And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of *May*, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Cus-

toms (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of *December*, 1918, and the 12th day of *March*, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the articles indicated in the Proclamation of the 10th day of *May*, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of *December*, 1918, and the 12th day of *March*, 1919, as being prohibited to be exported to all destinations in European Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Belgium, Portugal, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Iceland and the Faroe Islands, Spain, Morocco, and Palestine and Syria as far north as a line from *Alexandretta* to *Aleppo* inclusive, and as far east as the *Hejaz Railway* inclusive, Czecho-Slovakia, Alsace-

Lorraine, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to all ports in any such foreign countries, should be prohibited to be exported to all destinations in European Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Belgium, Portugal, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Iceland and the Faroe Islands, Spain, Morocco, Palestine, and Syria as far north as a line from Alexandretta to Aleppo inclusive, and as far east as the Hejaz Railway inclusive, Czecho-Slovakia, Alsace-Lorraine, Luxembourg, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and territories on either bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to all ports in any such foreign countries.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Chemicals, drugs, dyes, dye-stuffs and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

- (B) Potassium permanganate,
- Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—
 - (A) Cocoa, raw, and manufactures thereof, except cocoa-butter and cocoa powder

Now, therefore, their Lordships having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Julius Frenkel.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas a Certificate of Naturalization was granted in the United Kingdom during the present war to Julius Frenkel, who at the date of the grant of the certificate was the subject of a country which was then at war with His Majesty,

And whereas the question whether it is desirable that the certificate should be revoked has been referred to the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, constituted under Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, and whereas that question has been answered by the Committee in the affirmative,

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1918, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and cancelled.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for those branches of the trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Tobacco) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the manufacture of Tobacco, Cigars, Cigarettes, Cigarette Tubes and Snuff, including the preparatory processes, and including also the operations of storing and store-keeping, boxing, packeting, labelling, parceling and despatching, and all other warehouse and packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles) give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time Rates of Wages for male and female workers as follows:—

A.—Male Workers.

When employed under 14½ years of age, 15s. 6d. per week.

When employed at 14½ and under 15 years of age, 17s. per week.

When employed at 15 and under 15½ years of age, 18s. 6d. per week.

When employed at 15½ and under 16 years of age, 21s. per week.

When employed at 16 and under 16½ years of age, 23s. 6d. per week.

When employed at 16½ and under 17 years of age, 25s. 6d. per week.

When employed at 17 and under 17½ years of age, 28s. per week.

When employed at 17½ and under 18 years of age, 30s. 6d. per week.

When employed at 18 and under 18½ years of age, 35s. per week.

When employed at 18½ and under 19 years of age, 37s. 6d. per week.

When employed at 19 and under 19½ years of age, 41s. per week.

When employed at 19½ and under 20 years of age, 43s. 6d. per week.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD
(ENGLAND AND WALES)

ORDER VARYING THE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AT PRESENT IN FORCE FOR MALE WORKERS OF 18 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER THROUGHOUT ENGLAND AND WALES.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give notice, as required by the above Act, that they have made the following Order:—

1. The wages payable for employment in agriculture in each area described in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order of male workmen of the respective classes and ages mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall be not less than wages at the respective rates specified in column 4 of that Schedule for the hours specified in column 5 thereof.

2. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall be not less than the amount specified in column 4 of the said Schedule, and applicable to that workman, notwithstanding that those hours are less than the hours specified in column 5 and applicable to him.

3. The differential rates for overtime employment in each area described in column 1 of the Schedule hereto of male workmen of the respective classes and ages mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall be the rates specified in column 6 thereof.

4. For the purpose of the above rates overtime employment shall mean (a) in the case of each of the said areas and of workmen of each of the said classes and ages such employment as is described in column 7 of the Schedule to this Order; (b) in the case of all the said areas and workmen of all the said

classes and ages all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman except time spent on such day by Horsemen, Cowmen, Shepherds, Teammen and other classes of Stockmen in connexion with the feeding and cleaning of stock.

5. In the said Schedule the expression "employment in summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year, except as respects stockmen, horsemen and shepherds (other than Moorland Shepherds shepherding lay sheep and cattle) in the area comprising the administrative county of Derby and the county borough of Derby, in which case "summer" shall mean the period commencing on the first Monday in May and terminating on the last Sunday in September.

6. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

7. This Order shall apply to all male workmen of the age of 18 years and upwards who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in any area described in the Schedule to this Order during such time as they are so employed.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the 19th day of May, 1919.

9. From and after the date on which this Order comes into operation the Orders heretofore made by the Agricultural Wages Board and fixing minimum or overtime rates of wages or defining overtime employment shall be varied or cancelled so far as may be necessary to give effect to this Order.
