MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF DEVON.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor-car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Devon have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made, in pursuance of the said sub-section, putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force as regards so much of the Plymouth to Exeter main road, in the parish of Chudleigh, as extends from the County School to the Pound;

And whereas notice of the said application and of the time and manner in which objections should be made to any such regulation appeared in the London Gazette of the 31st day of August, 1917;

And whereas certain objections to the making of any regulation, in pursuance of the said provisions, have been received by the Local Government Board, and it is expedient that further inquiry should be made in the matter of the said application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Chudleigh, on Friday, the 23rd day of May, 1919, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a local inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application;

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such inquiry and be heard with reference to the said application.

GENERAL ORDER.

RESCISSION OF PUBLIC HEALTH (INFLUENZA) REGULATIONS.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, Municipal Boroughs, and other Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Public Health (Influenza) Regulations, 1918, and the Public Health (Influenza) Regulations (No. 2), 1918, We, the Local Government Board, prescribed Regulations with a view to preventing the spread of Influenza;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Regulations should be rescinded:

Now, therefore, We hereby rescind the Public Health (Influenza) Regulations, 1918, and the Public Health (Influenza) Regulations (No. 2), 1918.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH MAY 1919.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The suspension by the Order of the Board, dated the eighteenth day of December, nineteen hundred and seventeen, of the operation of Article 2 (*Prohibition of bringing cattle, sheep, goats or swine from Scheduled Country into a Port in Great Britain*) of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910, and of any provision amending that Article, shall cease on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and the said Article, and any provision amending it, shall on and after such last-mentioned date operate accordingly.

In witness whereof the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries have hereunto set their Official Seal this fifth day of May, nineteen hundred and nineteen.
