At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of April, 1919.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**W**HEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Cus-

toms (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

- (A) Asphalt;
- (A) Asphalt, coal tar;
- (A) Bitumen;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

- (A) Peas;

Wires and cables, insulated, the following:—

(A) Silk-covered wire.

(2) That the following heading should be added:—

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Peas, other than split peas.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List No. 76A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 21st February, 1919, together with List No. 77 of the 7th March, 1919, List No. 78 of the 21st March, 1919, List No. 79 of the 4th April, 1919, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C. 2.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm is mentioned in the List, every partner in the firm is also included in the List, and all dealings with any partner in the firm, as well as all dealings with the firm, are prohibited; and conversely, all dealings with a firm, any partner in which is mentioned in the List, are also prohibited.

NOTE (3).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (4).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (5).—In order to minimize as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (6).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists

for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (7).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 24th instant, to confer the dignity of a Baron of the said United Kingdom upon the Right Honourable Sir Robert Chalmers, G.C.B., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style, and title of Baron Chalmers, of Northiam, in the county of Sussex.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal in each of the following cases in recognition of gallantry displayed in saving life:—

*Miss Alice Batt*, Voluntary Aid Detachment.

On the 1st October, 1918, a fire broke out at No. 36, Casualty Clearing Station at Rousbrugge, Belgium, and quickly reached the operating theatre, where the surgeon was performing an abdominal operation. The lights went out, and the theatre was quickly filled with smoke and flames, but the operation was continued by the light of an electric torch, Miss Batt continuing her work of handing instruments and threading needles with steadfast calmness, thereby enabling the surgeon to complete the operation. Miss Batt afterwards did splendid work in helping to carry men from the burning wards to places of safety.

*Lieutenant James Edward Maddox, M.M.*,  
24th Battalion, Cheshire Regiment.

On 27th September, 1918, Lieutenant Maddox was instructing a class in throwing live bombs. One of the men, after withdrawing the pin from a Mills No. V Mark 1 Grenade, accidentally dropped the grenade in the trench, and then, apparently through fright, fell on it. Lieutenant Maddox, with great presence of mind, immediately pulled the man off the grenade, seized it, and threw it over the parapet, where it exploded almost immediately.

By his prompt and courageous action Lieutenant Maddox undoubtedly saved the man's life.

*Lance-Corporal William Whitehead*, 9th Battalion, Manchester Regiment.

On the night of the 5th January, 1919, Lance-Corporal Whitehead was in command of a guard on the River Meuse. One of the guard, in crossing a plank gangway from a barge where the guardroom was situated to relieve a sentry on the river bank, missed his footing and fell into the river, which was in flood. Lance-Corporal Whitehead immediately jumped into the river, but in the pitch darkness missed the drowning man. He swam to the shore, climbed out and ran down the bank until he reached the spot where the man had been carried by the swift-running stream, and again jumping in he succeeded in rescuing him.

Both rescuer and rescued were wearing equipment and greatcoats at the time, and Lance-Corporal Whitehead undoubtedly risked his life in saving the life of his comrade who, when brought to bank, was unconscious.

WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES AND WORKSHOPS.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 7 of the Police, Factories, &c. (Miscellaneous Provisions), Act, 1916, of making Orders for securing the welfare of the workers employed

in factories and workshops, he proposes to make an Order to apply to all factories or parts of factories in which the preserving of fruit is carried on.

Copies of the draft Order may be obtained on application to the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Any objection to the proposed Order must be sent to the Secretary of State at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within 21 days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing, and must state:—

- (a) The requirements in the draft Order objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the modifications asked for.

Where an objection is made jointly on behalf of a number of occupiers, the names of the occupiers and their addresses must be stated, or, if the objection is made by an association of occupiers on behalf of its members, the number of the members affected by the Order.

#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER, MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE PAPER BAG TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered, under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid;

Now, therefore, I, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to me by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf, do hereby make a Special Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the Appendix of this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919.

#### APPENDIX.

##### TRADE.

The Paper Bag Trade, that is to say, the manufacture from paper (including gauzelined or clothlined paper) of any bag or container without a gummed flap, *including* the operations of packing, parcelling, warehousing, receiving, store-keeping, despatching, time-keeping, lift-operating, and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper bag manufacture, and *including* the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus; but *excluding* the manufacture of bags or containers with ungummed flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same processes as gummed envelopes, and *excluding* the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD APRIL 1919.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 2) shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908 granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the North Riding of Yorkshire, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.

## ENGLAND AND WALES, SOUTH AND WEST COASTS.

*Portland Bill to Bardsey Island—Traffic Regulations.**Former Notice.—No. 584 of 1919; hereby cancelled.*

Notice is hereby given, that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:—

## I.—REGULATION RESPECTING SMALL CRAFT.

Oil, motor spirit, petrol, or other goods may not be shipped on board craft of any description, whether coasting or foreign, either as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel, or as merchandise, except at places which are under the supervision of a Customs Officer. Such goods must be properly pre-entered before shipment, and a clearance must be obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915. Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or other similar substances, exceeding 4 gallons.

