Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare and ordain that the said Speaker of the House of Commons shall henceforth upon all occasions and in all meetings except where otherwise provided by Act of Parliament have, hold, and enjoy place, pre-eminence, and precedence immediately after the Lord President of the Council.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the territories of Africa known as the East Africa Protectorate are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the said Protectorate:

And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the Eleventh day of August, 1902, and entitled "The East Africa Order in Council, 1902," provision was made for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction within the said Protectorate:

And whereas by the Seventh Article of a further Order of His said late Majesty in Coun-

cil bearing date the Twenty-second day of October, 1906, and entitled "The East Africa Order in Council, 1906," it was provided that there should be a Legislative Council in and for the said Protectorate:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the aforesaid Seventh Article of the aforesaid Order in Council of the Twenty-second day of October, 1906:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The East Africa Order in Council, 1919."

II. The Seventh Article of the above recited Order in Council of the Twenty-second day of October, 1906, is as from the coming into operation of this Order hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and in place thereof the following Article shall be substituted and take effect:—

"VII. There shall be a Legislative Council in and for the Protectorate, constituted in such manner as may be directed by any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and as may be provided by any law for the time being in force in the Protectorate.

"From and after the date of the coming into operation of this Order, the present Legislative Council shall cease to exist."

III. His Majesty, His heirs and successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, or amend this Order.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the East Africa Protectorate and shall commence and come into operation on a date fixed by the Governor by Proclamation.

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860 and 1898, that is to say, the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, and the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of July, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860, and 1898, that is to say, the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, and the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an union of two contiguous Benefices, situate

within the metropolis, and within the diocese of London, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of All Saints, Paddington, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union:

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, has caused proposals for a Scheme for effecting an union of the said two Benefices to be laid before us, which proposals were prepared under the 7th and 8th Sections of the firstly mentioned Act, and were approved by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, and were assented to by the Patrons of the said two Benefices, that is to say, by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as the Patron, in right of his See, of the said Benefice and Vicarage of All Saints, Paddington, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, from and after the exercise of the next turn of presentation, of the said Benefice and Vicarage of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and by George Abraham Gibbs, of Tyntesfield, Bristol, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament and a Lieutenant-Colonel in Your Majesty's Army, as the Patron, for the exercise of the next turn of presentation, of the said Benefice and Vicarage of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and the same proposals were also assented to by the Vestry of the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and by the Vestry of the New Parish of All Saints, Paddington:

"And whereas the said proposals comprised, amongst other things, the severance of a portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Paddington, and its union with the contiguous Benefice of Paddington, situate within the Metropolis, and within the said Diocese of London:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and of the said Benefice of All Saints, Paddington, should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto, and to the other matters hereinafter contained, should be made as are hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, is now full, the Reverend Arthur Heber Browne, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the present Incumbent thereof, the said Benefice of All Saints, Paddington, is also now full, the Reverend William Boyd, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Paddington is also now full, the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, Clerk in Holy Orders, and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Arthur Heber Browne has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, as such Bishop, and also as such Patron as aforesaid, and as the Patron of the said Benefice of Paddington, and the said George Abraham Gibbs,

as such Patron as aforesaid, and the Vestries of the said Parishes and of the Parish of Paddington respectively, are willing that the Scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present Scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but otherwise is based upon the said proposals:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme set his hand and Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said George Abraham Gibbs, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consents of the Vestry of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, of the Vestry of the said New Parish of All Saints, Paddington, and of the Vestry of the said Parish of Paddington, (in testimony of which consents this Scheme is signed, in the case of each of the said Vestries, by the Chairman of a meeting of the same Vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent), we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council all that is in this Scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned, as follows:—

"PART I.

"As to the proposed union itself and certain immediate incidents thereof we recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and the said Benefice of All Saints, Paddington, be united into one Benefice under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels with All Saints, Paddington,' which said United Benefice is hereinafter called "the United Benefice.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the Benefice of All Saints, Paddington, shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if both of the said present Benefices shall be full, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of All Saints, Paddington, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and in either case it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the said Diocese of London to admit to the United Benefice such first Incumbent without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall thereupon become Incumbent of the United Benefice. Until the time of the union taking effect the said two Benefices shall remain separate, and the rights and liabilities in respect thereof, and of the Incumbents of each of them shall remain unaffected.

