A PROCLAMATION

FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the tenth day of June next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday in the County Borough of Leicester, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in exercise of the

powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the tenth day of June next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the County Borough of Leicester, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Thirtieth day of *May*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Tenth year of Our Reign.
