* In the Scales the terms "remuneration" and "expenses" mean respectively payment for services performed by the Officers herein mentioned, except Registration Officers other than the Town Clerks of Dublin and Belfast, and expenses of all kinds (except the expense of the printing of the lists and register) incurred in the execution of any duty under the Act.

† In the Scales "elector" means an elector whose name appears on the completed register, and in respect of whose name the appropriate duties of the officer have been performed.

§ Includes Town Clerks who perform the duties under the Act of the Officers here named in respect of those duties.
