SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade:

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the aforesaid opinion:

Now, therefore, I, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to me by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf do hereby make a Special Order that from and after the date hereof the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH APRIL 1919.)

RABIES ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Notice of Disease.

1.—(1) Every person having or having had in his possession or under his charge an animal affected with or suspected of rabies shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the animal being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area wherein the animal so affected or suspected is, or was at the time of its death.

(2) The constable receiving such notice shall immediately transmit the information by telegraph to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

(3) The constable shall also forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority and to the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary District in which the animal is, or was at the time of its death.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

2.—(1) An Inspector of a Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of rabies, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of rabies, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such disease according to the information received by him exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall there and elsewhere put in force and discharge the powers and duties conferred and imposed on

him as Inspector by or under the Act of 1894 and this Order.

(2) The Inspector shall forthwith report to the Board, in such form as the Board may require, the information received by him and the action taken by him under this Order.

Compulsory Slaughter of Dogs and Cats.

3.—A Local Authority shall cause to be slaughtered every dog and cat within their District which is diseased or suspected or which is shown to the satisfaction of the Local Authority to have been bitten by a diseased dog or cat.

Owners to give Facilities for Slaughter.

4.—(1) Where the power of causing any dog or cat to be slaughtered under this Order is exercised by a Local Authority, the owner and person in charge of such dog or cat shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

(2) Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Article shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Veterinary Inquiry.

5.—(1) A Local Authority on receiving information of the existence or suspected existence of rabies in any animal or carcase shall forthwith cause inquiry as to the correctness of such information to be made by a Veterinary Inspector, or by a Veterinary Surgeon specially appointed in that behalf, who shall forthwith report to the Board in such form as the Board may require, but this provision shall not affect the provisions of this Order relating to compulsory slaughter under Article 3.

(2) Where an animal at the time of its death is affected with or suspected of rabies, the Local Authority shall, previous to the disposal of the carcase, cause a post-mortem examination to be made thereof by a Veterinary Inspector, or by a Veterinary Surgeon specially appointed in that behalf, who shall forthwith forward to the Board such material and in such manner as may be required by the Board, unless he is satisfied as a result of his examination that rabies did not exist.

(3) The owner and the person in charge of any such carcase shall give all reasonable facilities for the purpose of such examination, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) A certificate of a Veterinary Inspector to the effect that an animal is or was affected with rabies shall for the purposes of the Act of 1894 and this Order be conclusive evidence in all courts of justice of the matter certified.

Local Authority to Secure Isolation of Dogs or Cats Exposed to Infection.

6.—(1) The Local Authority shall so far as practicable secure the isolation of any dog or cat which has been exposed to the infection of rabies, or of any other animal which is diseased or suspected or has been exposed to the infection of rabies, by causing Notices under the next following Article to be served with all practicable speed on the owner or person in charge of such dog, cat, or other animal within their District and by taking all necessary steps to enforce compliance with every Notice served under such Article.

(2) Every dog, cat, or other animal shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed to have

been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog or cat, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Isolation of Animals.

7.—(1) An Inspector of a Local Authority shall serve a Notice in writing (in the Form A1, A2 or A3, as the case may be, set forth in the First Schedule to this Order or to the like effect, with such modifications as the circumstances may require) on the owner or person in charge of any dog or cat which has been exposed to the infection of rabies, or of any other animal which is diseased or suspected or has been exposed to the infection of rabies, requiring the same to be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of the Notice, and the Notice shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice in writing (in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to this Order or to the like effect) signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(2) An Inspector of the Local Authority shall with all practicable speed send copies of any Notice served by him under this Article to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1, and to the Local Authority and the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District.

(3) If the requirements of any Notice served under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person in charge thereof and any person who fails to comply with any such requirement or does any act in contravention of any such requirement, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Seizure of Animals in case of Default.

8.—(1) If an animal is not detained and isolated, or is not moved as required by the requirements of a Notice served under this Order, an Inspector of the Board may seize the animal, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the Notice, or at any other place of detention selected by them, in accordance with the requirements of the Notice, at the expense of the owner of the animal.

(2) If the owner of the animal does not, on the expiration of the period of detention, claim the animal from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the animal, or if for seven days after demand in writing by the Board at any time he fails to pay to them such expenses or such deposit as may be required by the Board to cover such expenses, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the animal as they think expedient, without prejudice to their claim for any expenses payable to them.

