By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And, whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the

exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

(B) Bauxite;

Chemicals, rugs, dyes, dye-stuffs, and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

(A) Aceto-celluloses;

(A) Glucose, liquid;

(A) Oils and fats, edible, including blends

of two or more edible oils and fats, except the following:—

Hemp seed oil, kapoc seed oil, maize oil, mowrah seed oil, niger seed oil, olive oil, poppy seed oil, rape seed oil, shea butter, and sunflower oil;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Nuts used as fruit;

(A) Wood and timber of all kinds, hewn, sawn or split, planed or dressed, except lignum vitæ, mahogany and hardwoods.

(2) That the following heading should be added:—

(A) Oils and fats, edible, including blends of two or more edible oils or fats, except the following:—

Hemp seed oil, kapoc seed oil, maize oil, mowrah seed oil, niger seed oil, olive oil, poppy seed oil, rape seed oil, shea butter, sunflower oil, dripping and premier jus.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

METALLURGICAL COKE, IRON, STEEL AND IRONSTONE.

(1) The operation of the said Orders is hereby suspended on and after the 1st May, 1919, until further notice.

Firth of Forth—Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 186 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

Section I.

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS.

Firth of Forth.—All the waters bounded on the east by a straight line joining Elieness and Fidra, and extending as far as the tide flows.

The Port.—The limits of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth are:—

On the east a line drawn 180° (*S. 18° W. Mag.*) through the south point of Carron harbour in the county of Fife to the south shore of the Firth of Forth.

On the west a line drawn 0° (*N. 18° E. Mag.*) through Carriden house to the north shore of the Firth of Forth.

King's Harbour Master.—The King's Harbour Master, Rosyth.

Thick or Foggy Weather.—Any weather conditions which prevent objects 500 yards off being clearly visible, such as fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rainstorms.

Section II.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.

Until further notice the following Regulations are to be observed by all merchant ships in the Firth of Forth. All orders and instructions given by the King's Harbour Master or any patrol vessel are to be implicitly obeyed.

2. The ordinary rules for navigation and safe conduct are to be adhered to in the Firth of Forth except so far as they are affected by these Regulations.

3. Nothing in these Regulations exonerates the owner, master or agent of any ship from any neglect of the ordinary rules for the navigation and safe conduct of ships.

4. Merchant vessels may enter or leave the Forth at any time, but must not leave without first obtaining port clearance from the Collector of Customs.

5. Merchant vessels wishing to enter or leave the docks at Leith or Granton must first obtain permission from the Senior Naval Officer at Leith or Granton respectively.

Section III.

NAVIGATION OF THE DOCKYARD PORT—VESSELS TO KEEP CLEAR OF H.M. SHIPS.

By Day.—When any of H.M. Ships or other vessel in charge of H.M. officers is about to pass—

Outwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the letter "O" flag at the fore, or

Inwards, through the Bridge channel, she will hoist the Union flag at the fore, and the signal stations at North Queensferry, Dockyard and Charlestown will repeat this signal. All other vessels, craft and boats of every description under way are to keep out of the way of the said ship flying the "O" flag or Union flag as the case may be, provided always the said ship shall be navigated with due care and moderate speed and that she shall so far as possible be kept on that side of the channel which lies to her own starboard side.

Letter "O" flag is yellow and red, diagonal.

By Night.—The signal stations mentioned above will hoist—

Two red lights for an inward-bound vessel.

Three red lights for an outward-bound vessel.

Section IV.

PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

It will be compulsory for all vessels to have a licensed pilot on board when navigating the Firth of Forth. Incoming vessels will pick up the pilot from the pilot vessel, which will be found in the vicinity of the green buoy situated 212° (*S. 50° W. Mag.*), $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Elieness. Should she be driven off her station she will be found at Inchkeith.

Outward-bound vessels from ports west of Inchkeith are to discharge their pilot at the cutter.

A uniform landing fee of 8s. (eight shillings) is to be paid by every pilot landed from the motor boat or other vessel which is provided by the Admiralty for the purpose of conveying pilots to and from the Pilotage station.

The pilot is hereby authorised to recover this fee from the master, owner or agent of each vessel piloted.

Section V.

CAUTION AS TO ANCHORING.

No merchant vessel, craft or boat of any description is to make fast to or lay at any dolphins or structure of the Boom Defences.

No vessel is permitted to anchor within the limits of the Dockyard Port without the permission of the King's Harbour Master.

If unavoidably obliged to do so, care must be taken to keep well clear of the fairway and of H.M. Ships at anchor or moored.

Section VI.

HEAVY GUN FIRING BY H.M. SHIPS—SPECIAL DIRECTIONS.

H.M. Ships exercising in the Firth of Forth.—When any of H.M. Ships are carry-

ing out full calibre firing to the eastward of Inchkeith, a red ball over a red burgee will be hoisted at Inchkeith. All shipping is then to follow the track as detailed below.

Outward Bound.—Pass close eastward of a red conical buoy moored $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles east-north-eastward of Kinghorn ness, then steer 42° (*N. 60° E. Mag.*) until Buckhaven light is abeam. Then steer eastward to pass close to and northward and eastward of a buoy situated about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles west south-westward of Ruddons point, thence steer 102° (*S. 60° E. Mag.*) to pass one cable south of a green conical light-and-whistle-buoy moored about south-westward, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Elieness light, then follow the usual track to pass north of May island.

The reverse track should be followed by incoming traffic.

Variation.— 18° W.

Note.

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

II. SPITHEAD APPROACH—TRAFFIC
REGULATIONS; AND REGULATIONS
REGARDING TRADING, FISHING
AND PLEASURE CRAFT.

I. TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. Passage of vessels between Noman's fort and the charted position of Warner light-vessel is permitted during the hours of official daylight, but they are not to use this passage during official night or in thick weather.

2. Vessels of all descriptions are prohibited from anchoring in St. Helen's roads to the westward of a line drawn in a 162° (S. 3° E. Mag.) direction from Noman's fort.

3. No vessel or boat of any description is to anchor or trawl within 100 yards either side of a line drawn from southern corner of Stokes bay pier head in a 177° (S. 12° W. Mag.) direction for a distance of 440 yards.

4. No vessel is to anchor or trawl within 100 yards of a line drawn from the north-eastern corner of the prohibited area off Gilkicker point, mentioned in Part (2) of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 770 of 1919, in a 7° (N. 22° E. Mag.) direction to the shore.

5. No vessel or boat of any description is to anchor kedge within 100 yards either side of a line joining the two buoys situated respectively 600 yards, 250° (N. 86° W. Mag.), and 600 yards, 246° (S. 81° W. Mag.), from the centre of St. Helen's fort.

Note.—Pilot cutters will cruise both on the eastern and western stations of the Isle of Wight district, and vessels coming from the westward may now enter the Needles channel.

Fishing (including the use of trawls) may be carried out by night as well as by day within two miles of the shore, between Worbarrow head and Weymouth pier, but vessels must keep clear of the obstruction which extends from a position $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 193° (S. 28° W. Mag.), from Whitenose to the southward.

4. Fishing (including the use of trawls) may be carried out in the area enclosed by a straight line drawn from a point 5 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill to a point $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from St. Alban's head, thence to a point 30 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from St. Alban's head, thence to a point 30 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill, thence to a point 5 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill.

6. At night the usual lights are always to be shown.

7. Fishermen are cautioned that it is dangerous to fish outside the prescribed areas, owing to the presence of mines, and if caught doing so they are liable to forfeit their special permits.

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.
