ORDER MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE, DATED APRIL 30TH, 1919, REVOKING CERTAIN ORDERS AND REGULATIONS UNDER THE AERIAL NAVIGATION ACTS, 1911 (1 & 2 GEO. 5, C. 4) AND 1913 (2 & 3 GEO. 5, C. 22).

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board, established under that Act for that branch of the Lace trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 16th March, 1914, having given due notice on 23rd January, 1919, of Proposal to Vary and Cancel, as therein shown, certain minimum rates of wages as set out in the Notice fixing and varying minimum rates of wages dated 13th August, 1917, have given notice that they have varied and cancelled certain minimum piece rates of wages so previously varied by them on 13th August, 1917.

TRADE BOARD ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 1 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE CORSET TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Board Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the aforesaid opinion;

Now, therefore, I, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to me by Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf, do hereby make a Special Order that from and after the 6th day of May the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919.

The Corset Trade, that is to say:—

(a) The manufacture of corsets, stays, children's corset bodices, infants' stay bands, bust confiners such as brassieres and bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.

(b) The manufacture of support or abdominal belts and similar articles except where

made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of surgical instruments.

(c) The assembling of stocking suspenders in conjunction with or in association with the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

(d) All warehousing, packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

TEMPORARY RECONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS FOR RECRUITING CLERKS IN THE FOREIGN OFFICE AND ATTACHES IN THE DIPLOMATIC SERVICE.

(These regulations are liable to alteration at any time after due notice.)

1. *Age.*—Candidates must have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1889, and have attained the age of 22 on the date fixed for the qualifying examination described below.

2. *Nationality.*—Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State.

3. *Military Service.*—Candidates must have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military or Air Forces; provided that a candidate who has been found unfit on grounds of health for general service, has served for at least a year in a Government Department, has there shown himself to be up to or above the standard of ability usually obtained from competitive examinations, and is recommended by his Department, may also be considered; provided also that a candidate who has been interned in an enemy country in such manner as to preclude him from serving in His Majesty's Forces may be eligible.

4. *Education.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received whole-time continuous and systematic education of a high type until at least the age of 18. They must also be able, by reference to places of education or otherwise, to furnish evidence satisfactory to the Commissioners of the mastery of French that is essential for this service.

5. *Health and Character.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

No candidate will be passed who cannot be sent to any climate.

The loss of a limb will not in itself be regarded as a disqualification, but the loss of sight, deafness, or a bad stammer will be so regarded.

6. *Application.*—Candidates must make application on the appropriate Form, which may be obtained from the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, 6, Burlington Gardens, London, W. 1.

7. *Qualifying Examination.*—Those candidates who on their Application Forms and the resulting inquiries are adjudged by the Civil Service Commissioners to be eligible will undergo a qualifying examination in the following subjects:—

French,
English,
General Knowledge,
Arithmetic,

and those whom the Civil Service Commissioners judge to approximate to the standard of ability usually obtained from competitive examinations for these situations will be passed.

8. *Competitions.*—Candidates who pass the qualifying examination and are of the requisite age, health and character, will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board. The Selection Board will hold competitions at intervals while these regulations remain in force, and on each competition they will prepare a list of the candidates suitable for appointment.

The Selection Board will take into account together with the candidate's record and his personal qualities as shown at the interview any special merit that he may have shown in any subject of the examination.

No candidate will be allowed more than one attempt at the qualifying examination during any calendar year, but a candidate who has passed the examination and, although judged suitable for appointment, has not been appointed on the results of one competition, may be considered by the Selection Board in later competitions.

9. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament, or other influential persons, will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. *Fee.*—Every candidate is required to pay a fee of ten shillings, payable when the Application Form is sent in.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND MAY 1919.)

LONDON, MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Control of Dogs in certain Areas.

1.—(1) A dog in either of the areas described in the Schedule hereto shall at all times—

(a) whilst in or on any public place not only be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, but also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while actually being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other en-

closure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

(3) Article 4 (*Control of Dogs in Scheduled District*) of the London, Middlesex and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), shall not apply to such parts of the District described in the Schedule thereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District") as are comprised in an area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain Areas.

2. No dog shall be moved out of either of the areas described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area, nor apply to the movement of a dog:—

(a) out of either of such areas temporarily for the purpose of exercise; or

(b) through either of such areas from a place in the Scheduled District outside the area to another place in the Scheduled District outside the area;

if in either case it is efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and also led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

3.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place, in either of the areas described in the Schedule hereto, in respect of which the provisions of this Order are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (*Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs*), which article shall apply accordingly.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

Offences.

4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 2 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of

the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of May, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as THE LONDON, MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 2), and shall be read with the principal Order.

II. SOUTH FORELAND TO BEACHY HEAD.

 2. Yachts and pleasure boats are allowed in Dover harbour near the beach between the hours of sunrise and sunset, subject to condition laid down in paragraph 1 above, but must obey any special order which Naval authorities may find it necessary to issue.
 3. All yachts and pleasure boats are to keep clear of H.M. vessels entering or leaving or otherwise navigating in Dover harbour.
 4. Yachts and pleasure boats are permitted to use Folkestone harbour, but must keep clear of transports entering or leaving.
- III. Although the restrictions on yachts and pleasure boats cruising in the waters between North Foreland and Beachy Head have been removed, no vessel is authorised to enter any prohibited or dangerous area as notified from time to time in the Admiralty Notices to Mariners or Mine Warnings to Mariners.

WIRELESS METEOROLOGICAL INFORMATION TO AND FROM SHIPS AT SEA.

General Remarks.

