**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such

trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

**W**HEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the articles indicated in the Proclamation of the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, as being prohibited to be exported to all destinations

in European and Asiatic Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Belgium, Portugal, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Iceland and the Faroe Islands, Spain, Morocco, and Palestine and Syria as far north as a line from Alexandretta to Aleppo inclusive, and as far east as the Hejaz railway inclusive, Czechoslovakia, Alsace-Lorraine, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to all ports in any such foreign countries, should be prohibited to be exported to all destinations in European Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Belgium, Portugal, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Iceland and the Faroe Islands, Spain, Morocco, Palestine and Syria as far north as a line from Alexandretta to Aleppo inclusive, and as far east as the Hejaz railway inclusive, Czechoslovakia, Alsace-Lorraine, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to all ports in any such foreign countries.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Henry Goedecker.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Henry Goedecker, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization numbered 1902 was granted on the 9th June, 1876, has shown himself by act to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty,

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

And I further direct that the wife of the said Henry Goedecker shall cease to be a British subject.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

3. From the marks assigned to candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

Moreover, if a candidate's handwriting is not easily legible, a further deduction will, on that account, be made from the total marks otherwise accruing to him.

4. Application for permission to attend one of these Examinations must be made in the writing of the Candidate, at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

5. A fee of £6 will be required from every candidate attending an examination.

6. Out of the list resulting from each examination will be filled (provided there be candidates duly qualified) such of the following vacancies as are not filled by means of a Reconstruction Scheme under the Order in Council of 18th December, 1918:—

No undertaking can be given as to the proportion of vacancies that may be filled under these Regulations and under the Reconstruction Scheme respectively.

7. For any examination that may be held in the year 1921 the following Regulations will take the place of "General Regulations respecting Open Competitive Examinations for situations in the Civil Service included in Schedule A of the Order in Council of 10th January, 1910."

8. These examinations are open to all persons being of the requisite age, health and character, subject to such restrictions as are contained in these Regulations.

9. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of natural-born British subjects, or of natural-born subjects or citizens of an allied or associated country, provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the War. Further, a candidate will not be eligible for appointment to the Admiralty, Colonial Office, or War Office unless his father is also a British subject, except by special permission from the Head of the Department concerned.

10. (i) The following persons are ineligible, viz.:—

Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

(ii) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—

(a) Persons actually serving in the Army.

(b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.

(c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.

(d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of more than five years' service.

(e) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer.

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

(a) (i) In the urban district of Brownhills, the rural district of Lichfield and the Cannock Urban District, from the boundary between the urban district of Brownhills and the Cannock Urban District at Five Ways Corner, Heath Hayes, along the Hednesford-road, Norton Green-road, Watling-street; Chester-road to Brownhills Station, along High-street, Lichfield-road and Ogleystreet or Ogleystreet Hay-lane, thence along the road between Newtown Bridge and The Triangle, Triangle-road or Chasetown-road, High-street, Chasetown, to Sankey's-corner, thence along the Cannock and Lichfield-road through Chase-terrace and Heath Hayes to the boundary between the Cannock Urban District and the urban district of Brownhills at Newlands Brook.

(ii) In the rural district of Lichfield, from Sankey's-corner along the Cannock-road, Cannock-road or Lichfield-road to and through the Green at Burnt Wood.

(b) In the rural district of Lichfield from the boundary between that rural district and the Cannock Urban District at the Bentley Brook near the level crossing on the London and North-Western Railway (Cannock Chase Branch) along Rugeley-road (Hazleslade) and along Cannock Wood-road to the boundary between the last-mentioned rural district and the Cannock Urban District at the Bentley Brook.

(c) In the rural district of Cannock.

(i) From the boundary between that rural district and the Cannock Urban District at Wyrley Brook, along Mill-lane, Coppice-lane and Station-street to the junction of that street with High-street at Cheslyn Hay.

(ii) From the junction of Station-street with Coppice-lane, Cheslyn Hay, along Station-street, Stafford, and Walsall-road to the boundary between the rural district of Cannock and the Cannock Urban District at Church Bridge.