Disposal of Carcases.

9.—(1) The carcase of an animal which at the time of its death was affected with or suspected of rabies shall be disposed of as soon as possible by the Local Authority as follows:

(i.) Either the Local Authority shall cause the carcase to be buried in its skin in some proper place at a depth of not less than six feet below the surface of the earth, and to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quicklime or other disinfectant;

(ii.) Or the Local Authority shall cause the carcase to be destroyed by exposure to a high temperature upon the premises where it is or upon the nearest available premises suitable for the purpose;

(iii.) Or the Local Authority may cause the carcase to be destroyed, under the inspection of the Local Authority, in the mode following: The carcase shall be disinfected, and shall then be taken, in charge of an officer of the Local Authority, to a horse-slaughterer's or knacker's-yard or other suitable place, and shall be there destroyed by exposure to a high temperature, or by chemical agents.

(2) Where under this Article a Local Authority cause a carcase to be buried they shall first cause the skin to be so slashed as to be useless.

(3) A Local Authority may cause or allow a carcase to be taken into the district of another Local Authority to be buried or destroyed, with the previous consent of that Local Authority, but not otherwise.

Disinfection.

10.—(1) Any kennel, pen, sty or other enclosure used by a diseased or suspected animal, and any thing so used, such as litter or bedding, or feeding or drinking utensil, hurdle, or sleeping basket, and any thing whatsoever contaminated by the saliva of a diseased or suspected animal before or after its death, shall be disinfected by the owner or occupier or person in charge thereof in the manner following:—

The enclosure or thing shall, if not forthwith destroyed by burning, be immersed in boiling water for not less than ten minutes; or be immersed or soaked or drenched in or with a suitable disinfectant.

(2) Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Article shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Digging up.

11. It shall not be lawful for any person, except with the Licence of the Board or permission in writing of an Inspector of the Board, to dig up, or cause to be dug up, the carcase of any animal that has been buried, whether under this Order or otherwise.

Record of Slaughter.

12. A Local Authority shall keep, in the form provided by the Board, a record relative to diseased or suspected animals slaughtered by their order under this Order, stating the particulars indicated in such form, with such variations as circumstances require.

Powers of the Board.

13. Any power by this Order conferred upon a Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority may at any time be exercised by the Board or an Inspector of the Board respectively, and in any such case the provisions of this Order shall apply as if the power were being exercised by the Local Authority or an Inspector of a Local Authority.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

14. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Weekly Returns of Rabies.

15. When an Inspector of a Local Authority finds that rabies exists or has existed in his district, he shall forthwith make a return thereof to the Local Authority and to the Board, on a form provided by the Board, with all particulars therein required, and shall continue so to make a return thereof on the Saturday of every week until the disease has ceased.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

16. Horses, asses, mules, dogs and cats (as well as the animals specified in the Act of 1894) shall be animals, and rabies shall be a disease, for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Sections nineteen and twenty (*Slaughter*);
Section forty-three (*Police*);
Section forty-four (*General Administrative Provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Offences.

17.—(1.) If an animal or any thing is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served under this Order, the owner of the animal or thing, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal or thing, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal or thing is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, or of any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Order, allows an animal to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

18. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894;

“Animal” means the animals specified in the Act of 1894 (that is cattle, sheep, and goats, and all other ruminating animals, and swine), and horses, asses, mules, dogs and cats;

“Dog” means any canine animal;

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies;

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector;

“Carcase” means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, flesh, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal, or other part of an animal, separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof;

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation of Order.

19. The Order described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked, and from and after the commencement of this Order all notices served or instruments issued under the Order hereby revoked shall have effect as if the same were served or issued under this Order.

Extent.

20. This Order extends to Great Britain.

Commencement.

• 21. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title.

22. This Order may be cited as the RABIES ORDER OF 1919.

LONDON, MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING
AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain District.

1.—(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary, or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention

for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

2.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Board may seize the dog, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Board think necessary or expedient.

(2.) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Board may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the dog from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has

reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

4.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

5.—(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs whether for sale or otherwise shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Board, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District

is not muzzled, or kept, under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8.—In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

10.—This Order shall take immediate effect: Provided that until the twenty-third day of April, nineteen hundred and nineteen, a dog in or on any public place in the Scheduled District need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

Short Title.

11.—This Order may be cited as the London, Middlesex and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919.