"3. That if, after this Scheme shall have been ratified by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, and before the said union shall have taken effect, the said William Boyd, Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of All Saints, Paddington, shall, with the consent of the Bishop of London, retire from his Incumbency in order that the said union may take immediate effect, then he shall be entitled during the period hereinafter specified, to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice, and by way of compensation, an

annual sum of £175, which annual sum shall commence as from the day on which the said union shall take effect, and shall be payable by equal quarterly payments in every year, the first quarterly payment thereof to become due at the end of three calendar months next after the day on which the said union shall take effect, and the said annual sum shall be payable to the said William Boyd during the remainder of his life if he continue to be a member of the Church of England, but not otherwise, or until he shall accept other Church preferment or clerical duties with emoluments. And upon his accepting such preferment or duties if the emoluments thereof be of the net annual value of not less than £175 the said annual sum of £175 shall henceforth absolutely cease to be payable, but if the emoluments of such other Church preferment or clerical duties so accepted by the said William Boyd be of less net annual value than £175, then whilst he shall hold such other preferment or be entitled to the emoluments of such clerical duties the said annual sum of £175 shall in each year be reduced by a sum equal to the net annual value of the emoluments of such other Church preferment or clerical duties for the same year, the net annual value of the emoluments of such other Church preferment to be computed in the same manner as the annual value of a Benefice for the purpose of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1887, and to be reckoned exclusively of the value of any house of residence. Provided always that, if the said William Boyd shall hereafter be convicted of any offence against the Ecclesiastical Law, the punishment for which would be deprivation or suspension, his right to receive such annual sum, payable by way of compensation as aforesaid, shall cease or shall be suspended as from the date of such conviction. And provided also that if the same annual sum, or any part thereof, payable by way of compensation as aforesaid, shall cease to be payable to the said William Boyd by his ceasing to be a member of the Church of England as aforesaid, or by his being convicted of any offence against the Ecclesiastical Law as aforesaid, or by his acceptance of such Church preferment or clerical duties with emoluments as aforesaid, or by his death (as the case may be) on any other than one of the quarterly days of payment, then he or his executors or administrators shall be entitled to a proportionate part of the said annual sum or any part thereof then payable for the period which, at the time of such cesser, shall have elapsed of the then current quarter, which proportionate part shall be payable at the end of the then current quarter.

"4. That the said annual sum shall be charged upon the annual income of the United Benefice, and shall be payable out of the same by the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice, and as between the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice and the said William Boyd, his executors or administrators the said annual sum shall be a first charge at law and in equity upon the income of the United Benefice, the Incumbent of which United Benefice shall be deemed to have accepted the same subject to a trust to pay to the said William Boyd, his executors or administrators, the said annual sum out of the income of the said United Benefice, and for that purpose to use all due diligence to receive and collect the income of the said United Benefice and that if such annual sum, or any part thereof, shall at any time be in

arrear and unpaid for more than 28 days after any of the said quarterly days of payment and the fact of the same being so in arrear shall be verified by the declaration of the said William Boyd, his executors or administrators, or in such other or further manner as shall be required by the Bishop of London, it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to make an order upon the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice requiring him to pay the amount in arrear within a time to be specified in such order, and if the same be not paid within such period, then it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to sequester the profits of the said United Benefice until all such arrears and the costs of the sequestration shall have been paid and satisfied, but the power to be so conferred upon the said Bishop shall not in any wise abridge or interfere with the rights of the said William Boyd, his executors or administrators, to recover the said annual sum and all arrears thereof by proceedings at law, or in equity, or with the legal or equitable rights of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice to recover from the preceding Incumbent of the United Benefice, his executors or administrators, any arrears of the said annual sum which ought to have been paid by such preceding Incumbent.

" PART II.

" As to the Parish Church of the United Benefice and the Church of All Saints, Paddington, and certain matters connected therewith, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

" 1. That upon the union taking effect the Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, shall become and thereafter continue to be the Parish Church of the United Benefice.

" 2. That upon the union taking effect if the tables of fees used in the two Churches be alike in all particulars, the table of fees used in the Church which will become the Church of the United Benefice shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the United Parishes, but if such tables of fees be not alike in all particulars the same shall be of no authority and a new table of fees shall be made by the proper authority for the use of the United Parishes.