(d) In the rural district of Cannock, from the boundary between that rural district and the Cannock Urban District near Huntington Wharf along the Stafford-road to Huntington, and thence along Lime-pit-lane to the boundary of the Cannock Urban District at Belt-road.

(e) In the said rural district of Lichfield and the urban district of Rugeley.

(i) From the boundary between that rural district and the Cannock Urban District at the Bentley Brook near Hednesford, along the Rugeley-road through Flaxley Green, Sandy-lane, Higher Brook-street, and Lower Brook-street to and along Market-place, Rugeley, Anson-street and Colton-road to the Railway Inn, near the Rugeley Trent Valley Railway Station.

(ii) From the boundary between the rural district of Lichfield and the Cannock Urban District at Broadhurst Green along the Rugeley-road and Penkridge Bank Slitting Mill-road, Sheep Fair, Bow-street to and along the Market-place, Rugeley, along Anson-street and Colton-road to the Railway Inn, near the Rugeley Trent Valley Railway Station.

(f) In the rural district of Cannock and the urban districts of Wednesfield and Heathtown, from the boundary between the last mentioned rural district and the Cannock Urban District at Wyrley Brook at Wedges Mills along the Wolverhampton-road through Shareshill to Fallings Park at the junction of Victoria-road with the Cannock and Wolverhampton-road in the said urban district of Heathtown.

(g) In the rural district of Cannock and the county borough of Walsall, from the boundary between the Cannock Urban District and the rural district of Cannock at Church Bridge along the Stafford and Walsall-road, High-street, Bloxwich-road, Stafford-street, Park-street to and through "The Bridge" in the said county borough of Walsall;

And (with the consent of the Board of Trade and the Local and Road Authority of the district) along any other route outside the Cannock Urban District.

To empower the Council to demand and take fares, rates and charges in respect of the conveyance by such omnibuses of passengers, parcels, animals and goods, to make regulations as to the payment or collection of fares, rates and charges; to purchase and take on lease lands, houses and buildings, and to construct, maintain and use depôts, sheds, garages and other buildings, and to provide plant, appliances and conveniences in connection with or for the purposes of their omnibus undertaking, to make and enforce, by the imposition of penalties or otherwise, by-laws and regulations in regard to the travelling in or upon the omnibuses and for the prevention of nuisances, to provide shelters and waiting-rooms and other accommodation on any omnibus routes provided under the intended Act, and for that purpose to use any part of any public street or road whether within the Cannock Urban District or any other district into or through which any such route may pass; to make provision with reference to the disposal of property found in the omnibuses; to empower the Council to demise or lease to any Local Authority, company, body or person their omnibus undertaking, or any part or parts thereof, and the right of user of the same, and of demanding and taking the fares, rates and charges

authorized by the intended Act; to make provision as to the lopping of trees along the omnibus routes and to require the owners or occupiers of premises on which such trees may be growing to lop the same, and in default of compliance with any such requirement to empower the Council to lop such trees.

To make provision as to contributions or payments to be made by the Council on such terms and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed or provided for by the Bill towards the cost of the maintenance of roads maintained at the expense of the County Council of Stafford or any urban or rural district council forming part of any omnibus route authorized by the Bill and used by the omnibuses of the Council, and to provide (among other things) that the road authorities shall not under section 23 of the Highways and Locomotives (Amendment) Act, 1878, as amended by section 12 of the Locomotives Act, 1898, or otherwise make any claim against the Council in respect of extraordinary traffic by reason of the user of any road, bridge or approach by the omnibuses of the Council.

To empower the Council and any local or other authorities, companies, bodies or persons providing or running omnibuses or other vehicles in any other district adjoining or adjacent to the Cannock Urban District, to enter into and carry into effect agreements for or with reference to the working, management and maintenance of any omnibus service of the contracting parties or any part thereof, and of any lands and property used in connection therewith, the provision, maintenance, hiring and supply of omnibuses and conveniences in connection therewith, the employment, appointment and removal of officers and servants, and the interchange, accommodation, conveyance, transmission and delivery of traffic arising on or coming from or destined for any omnibus service of the contracting parties, and the payment, collection, division and apportionment of fares, rates, charges and receipts arising from any such service.

