The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), as amended by the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 1918, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under the Act:

And whereas by section 40 (2) of the Act any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Representation of the People Order shall

be amended as follows:—

1. The following rule shall be inserted after rule 6: "6a.—(a) Where no sufficient address in

respect of an absent voter has been furnished to the registration officer for the purpose of the record of addresses required to be kept by him under rule 19 of the First Schedule to the Act the registration officer may record the qualifying premises in respect of which the absent voter is registered as the address of that voter for the purposes of the said rule, unless it appears to the registration officer that a ballot paper if sent to that address would reasonably be expected not to reach the voter; and

(b) Where an envelope containing a ballot paper and the other documents referred to in rule 15 of this Order is returned to the returning officer as not having been delivered to an absent voter, the returning officer may re-address the envelope to any address to which he could send a ballot paper for that voter if he were then sending it for the first

time; and
(c) Rule 8 (2) of this Order shall apply to persons who have ceased to be members of the naval, military or air forces of the Crown and are in hospitals or institutions or are otherwise away from their homes for the purpose of training or treatment, as it applies to members of the naval, military or air forces of the Crown; and

(d) Where the registration officer receives from a person whose name is on the absent. voters list a duly authenticated application

for his name to be removed from that list, that person shall, notwithstanding that the register has been published, be treated as though his name were not on the absent voters list, and the names of such persons shall be erased from each copy of the absent voters list to be used by the returning officer at an election, without, however, altering the number of any other name on the list. registration officer shall cause any mark placed in the copies of the register to be used by the returning officer at the election against the name of any such person indicating that he will vote as an absent voter to be erased:

Provided that where any such application is received less than one clear day before the day of nomination of candidates for an election, the application may be disregarded for the purposes of that election."

2. Rule 40 shall be omitted

3. In rule 42, after the words "the present war," there shall be inserted the words "and a period of twelve months thereafter."

4. The following rule shall be added after

rule 43:—
"43A. As respects constituencies in Great Britain the third register to be prepared under the Act shall come into force on the 15th day of October, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and shall remain in force, unless ordered, until the 15th day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty, and in connection with the third register to be so prepared the registration dates shall be the dates specified as respects England and Wales in the third column and as respects Scotland in the fourth column of Part I. of Schedule XI. to this Order.

As respects constituencies in Ireland the second register to be prepared under the Act. shall come into force on the 15th day of October, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and shall remain in force, unless otherwise ordered, until the 15th day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty, and in connection with the second register for Ireland to be so prepared the registration dates shall be the dates specified in Part I. of Schedule XII. of this Order.''

5. The following rule shall be added after rule 45 :

" 45A. The documents mentioned in Part II. of Schedule XI. to this Order shall, for the purposes of the third register, be kept published until the dates specified, as respects England and Wales in the second column, and as respects Scotland in the third column, of that Schedule; and the documents mentioned in Part II. of Schedule XII. to this Order shall for the purpose of the second register for Ireland be kept published until the dates specified in that Schedule."

The KING has been graciously pleased to make a posthumous award of the Decoration of the Albert Medal in recognition of the gallantry of Hugh Brown, Boatswain of the steamship "Orissa," of Liverpool.
On the 25th June, 1918, the ship was for-

pedoed and sunk in the North Atlantic Ocean,

six lives being lost.

The explosion took place about twenty feet from the store-room, where some members of the crew, including Brown and his son, who was the Steward's Boy, were receiving their tobacco issue. The store-room was immetobacco issue. The store-room was immediately flooded, but the Boatswain and his son were able to fight their way to the stairway leading to the weather deck, the bottom stairs of which were blown away.

The boy managed to reach the weather deck, but Brown then heard the Storekeeper, who was still in the flooded store-room, calling for help. As soon, therefore, as he had been assured of his son's safety, Brown wished the lad farewell, and, though he could probably have saved himself together with his son, turned back in the hope of assisting the Storekeeper. The water was continually rising, and Brown must have been aware that he had very little chance of being able to win his way to the deck a second time.

The ship sank not long after, and neither the Boatswain nor the Storekeeper was seen again.

THE FLAX (IRISH CROP) ORDER, 1919.

Whereas the Board of Trade have requested the Minister of Munitions to exercise on behalf of the Board of Trade certain powers in respect of Flax:

Now therefore the Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby gives notice and orders as follows:

- (1) He hereby takes possession on behalf of the Board of Trade as from the 1st July, 1919, of all Flax of 1919 crop grown in Ireland as and when harvested.
- (2) The Flax of which possession is hereby taken under paragraph 1 will be divided under the direction of the Board of Trade into six grades according to its quality, handling and cleaning, and the following prices will be paid therefor:-

First Grade, 35s. per stone, delivered

at the appointed Centre.

Second Grade, 33s. per stone, delivered at the appointed Centre.

Third Grade, 31s. per stone, delivered at the appointed Centre.

Fourth Grade, 29s. per stone, delivered

at the appointed Centre. Fifth Grade, 27s. per stone, delivered

at the appointed Centre. Sixth Grade, 25s. per stone, delivered

at the appointed Centre.

Flax which is inferior in quality to that of the sixth grade hereinbefore mentioned will be taken over and paid for according to its relative value.

(3) All Flax of the 1918 crop, or previous years, grown in the United Kingdom will be graded and paid for on behalf of the Board of Trade in terms of the Flax (Irish Crop) Order, 1918, until 31st August, 1919.

(4) All Flax except that otherwise vided for in Clause 5 hereof, grown in 1918 or previous years, which is offered for sale on or after 1st September, 1919, will be graded and paid for in terms of Clause 2 hereof.

- (5) Flax proved to the satisfaction of the Administrator of the Board of Trade, Flax Supplies Committee, Whitehall Buildings, Ann Street, Belfast, to have been grown in 1918, and to have had the Seed thereof saved, or to have been dew-retted during the summer of 1919, in such time as would not permit of its being offered for sale before the 31st August, 1919, provided such delay in dew-retting was due to circumstances not within the control of the owner of such Flax, may be paid for in the terms of the Flax (Irish Crop) Order, 1918, until 31st December, 1919.
 - (6) Non-compliance with any part of this

Order will constitute an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.
