BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Julius Frenkel.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas a Certuficate of Naturalization was granted in the United Kingdom during the present war to Julius Frenkel, who at the date of the grant of the certificate was the subject of a country which was then at war with His Majesty,

And whereas the question whether it is desirable that the certificate should be revoked has been referred to the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, constituted under Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, and whereas that question has been answered by the Committee in the affirmative,

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1918, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and cancelled.