To make by-laws and regulations with reference to all or any of the matters referred to in the Bill, and to enforce such by-laws and regulations by the imposition of penalties or otherwise, and to provide (if thought fit) that all or any such by-laws shall be made subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, with respect to the making of by-laws, and to make provision as to the recovery and application of penalties.

To provide that Section 20 of the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, shall not apply in the case of any omnibus route authorized by or under the provisions of the intended Act, or to any omnibus plying for hire on or using any such route under the provisions of the intended Act, or any person driving or allowing any such omnibus to be driven along any such route.

To authorize the Council to borrow and re-borrow moneys for all or any of the purposes of the intended Act on the security of the revenue of their omnibus undertaking, and the district fund and general district rate or any other rates and revenues leviable by or belonging to them or under their control; and to apply all or any such rates or revenues to all or any of the purposes of the intended Act; to execute and grant and issue mortgages and

other securities; and to authorize the Council to apply any of their funds or other moneys authorized to be raised to any of the purposes of the intended Act; and to exempt the powers of borrowing moneys under the intended Act from the restrictions contained in Section 234 of the Public Health Act, 1875, or any other statutory restriction.

To confer powers upon the Council in regard to the re-borrowing of money, to make provision for the repayment of money borrowed by the Council, including repayment, by means of a sinking fund, and as to the investment of any sinking fund, and the use of any sinking fund instead of borrowing for any purpose.

To empower the Council to borrow money temporarily for defraying their current expenses (including among other expenses the expenses of the Council as a local education or sanitary authority and the expenses of their omnibus undertaking) by temporary loan or overdraft from any bank or on temporary loan or deposit receipt or otherwise, to provide for the keeping of separate accounts in respect of the omnibus undertaking of the Council; and to make such other financial provisions as may be necessary or desirable.

To enact all necessary provisions for giving effect to the purposes of the intended Act.

To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

To alter, amend or repeal, or to re-enact, with or without amendment, the provisions or some of the provisions of the Walsall Corporation Act, 1914, and any other Act or Acts, Order or Orders relating to the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Walsall or to that County Borough, and any Act or Acts, Order or Orders relating directly or indirectly to or affecting the Council or the Cannock Urban District.

To apply and incorporate, with or without alterations and amendments, all or some of the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament following, or some of them (that is to say), the Lands Clauses Acts, the Tramways Act, 1870, the Public Health Acts, and any Acts amending the said Acts respectively.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons if and so soon as leave shall be given to introduce the Bill.

English Bank " and certain other Property; Defining Rights of Creditors of London Branch and Bank, and Obligations of Company; Extinguishment of Rights in respect of Transferred Assets and Securities; Extinguishment of said Branch and Dissolution of Committee of Management; Provisions as to Conduct of Business of London Branch pending Incorporation of Company; Allocation and Issue of Fully Paid-up Shares in Company to Shareholders of Russian and English Bank; Defining Rights to Shares in Company of Shareholders of Russian and English Bank not yet Ascertained and Extinguishment of such Rights after Expiration of Specified Period; Provisions as to Rights of Shareholders of Company; General and Incidental Provisions.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session for leave to introduce a Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") for the following or some of the following purposes:—

To vest in and transfer to a Company to be incorporated under the Companies Acts, 1908 to 1917 (hereinafter referred to as "the Company"), the assets and liabilities of the branch established in London in the year 1915 of the institution known as the Russian and English Bank formed in Petrograd in the year 1910 (which branch and Bank are hereinafter respectively referred to as "the London Branch" and "the Bank"), and to define the said assets and liabilities in such manner as may be provided by the Bill.

To transfer to and vest in the Company certain securities (hereinafter referred to as "the scheduled securities") belonging to the Bank and now in the possession of the London Branch or the proceeds of sale of such securities.

To declare the assets so to be vested as aforesaid and the scheduled securities to be the property of the Company, and to impose upon the Company the responsibility for the liabilities to be transferred to them as aforesaid.

