unable to shelter themselves in their Trenches, have been forced to quit their Posts, and to withdraw themselves to a greater distance from the Town, so that 'tis believed they will have little encouragement to make any farther attempts upon it this year.

The same vessel informs us, that most of the Provinces under the jurisdiction of the Ottoman Empire, have declared their diffacisfactions with this War, which they find after to vast an expence of Blood and Treasure, to have been carried on with so little succe's; and that they are not

able to contribute any longer to it.

Genoua, Novemb. 7. The third instant arrived here the Little Edward an English ship from New-found-land. and the Princess and Old Expedition from Spain and Majorca; and even now is entring the Pearl of Briftel from

New-found-land.

The Pope has lately follicited this Republick to employ feveral foldiers (which are to be diffuffed from their fervice) into the Levant, for the affiliance of the Venetians, but the extraordinary Caution here used for the maintenance and encouragement of our frade within the Turkish Domin ons has at present prevailed with the Senate not to hearken to any perswasions of this nature; especially since by our late, Letters from those parts, we are confidently told that the Town of Candia is in so good a condition, by reason of t & great fuctors Intely arrived, and the Autumn rains which have fallen there in great abundance; that the Turks must be necessarily obliged to desist from any farther prosecution of the Siege for this year.

Letters from Barbary are full of the great success of Taffaletta in the Southern parts of the Countrey, and that he has wholly subdued to his Obedience of e King somes of Fez, and Morbeco, and that the Spanish Garrison of Ceuta is in forme apprehensions of his power; but for the better fecurity thereof the Queen Regent of Spain hath ordered confiderable supplies of Men. Ammunition, and all other Ne. allaries to be font thicker, and has continued the Count d' Af-

fensar in the Government thereof.

From Milan we are fold that the Marquils de Mortara being returned thither from his journey which he made to take a View of several Forts within his Government, is fallen ill of the Gout; which for the present diverts him from his defign of making a farther Yoyage towards Cremona and the places on that fide; and that he has made a Reformation of the Biron de Schelards Reginient, which arrived there the last year from Vienna, the Baron himself, with laveral disbanded Officers intending in few dayes to re urn again in to Germiny.

According to a late Order from the Pope, Solemn Prayers have been made in all Churches within that Government for the prefervation of Candia from the Cammon Enemy of Christendome, and for the happy Election of a Successor to the Crown of Poland.