" 3. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials of the New Parish of All Saints, Paddington, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the fabric of the Church of All Saints, Paddington, shall be left standing and shall be used for any purpose or purposes authorised by the 19th section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860, so long as the Bishop of the Diocese shall by his licence permit.

" 5. That if such licence shall be refused or hereafter withdrawn the font, communion table, sacramental plate, furniture and fittings of the Church of All Saints, Paddington, or such of them as the Vestry of the Church of the United Benefice shall select, shall be transferred to the Church of the United Benefice; but such of these articles as shall not be claimed by the said Vestry for the Church of the United Benefice shall be transferred to such church or chapel within the Diocese of London as the Bishop may select; provided always that any articles which shall not be appropriated in any

of the above ways, except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be dealt with in the same manner as the proceeds of any sale of the materials and site of the said Church as hereinafter mentioned.

" 6. That in the event of the Bishop of the Diocese refusing or withdrawing the said licence he shall certify this fact in writing to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the said Church shall, as soon as may be after the receipt by us of such certificate from the Bishop, be taken down and its materials and site, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, such sale or disposal being made in all respects subject to the provisions contained in the 17th section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860.

" 7. That in the event of the materials and site of the said Church of All Saints, Paddington, being sold, the proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied towards the acquisition of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church within the limits of the Metropolis or its vicinity and the balance (if any) of such proceeds shall be added to and form part of the fund created by the 22nd section of the last mentioned Act.

" PART III.

" As to the endowments and the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

" 1. That upon the Union taking effect all the existing endowments of the Vicarage of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, and all the existing endowments (if any) of the Vicarage of All Saints, Paddington, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice.

" 2. That upon the union taking effect the present Parsonage House of the Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Paddington, shall be the Parsonage House of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the union taking effect the leasehold residence known as Number 66, Oxford Terrace, Paddington, shall subject to the Mortgage and all other incumbrances thereon and together with the sinking fund Policies which have been taken out in connection therewith, and all rights accrued or accruing thereunder, be transferred from the Trustees for All Saints Benefice, in whom the said leasehold property and sinking fund Policies are now vested, to the Trustees for the United Benefice, who shall release from all liability in connection therewith the said Trustees for the Benefice of All Saints.

" PART IV.

" Upon the subject of Patronage, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

" That upon the union taking effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall be vested for the first turn of presentation only in the said George Abraham Gibbs and as from the exercise of the said first turn of presentation in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"PART V.

"As to a portion of the New Parish of All Saints, Paddington, and as to the Benefice of Paddington, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"That upon the union taking effect all that portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Paddington, which lies to the west of the middle of London Street, shall be severed from the said United Benefice and shall be united to the contiguous Benefice of Paddington, the Patronage whereof is vested in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric.

"All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 1st day of May, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint John, situate at Sandylands, in the Parish of Heysham, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John, situate at Sandylands, as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, (testified by his having signed

and sealed this Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Heysham, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the *map* or *plan* hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint John, situate at Sandylands, as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Sandylands':

"And with the like consent of the said Edmund Arbutnott, Bishop of Manchester, (testified as aforesaid), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint John, situate at Sandylands, as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of Us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof:

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John, Sandylands, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Heysham, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the west and upon the north-west by the sea, upon the north-east partly by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Morecambe, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Laurence, Morecambe, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the east partly by the said New Parish of Saint Laurence, Morecambe, and partly by the Chapelry of Overton, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point at Grindstone Turn where the boundary which divides the said Chapelry of Overton from the said Parish of Heysham crosses the middle of Green Lane, and extending thence first south-westward, then westward, and then again south-westward along the middle of Green Lane for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Moss Lane, and extending thence first south-westward, then westward and then north-westward along the middle of Moss Lane for a distance of 56½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lordsome Lane and Tibicar Lane, and extending thence first westward, then south-westward, and then again westward along the middle of Tibicar Lane for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Heysham Road and Whinnysty Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Whinnysty Lane for a distance of 12 chains or

thereabouts to the point where such lane reaches the shore, and extending thence in a straight line due west to the sea."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.