To provide for the discharge by the Company (in addition to the said liabilities) out of the scheduled securities or the proceeds of sale thereof (but not further or otherwise) of claims made within such period after the incorporation of the Company as may be specified in the Bill by persons who may establish their right to rank as creditors of the Bank immediately before the passing by persons claiming to exercise powers of government in that part of Russia in which Petrograd is situated of certain decrees purporting to transfer to the People's Bank of the Russian Republic the assets and liabilities and the administration of Russian private banks and to confiscate and annul all shareholdings in such banks.

To provide for the cesser of the liability of the company as from the expiration of the said period in regard to all such claims other than those of which the Company then have notice, and which may be subsequently established.

To authorize the Company to deal with and satisfy the said claims at such times in such manner and upon such conditions as to abate-

ment *inter se* or otherwise as may be specified in the Bill.

To extinguish all right, title or interest of the Bank and (except as may be provided by the Bill) of all persons to in or in respect of the said assets or the scheduled securities, and to exempt the Company from all or any obligation to discharge any obligation duty trust or liability existing at the date of incorporation of the Company and arising otherwise than out of or in respect of the operations of the London Branch and from such liability for damages as may be specified in the Bill, and to extinguish or restrict the right to institute proceedings against the Company in respect of the matters aforesaid and to extinguish all or any rights against the Committee of Management of the London Branch (hereinafter referred to as "the London Committee").

To provide that as from the date of incorporation of the Company the London Branch shall cease to exist and to dissolve the London Committee and to release the said Branch and Committee from all or any claims, obligations or liabilities.

To preserve until the incorporation of the Company the rights, powers, privileges, obligations, duties and liabilities of the London Committee and other persons with respect to the conduct of the business of the London Branch and the management and disposition of the said assets, securities and liabilities, and to authorize and require the London Committee and such persons as aforesaid until such incorporation as aforesaid or until the 31st day of December, 1919 (whichever shall be the earlier), to deal with the said assets, securities and liabilities as if the London Branch were a banking corporation carrying on business in England under English law, and to provide that all transactions and dealings by the London Committee with the said assets, securities and liabilities during that period shall upon the incorporation of the Company be deemed to have been carried out for account of and to be transactions and dealings of the Company.

To provide for the allocation to and vesting in and distribution among such of the shareholders of the Bank as are British subjects or directors of the Bank of fully paid up shares in the capital of the Company to an amount proportionate to the amount of the capital of the Bank held by such shareholders.

To provide for the vesting in trustees of the remainder of the capital of the Company as constituted at the incorporation thereof (hereinafter referred to as "the reserved shares") credited as fully paid up and for the transfer (within a period to be defined in the Bill) by the said Trustees to persons proving their title or the title of their predecessors immediately before the passing of the said decrees as shareholders of the Bank of reserved shares to an amount proportionate to the number of shares in the Bank held by such persons.

To empower the said Trustees to vote or abstain from voting in respect of the reserved shares for the time being vested in them.

To define the rights of holders of shares in the capital of the Company in regard to dividends, capital, voting and other matters.

To provide for the payment from time to time to the said Trustees of dividends on the reserved shares for the time being vested in

them to be held in trust for any persons becoming entitled to such shares to the extent of dividends declared and paid within such period preceding the transfer to the said persons respectively as may be defined in the Bill and to provide for the repayment by the said Trustees to the Company from time to time of other dividends received by the said Trustees.

To limit the period within which claims to the reserved shares or any of them may be made to the said Trustees and to extinguish the right to make such claims after the expiration of the period so limited.

To provide for the surrender (with any accumulation of dividends) by the said Trustees to the Company at the expiration of such period as last aforesaid and the cancellation of such of the reserved shares as then remain vested in the said Trustees and for the reduction of the capital of the Company by the amount of the shares so cancelled.

To exempt the said Trustees (subject to their carrying out the trusts and duties to be imposed on them) from all liability in respect of anything done or omitted to be done under the intended Act.

To provide that if the Company shall not be incorporated before the 1st day of January, 1920, the provisions of the intended Act shall cease to have effect as from the 31st day of December, 1919.

To define the rights of shareholders and creditors of the Bank in regard to claims against the Bank or persons acting in pursuance of the said decrees.

The Bill will vary all or any rights and privileges inconsistent with the objects thereof and will confer other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 30th day of April instant.
