EXPORT OF FOODSTUFFS TO GERMANY.

GENERAL LICENCE.

The Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the Trading with the Enemy Pro-clamations, and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence, so far as the Trading with the Enemy legislation is concerned, to all persons residing, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom to negotiate for the supply to Germany of foodstuffs, namely, food, beverages, spices, edible oils and other articles intended solely for the manufacture of human food; to supply any such foodstuffs to Germany; to carry or arrange for the carriage of and to insure any such foodstuffs destined for Germany; and to take such action as may be necessary or convenient to secure payment for any such foodstuffs so supplied, or for any charges or expenses connected with such supply, carriage or insurance;

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any such supply under any prohibition of export for the time being in force in the United Kingdom is first obtained:

Provided also that nothing in this Licence shall be deemed to authorise the payment of money which at the date hereof is or but for the war would have been due to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in Germany or the withdrawal or disposal of funds or property held or managed in this country for the account of or on behalf of any such person.

CORNWALL AND DEVON (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain Area.

1. No dog shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement, signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area.

Control of Dogs in certain Area.

- 2. (1) A dog in the Area described in the Schedule hereto shall at all times
 - (a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be

kept under control by being-

- (i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape;
- (ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or
- (iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle:

Provided that the provisions of paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin.

- (2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.
- (3) Article 4 (Control of Dogs in Scheduled District) of the Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), shall not apply to such parts of the Scheduled District referred to in that Order as are comprised in the Area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

- 3. (1) Any dog found in or on any public place in the Area described in the Schedule hereto, in respect of which the provisions of this Order are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (Seizure, Detention and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs), which Article shall apply accordingly.
- (2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

Offences.

- 4. (1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 1 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

. Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of May, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

7. This Order may be cited as the Corn-WALL AND DEVON (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER of 1919 (No. 3).

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS. No. 995 of the year 1919.

ENGLAND, EAST COAST.

River Humber and Approaches—Pilotage, Traffic and Fishing Regulations.

Former Notice:—No. 524 of 1919; hereby

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, and are now in force:—

1. From 13th May, 1919, all those pilotage certificates granted to masters and mates for the Humber pilotage district which have been suspended during the war but kept renewed (except those granted to persons who are not British-born sons of British subjects) again came into force, and the statutory exemptions and exceptions from pilotage by licensed pilots again became operative.

2. During fog with visibility of less than onequarter of a mile no traffic is permitted to move

on the Humber below Paull point.

3. As soon as practicable the buoy marking the northern side of the passage through the east boom and the gate vessels marking each side of the passage through the middle boom will be removed, after which:

East Boom.—There will be no obstruction between the outermost of the southern line of dolphins marked by the Clee ness light-float and the outermost dolphin on the Yorkshire shore at present unmarked, except for No. 1 mooring-buoy in position 110° (S. 54° E. Mag.) three-quarters of a cable from No. 3 B.W.H.S. Lower Middle buoy.

Middle Boom.—There will be no obstruction between the outermost of the southern line of dolphins marked by a black conical light-buoy showing a group flashing red light and the dolphin on Sunk sand at present unlighted.

Note.—It is intended very shortly to withdraw the foregoing light-buoy and to substitute a B.W.V.S. can light-buoy, exhibiting a group flashing white light showing two flashes.

West Boom.—There will be no obstruction between the outermost dolphins on the Lincolnshire and Yorkshire shores at present unlighted.

4. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4 Lower Burcom light-float, except those making use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy and No. Vessels using the 4 Lower Burcom light-float. Burcom channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and of its eastern end by a passage 220 feet wide, each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole. No sailing vessel or dumb craft may use this passage unless towed, and no vessel is permitted to tow more than two craft at one time through the passage.

Vessels making use of this passage are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening, and are subject to the following regula-

tions:—

(1) Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navigating with the tide.

- (2) No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the beforementioned passage or to enter or leave the docks or old outfall at Grimsby.
- (3) No vessel may tow more vessels at one time than she can safely navigate through the passage, and under no circumstances is the tow to comprise more than two craft.
- 5. Prohibited areas:
 - (1) Anchorage is prohibited as laid down

in Humber Conservancy Board's Rules and Bye-laws, 1910.

- (2) Anchorage is prohibited in the fairway to and from Grimsby as shown on chart No 109.
- (3) No vessel of any description may anchor, fish, shrimp, trawl or whelk in the area defined by the following imaginary lines:—

(a) To the Eastward by a line joining Spurn lighthouse and the Bull light-vessel produced to the Lincolnshire shore.

(b) To the Westward by the line of bearing—Cleethorpes Sewer Outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited) in a direction 240° (S. 76° W. Mag.).

(4) No vessel is allowed to anchor, fish, shrimp, trawl or whelk in the Humber within the area defined by the following imaginary

ines:---

(a) A' line joining Stone Creek Coast-guard flagstaff and the eastern extremity of the Eastern jetty at Immingham.

(b) A line joining the riverward beacon of the two upper measured mile beacons on Sunk island and the flagstaff near Stalling-borough haven.

(5) No merchant vessel of any description may enter, pass through, or remain in the area bounded as follows, without special permission from the Admiralty Port Officer:—