## II.—REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO COMMERCIAL FISHERMEN.

The following Regulations are to be complied with by all fishing vessels and boats on the coast of England and Wales from Portland Bill westwards to Bardsey island (hereinafter referred to as the South-Western Area).

2. (i.) By day and night, the laying of nets, or of crab or any other pots, trawling, longlining, drifting, or anchoring is prohibited within the area bounded:

*On the North:* By a line joining the following places and points, viz.:—The Longships—the Runnelstone—a point 4 miles 164° (*South Mag.*) from St. Michael's Mount tower—a point one mile 164° (*South Mag.*) from Lizard head—a point half a mile 164° (*South Mag.*) from Black head—a point 2 miles 164° (*South Mag.*) from Dodman point—Rame head—Mewstone buoy—a point one mile 164° (*South Mag.*) from Bolt head—a point one mile 164° (*South Mag.*) from Prawle point—a point one mile 119° (*S. 45° E. Mag.*) from Start point—Skerries bell-buoy.

*On the South:* By a line from Wolf rock to a position in lat 49° 46' N., long. 5° 12' W.—thence to a position in lat. 50° 06' N., long. 4° 16' W.—thence to a position in lat. 50° 05' N., long. 3° 33' W.

*On the East:* By the meridian of Skerries buoy (long. 3° 33' W.).

*On the West:* By a line joining the Longships and Wolf rock.

(ii.) The above prohibition does not apply to vessels sailing across the prohibited area, or whiffing with handlines without anchoring.

(iii.) Anchoring for the purpose of handlining, and fishing with longlines, is permitted within 2½ miles of the Eddystone.

(iv.) Drift nets, lobster lines, &c., are liable to be swept up by mine sweepers, and should not be laid in certain areas which are promulgated by Port Fishery Orders.

(v.) Pending the complete withdrawal of the regulations, permission to fish in the areas prohibited as and when they are cleared will be promulgated by Port Fishery Orders.

3. Local regulations are in force as follows:

(i.) Port Fishery Orders are in force at Brixham, Plymouth, Newlyn and Mousehole, St. Ives, Padstow, Swansea, and Milford Haven. Vessels fishing out of those ports, and out of such other ports as may be placed under Port Fishery Orders, are to fish in organised fleets under the orders of the Port Fishery Officer.

(ii.) Fishing in Prohibited Areas:

(a) Special permission has been, and may from time to time be, granted by Port Fishery Orders for vessels fishing out of certain ports to engage in specified forms of fishing within specified portions of the prohibited areas defined in paragraph 2 above. This permission can be obtained only from the Inspector of Fisheries for the S.W. Area, through the Port Fishery Officer of the port concerned, to whom application should be made in the first place.

(b) Orders permitting fishing within the prohibited areas are to be strictly complied with in every respect.

(iii.) Whitsand Bay. Night fishing is permitted in Whitsand Bay inshore of the northern line of the prohibited area, as defined in paragraph 2 (i.) above, provided that:

(a) During the hours of "official night" no vessel, approaching Plymouth, may cross to the eastward of a line drawn 231° (*S. 67° W. Mag.*) from Rame Head; and

(b) Except on Sundays, no boat may approach within three miles of the coast between Tregantle and Portwrinkle up to the hour to 12.0 midnight, or such later hour as may be ordered.

4. The shipment of oil, motor spirit, petrol, and other goods in fishing vessels is subject to the Customs Regulations for the time being.

5. Admiralty Orders for British fishing vessels are in all cases to be obeyed: See the current Notices to Fishermen (the "Green Book") issued free to fishermen at Mercantile Marine and Customs Offices.

*Notes.*

1. Reporting Wrecks. — Fishermen are notified that all wrecks found by them should be buoyed and reported to the local Naval Authorities in order that their positions may be recorded with a view to their being charted, and also that the wreck may, if practicable, be destroyed.

2. Amateur fishermen and pleasure craft and fishing craft may not navigate or fish in areas, or at times, or in any manner forbidden to commercial fishermen.

3. Fishery Officer means an officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, a Port Fishery Officer, or other person duly appointed to issue fishing permits.

4. Charts of prohibited areas and of areas affected by Port Fishery Orders can be seen by fishermen on application to Port Fishery Officers.

5. Complaints on the part of the fishing community, and questions of doubt, should be referred in the first instance to the local Fishery Officer, or direct to the Inspector of Fisheries attached to the area.

## III.—PLYMOUTH.

## PART I.—MOVEMENTS WITHIN THE PORT.

1. The movements of all merchant ships, fishing vessels, or boats of any kind, are subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, for the Sound, and the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, for the Hamoaze, whose orders are to be immediately obeyed.

## Approach to Government Vessels and Establishments.

2. No merchant vessel (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) will be allowed to approach any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government Dockyard or Establishment, without special permission.