(Consolidation of Rates; Payment out of or to credit of City Fund and City Rate of Moneys now payable out of or to credit of other Funds and Rates; Substitution in Acts, Orders, Mortgages and Charges of References to City Fund and City Rate for References to other Funds, Accounts or Rates; Closing of Accounts and Funds relating to existing Rates and Transfer of Balances to City Fund; Payment out of Poor Rate of Contributions of Parishes in Newcastle-upon-Tyne to City Rate; Repeal or Amendment of Enactments as to Differential Rating or Payment by Owners of part of existing Rates and Enactment of new Provisions; Variation of Leases and Agreements; Amendment of Errors in and Omissions from Consolidated Rate; Increase of Amount of Library Rate; Repeal and Amendment of Acts; General and Incidental Provisions.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") for leave to introduce a Bill for the following or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

To consolidate into one rate (hereinafter referred to as "the consolidated rate") the City Rate, the General Rate, the Improvement Rate, the Tramway Rate, the General District Rate, and all or any other rates which the Corporation are or may be authorized to make or levy and the Poor Rate of the parishes comprised in the said City and County of Newcastle-upon-Tyne (hereinafter referred to as "the City") and all or any other rates which are or may be otherwise leviable in the City or any part or parts thereof.

To provide for the payment out of or the carrying to the credit of the City Fund and the City Rate of all expenses and moneys which would otherwise be paid out of or carried to the credit of the General Rate or General Rate Account, the Improvement Rate or Improvement Rate Account, the Tramway Rate or the District Fund or General District Rate, or any of those rates, accounts or fund or otherwise.

To provide that references in the Acts and Provisional or other Orders of or relating to

the Corporation or in force within the City or in any mortgage of or charge on any of the rates, accounts or fund lastly hereinbefore referred to shall be construed as references to the City Fund and the City Rate.

To provide for the closing of the said General Rate Account, Improvement Rate Account and District Fund, and for the transfer to the credit or debit of the City Fund of balances standing to the credit or debit of the said accounts and fund or of the rates to which such accounts and fund respectively relate or the said Tramway Rate, and for the payment into the City Fund of moneys received after the commencement of the intended Act in respect of or in connection with the said rates, accounts and fund or any of them.

To repeal, alter or amend all or some of the provisions of the existing Acts and Orders relating to the said General Rate, Improvement Rate and General District Rate.

To require the Overseers of the parishes in the City to pay out of the Poor Rate leviable in those parishes respectively the respective contributions of the said parishes to the City Rate, and to apply to such contributions the provisions of section 145 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882.

In connection with the said intended consolidation of rates the Bill will abolish the existing limitation upon the amount in the pound of the said General Rate and Improvement Rate respectively, and will repeal or amend the enactments imposing such limitations and any subsequent enactments amending those enactments.

To repeal, alter or amend the provisions of all or any of the general and local enactments in force within the City relating to the differential rating of any part or parts of the City or of particular classes of property or to the payment by the owner instead of the occupier of any premises of the whole or any part of any of the said rates or to any exemption (whether total or partial) from the said rates or any of them, and to make new provisions with respect to such differential rating payment by owners and exemptions in relation to the consolidated rate.

The Bill will or may for the purposes afore-

said repeal, alter or amend (inter alia) Article 36 of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne (Extension) Order, 1904, and will provide that provisions in existing leases and agreements referring to the proportion payable by the owner of any premises of the General Rate or of the Improvement Rate or of any other rate pursuant to section 136 of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1865, shall have effect as if such reference had been to such proportion as may be specified in the Bill of the consolidated rate.

To make provision for and with respect to the amendment of errors in any consolidated rate and of omissions from or erroneous descriptions of persons in the said rate, and to prescribe the procedure to be followed in such cases.

To increase the amount in the pound of the rate or addition to a rate which may be levied within the City for the purposes of the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1901, as now limited by section 18 of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Corporation (Tolls) Act, 1905, and to provide if thought fit for the application for the purposes of the Laing Art Gallery of a specified part of the proceeds of any such rate or addition to a rate.

To vary or extinguish for the purposes of the intended Act all or any rights, privileges or exemptions which would be inconsistent with those purposes, and to confer other rights, privileges or exemptions.

The Bill will or may repeal, alter or amend in addition to the enactments hereinbefore specifically referred to, the Newcastle-upon-Tyne Improvement Act, 1837, and all or any other Acts and any Provisional or other Orders of or relating to the Corporation or the City.
