

of Denmark is returned into *Holslein*, where he presided in the Assembly of the Nobility lately held there in the name of the King his Father; and at the Duke *George William*, and the Prince *Ernest Augustus*, Bishop of *Osnabrug*; are in little time expected at *Copenhagen*, where they intend to continue for some time; that the Negotiations with *Holland* are carried on with much diligence, the Heer *le Mayr*, Resident from the States of the *United Provinces*, having had several conferences with the persons appointed by His Majesty as Commissioners to treat with him.

Hague, Novemb. 16. The Baron *d' Eldre* is lately arrived here from *Lige*, under the Character of Envoye Extraordinary from His Electoral Highness of *Cologne*, and has had his Audience from the States; but the subject of his Negotiation is not yet known.

The Sieur *Lofent* is also arrived, being sent from the Count *de Bentheim* to sollicite for the discovery and restitution of his Children, which are yet kept from him concealed.

The 21st Instant the States of *Holland* and *West-Friesland* are to be assembled, Orders having been dispatched to all the Cities concerned; to send thither their Deputies; where are also expected Deputies from the Province of *Zeland*, for the adjusting of some differences in debate between them about the Administration of Justice.

The Heers *Pessers* and *Boxtel* are sent Commissioners to the *Brilla* and *Helvoetsloot*, to take a View of the New Fortifications, and give order for all necessaries, and to be present at the mustering of the several Companies there in Garrison.

The Heer *de Wijkendam*, 'tis believed, is the person designed to be sent Ambassadour to the Court of *France*, in the room of the Heer *Farel*, lately deceased there.

Brussels, Novemb. 17. The Commissioners who were employed into *Flanders*, to take a View of the forces of that Province, at the places appointed for their Rendezvous, are not yet returned; 'tis believed some Reformation will be suddenly made in the Infantry, though not in so great a proportion as has been made amongst the Cavalry, and that the whole force of these Provinces will be put into such a posture, that we may not for the future stand in fear of any sudden attempts.

The Commissioners nominated to be present at *Lille* for the management of the Conference with those of *France* about the regulation of the bounds, and the stating of the Dependencies on the late Conquests made by the French, returned thither on Saturday in the Evening from *Malines*; where they had been to attend the Constable of *Castille*, and receive their full instructions; and on Monday last set forwards on their way to *Lille*.

Some few days since arrived here the Sieu. *Haagdorn* from *Denmark*, and 'tis said is suddenly to depart on his way for *Spain*; whether he is sent by His Majesty of *Denmark* under the Character of Envoye Extraordinary, the present Envoye in the Spanish Court being remanded to give an account of his Negotiation in that Court.

The Commons of this City have had several Assemblies in the Town-House, to confer together upon the Proposals made to them by Don *Estevan de Gamarras*, in the Name of the Constable of *Castille*, but are not yet come to any certain Resolutions upon them; yet 'tis believed they will be content to give 4500 Florins per Annum for the quartering of the two Spanish Regiments, and three Companies of the Guards which are to be kept in the Town; and that they will also consent to the raising of 2000 thousand Florins upon the Province of *Brabant*, according to the Demand made by the States of this Province.

The Plague is much decreased in this Town, above 100 houses being lately cleared of it, and the heart of the City already freed from all Infection. 'Tis said, the Infection is lately broken out in 7 or 6 houses in *Malines*, inasmuch as the Constable is taking the resolution of passing some time at *Antwerp*, if this place can be made fit for his reception,

Count *Marsin* continues still at *Antwerp*, and has dispatched one of his Captains into *Spain*, to found the Queen Regents intentions, as to his re-establishment in his ancient charge.

On Tuesday last in the Evening, arrived here *D. Antonio Pimenich* in twelve days from *Paris*, and the 13th Instant went hence for *Malines*.

The Count *d' Egmont* lately reformed, is again restored to his Command, as are also several other Officers. The Viscount *de Hornes* is daily expected from *Spain* with 12 dismounted Troops of Walloon Cavalry, for whom Quarters are already designed about *Diest* in *Brabant*. Yesterday were mustered near this City, three Troops of the Horse-guards which are to be quartered here.

Don *Estevan de Gamarras* intends towards the end of this Month to return again to his employment of Ambassadour in *Holland*. The Abbot *Airoldi*, the new Internuncio from the Pope, having finished his negotiation with the German Princes, is lately arrived at *Antwerp*, where he is making up his Train, intending to make this City his place of Residence.

Tarmouth, Novemb. 11. Yesterday past thorew this Road several laden Colliers to the Southwards, and many light ships to the Northwards. Two ships of this Town are put to sea, intending for *Rotterdam*, from whence two others are this day returned. Here are now riding at Anchor in this Road three ships bound for the *Streights* laden with Herring, and one for *Barbados*. Two others are here arrived from *Burdeaux* bound for *Lynne* and *Boston*, with 10 sail of light ships bound for the Northwards.

Deal, Novemb. 13. There are now riding in the Downs the *Succes* and *Drake* Frigates, and about 10 sail of Merchant ships outwards bound for several parts; the weather having continued of late very stormy, has forced several of them from their Anchors, but has done them no farther prejudice. This Afternoon were driven into the Downs about 60 sail of Dutch Merchant Ships, with some Men of War; one of the number diving with the wind, has fallen foul upon some of the company to their damage; and another of them hath been forced out to sea.

Whitehall, Nov. 15. This day was solemnly consecrated in the Chappel at *Ely-house*, the Right Reverend *Dr. John Wilkins*, Bishop of *Chester*, the Ceremony being performed with the usual solemnity by the Bishop of *Durresme*, assisted by the Bishops of *Ely* and *Salisbury*, in presence of many other Bishops and several of the Nobility and persons of Honour; before whom was preached an excellent Sermon upon the occasion, by the Learned and Reverend *Dr. Tillson* Preacher of *Lincolns-Inn*.