## Prohibited Areas.

3. When anchoring, care must be taken to be well clear of the fairway.

*Mount Batten Breakwater.*—All small craft are warned that they should not approach within 200 yards of Mount Batten Breakwater, it being necessary to keep this area clear for seaplanes going out and returning.

Fishing is now permitted by night in Whitsand Bay, subject to the following regulations:—

(a) No fishing at night is to take place east of a line drawn in a  $231^{\circ}$  (*S.  $67^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) direction from Rame head.

(b) Except on Sundays, no night fishing is to take place within three miles of the coast between Tregantle and Portwrinkle up to the hour of 12 midnight, or such later hour as may be ordered.

4. A limited number of moorings for yachts may be laid in the following places and nowhere else:—

On West Hoe—on application to King's Harbour Master, Plymouth; in the Cattewater above Turnchapel—on application to the Harbour Master of Cattewater.

## PART II.—VESSELS LEAVING THE PORT.

## Prohibition.

5. Merchant vessels (including those engaged in the coastal trade) must on no account leave the Dockyard ports of Devonport and Plymouth without permission.

Vessels in the Hamoaze must obtain such permission from the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, at his office in the Dockyard; those at berths in the waters of the Sound, Cawsand bay, Cattewater, Sutton pool, or Milbay docks, must obtain permission from the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, at Longroom, Stonehouse.

It is also necessary for ships to obtain permission from the Collector of Customs, at the Barbican, Plymouth.

## PART III.—BOOM DEFENCE AND NAVIGATION OF NARROW WATERS.

6. The boom defence has now been dismantled, and the two boom defence vessels which were moored between Devil's point and Wilderness point have been removed. These vessels have been moored at swinging moorings laid to the north-westward of the entrance to Millbrook lake. Position of mooring-buoy is

$286^{\circ}$  (*N.  $68^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*), 575 yards from Cremyll obelisk. The vessels being moored out of the fairway, no lights will be displayed on them by night, and all vessels and boats are cautioned to keep well clear of them.

7. Vessels are warned to pay strict attention to Clause 9, Order in Council, 4th September, 1918, Regulations for the Dockyard Ports of Plymouth and Devonport, and no merchant vessel, whether navigating with or against the tide, is to attempt to pass a man-of-war in the "Narrows" when she is flying the "Red Ensign" over "M" Commercial by day, or a red light by night, at the fore truck.

A vessel navigating against the tide should ease her engines and wait until any other vessel going with the tide has passed clear.

The following signals are hoisted at Mount Wise, Longroom, and South dockyard signal Station:—

## Signal and Signification.

Ball over Red Burgee.—Large ships coming from Sound to Hamoaze: all traffic outwards between Rubble bank and Melampus light-buoy is to cease while this signal is flying.

Red Burgee over Ball.—Large ships coming from Hamoaze to Sound; all traffic inwards between Melampus light-buoy and Rubble bank is to cease while this signal is flying.

It must be clearly understood that when either of the above signals is hoisted, no merchant vessel is allowed to be under way within the limits defined hereunder, unless permission has previously been obtained from the Naval authorities.

## Limits.

The Northern limit being a line drawn  $90^{\circ}$  and  $270^{\circ}$  (*S.  $74^{\circ}$  E. Mag. and N.  $74^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) through the north Rubble buoy, and the Southern limit being a line joining Dunstone point and Melampus light-buoy.

## Ordinary Port Regulations.

8. The ordinary Regulations of the Port, except as affected by this Notice, are to be strictly adhered to.

*Variation.*— $16^{\circ}$  W.

*Note.*—This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

## Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

(Continuance of Common Rights; Bye-laws for Protection of Waterworks and Prevention of Pollution; Public Access Commons and Unenclosed Lands; Amendment and Incorporation of Acts.)

To empower the Corporation to make bye-laws for the protection of their waterworks, and for prevention of pollution of the waters intended to be taken, and generally for the prevention of any act or thing tending to the pollution of the water, and for the preservation of order among persons resorting to the lands to which the bye-laws apply, and

to apply Sections 182 to 186 of the Public Health Act, 1875, with or without amendment to such bye-laws, or to make such other provisions as may be deemed expedient in regard to the making, alteration or repeal of bye-laws and the enforcement thereof.

5. To make provision for the payment of compensation to commoners or other persons injuriously affected by the provisions proposed to be inserted in the Bill or bye-laws made thereunder.

6. To define the powers of the Corporation in regard to the execution, maintenance and working of the works authorized by the Bill in the parishes aforesaid, and to make provision for the preservation of the scenery in the district.

7. To extend and apply to the purposes of the additional provision some or all of the provisions of the enactments incorporated with the Bill, including the Lands Clauses Acts and the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863 (as modified by the Bill), and to incorporate all or some of the provisions of the Inclosure Acts, 1845 to 1899.

8. To make such other provision as may be deemed necessary or expedient to give effect to the intended Act in regard to the exercise, restriction or extinction of common rights in or over any lands to be acquired by the Corporation in the parishes and county aforesaid, and to vary or extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent or interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.
