### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty that there should be assigned to the Speaker of the House of Commons a place in the Order of Precedence in accord with the great dignity and importance of the high office to which he is called:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare and ordain that the said Speaker of the House of Commons shall henceforth upon all occasions and in all meetings except where otherwise provided by Act of Parliament have, hold, and enjoy place, pre-eminence, and precedence immediately after the Lord President of the Council.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the territories of Africa known as the East Africa Protectorate are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the said Protectorate:

And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the Eleventh day of August, 1902, and entitled "The East Africa Order in Council, 1902," provision was made for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction within the said Protectorate:

And whereas by the Seventh Article of a further Order of His said late Majesty in Coun-
