Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Manchester (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to amend section 16 of the Manchester Corporation Act, 1891, so as to increase the limit of the library rate leviable by the Corporation, from twopence to threepence in the pound.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Burnley (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Burnley Borough Improvement Act, 1871, so as to enable the Corporation to make, assess and levy a lamp rate within the Borough of not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the annual value of the property assessed to that rate, instead of sixpence, which is the present limit of the rate:
