

north for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Moretonhampstead to Tavistock at a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts east of the milestone indicating 15 miles to Moretonhampstead and 5 miles to Tavistock, and extending from the said point in the middle of the road leading from Moretonhampstead to Tavistock first westward, then north-westward, then south-westward and then northward along the middle of such road for a distance of 56 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Merrivale Bridge, which carries the said road across the River Walkham, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Walkhampton from the said Parish of Whitchurch."

And Whereas Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons and Incumbents have, with the exception of the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas a period of more than two calendar months has elapsed since Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents and the Patron of the said Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Princetown, has not offered any objection to the said Scheme or Representation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council of the 13th day of September, 1854, the 13th day of May, 1887, the 30th day of April, 1894, the 14th day of July, 1899, the 16th day of May, 1904, and the 10th day of May, 1905, in a new earthen grave in the part of the said burial ground called the "Great Water Close" situated on the South side of the Lady Chapel, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of Miss