1. It is earnestly hoped that all concerned will assist in making the wireless meteorological service a success. Negotiations are now in hand to extend and unify the system of collecting weather data by wireless from ships at sea all over the world, and at the same time to organise the free transmission of weather bulletins from a sufficient number of wireless stations to admit of ships being constantly supplied with reliable weather reports and forecasts wherever they may be.

2. It should be borne in mind that the needs of ships at sea in regard to information regarding the weather will march hand in hand with the requirements of aircraft. The importance of this service will therefore be constantly increasing, and its success or failure will largely depend upon the co-operation of ships at sea in providing the data without which accurate forecasting is impossible. The matter does not depend solely upon the efforts of the ships selected to furnish the data. The essence of success lies in rapidity in passing such data by wireless from the ship to the coast station, and thence to the central meteorological office. It follows, therefore, that all ships not taking an active part in supplying data should use the greatest care not to interfere with the transmission of the wireless messages to the shore.

3. The following particulars refer to the scheme now being undertaken by the British Meteorological Office. This notice will, however, be subject to revision from time to time, and endeavours will be made to include in each

revision all information available to date of the weather bulletins issued by the wireless stations of the world. Earnest endeavours are being made to obtain international agreement as to the form of these weather bulletins and to the methods and times of transmissions. It is hoped that the messages will eventually all be made in an international code at fixed times, so arranged that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for time signals is being evolved.

Collection of Weather Data from Ships.

4. Certain ships are being asked to supply data regularly three times a day whenever they are within a certain distance of any one of some six or eight "observation points" in the North-Eastern Atlantic.

5. In addition to the regular observations, which are taken at 0100, 0700 and 1300 Greenwich time and sent as soon as possible to Malin head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK) coast stations, these ships may, on request from either of these coast stations, send special data messages at other times.

6. The procedure for a ship which intends to send a data message will be as follows:—As soon as it has been decided to make the data message (*i.e.*, normally at about 0100, 0700 or 1300), the ship makes to "all ships" (CQ) the word "weather,"* followed by a number which indicates the "observation point" (see para. 4 above), near which she is at the time.

* Application is being made to Berne to allot an international 3-letter abbreviation to mean: "Am about to make weather data from observation point number."

7. This warning message will not be answered by any ship or station; it is merely designed:—

(a) To inform all ships within range that a report is about to be made and that they should therefore avoid interfering.

(b) To inform all other ships supplying weather data, which may be in the vicinity of the same observation point, that, one ship having decided to make a report, it is unnecessary for them to make one also.

8. About 5 or 10 minutes after the ship has made the warning as above, she may be expected to transmit the data message itself. The normal or regular "data message" consists of 4 groups of 5 figures each; the special data message is of 2 groups of 5 figures each. All data messages bear the one word "weather"† as the address, and conclude with a "time of origin" of 4 figures. The message will be sent to Malin head (GMH) or Valentia (GCK), according to the position of the "observation point."

† Application is being made to Berne to allot international 3-letter abbreviations to mean: "Following are normal (or special) weather data."

9. It should be noted that several of the observation points are so far out at sea that the coast stations, although provided with extra sensitive receiving gear, will be unable to read the messages unless all ships help by keeping quiet. In particular, ships working near Malin head or Valentia should be on the watch for the coast station making "Go on" (K) or "Repeat" (UD) to a ship whose transmission

they themselves cannot hear. It is hoped that ships will so co-operate in this matter that it will be unnecessary to arrange international "silent periods" to enable these long-range data messages to be read by the coast stations.

10. The coast stations, on receiving these data messages, will possibly have to forward them to London by wireless. They would use continuous wave for this purpose, and would therefore not be heard by ships not fitted with special receivers. Ships should therefore be prepared to find that Valentia or Malin head could not attend to calls for a few minutes after receipt of one of these data messages.

11. The "special" data messages referred to in paragraph 5 above are only made when the Meteorological Office finds its information pointing to the existence of peculiar conditions in a certain area. In such cases the office directs Valentia or Malin head to ask for reports. The shore station then sends, to "any British ship supplying weather data" ‡ the word "weather" ¶ followed, if necessary, by the number of the observation point from which a special data message is desired. This word would not be answered by ships; but ships addressed, which were in the vicinity of any (or of the specified) observation point, would verify their position, make the warning signal to "All ships," take observations and pass in the special data message as above described for the regular message.

‡ The call letters BVD are being given this signification.

¶ Application is being made to Berne to allot an international 3-letter abbreviation to mean: "Please give special weather data (from observation point number)"

ISSUE OF WEATHER BULLETINS TO SHIPS.

12. A wireless *weather bulletin* may contain both or either of the following:—

(a) A *weather report*, which is an official statement of existing weather conditions; and/or

(b) A *weather forecast*, which is an official opinion of probable future weather conditions.

13. The accompanying schedule of wireless weather bulletins is intended to provide, in a form suitable to give all information required by the wireless operator, a complete and up-to-date list of all weather bulletins transmitted at fixed times by wireless stations throughout the world. The same information will be found in detail in the Sailing Directions and in the international list of radiotelegraph stations (the Berne List).

14. The times given in the third column of the schedule are expressed in the 4-figure notation employed for signalling during the war. The term "G.M.T." here means the civil mean time of the meridian of Greenwich, with the day commencing at midnight and the hours reckoned from 00 to 23.

15. Operators are reminded that Article 45 of the International Service Regulations imposes the general obligation of not interfering with reception of weather bulletins by other ships.

16. Certain other stations not shown in the schedule supply weather bulletins *on demand*, generally at reduced charges. Particulars will be found in the Berne List.
