

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 27th day of March, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation, for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, in the County of Devon; and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the 11th day of October, 1912, and published in the London Gazette on the same day, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, situate at Princetown, in the Parish of Lydford, in the said County of Devon, and in the said Diocese of Exeter, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the

Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of the said Diocese of Exeter, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Walkhampton, in the said County and Diocese, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured *pink*, shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, in the County of Devon, and in the Diocese of Exeter, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Walkhampton, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon part of the west partly by the Parish of Whitchurch and partly by the Parish of Peter Tavy, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-west by the last-mentioned Parish, upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, from the said Parish of Walkhampton crosses the middle of the road leading from Princetown to Plymouth, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Devil's Bridge, which carries the said road across the River Meavy, and extending thence first north-eastward, then eastward, and then northward along the middle of the River Meavy and of the western branch of such river for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Princetown Branch Line of the Great Western Railway across the western branch of the said river, and extending thence first south-westward, then westward, then again south-westward, and then north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 1 mile and 57 chains or thereabouts to a point due east of the trigonometrical point of the Ordnance Survey at a height of 1,314 feet at or near to the summit of King's Tor, and extending thence, that is to say, from the said point in the middle of the said line of railway, in a straight line due
