FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the First day of July next, should be kept as a close holiday in all Banks throughout the United Kingdom, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of Section four of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, appoint the said Tuesday,

the First day of July next, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the United Kingdom, for the purposes of the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly:

And whereas it is customary for the usual Bank Holidays to be kept as holidays by Our loving subjects generally and not only for the purposes of the said Act, but it is not Our intention that the said First day of July should be kept as a general holiday in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, We do hereby enjoin that the said First day of July shall not be kept as or deemed by virtue of this Our Royal Proclamation to be a holiday in the United Kingdom for any purposes whatsoever other than the purposes of the said Act.

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN
ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited:—

Chemicals of all descriptions.

Electrical goods and apparatus, including electrical plant and machinery of all kinds, and insulating materials of all descriptions.

Scientific, mathematical and optical instruments.

Tungsten powder and ferro-tungsten.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 32) Proclamation, 1919.

(2) in the case of Section 2; paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) and Proviso (ii) of sub-section (1) and sub-sections (2), (3), (4) and (5) of Section 3; Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 and sub-sections (3) and (4) of Section 11, the 1st day of July, 1919, except so far as paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of Section 3 relates to powers and duties conferred or imposed upon the Local Government Board by any Act of Parliament passed, or Provisional Order confirmed, or other Instrument made, on or after the 1st day of July, 1919, but during the present session of Parliament, in respect of which powers and duties the appointed day shall be the day on which such Act, Order, or Instrument comes into operation.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health Act, 1919 (Date of Commencement) Order, 1919.

"Whereas by the Naval Medical Compassionate Fund Act, 1915, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Your Majesty by Order in Council to provide for vesting the management of the Fund, the determination of the persons to receive benefits therefrom, and the distribution thereof amongst such persons, in such Body as may be determined by the Order, being a Body representative of the Naval Medical Service either

with or without the addition of Representatives of the Admiralty:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Act 'Standing Orders and Regulations for the Constitution and Government of the Naval Medical Compassionate Fund' were approved by Order in Council, dated the 28th day of July, 1915, by Clause (6) of which it is provided that the interest on investments of the Fund and the annual subscriptions—

'shall be distributed by the Court of Directors among the eligible applicants for assistance, at Meetings to be held in the months of January, April, July and October in each year' with a proviso that 'the necessitous orphans of deceased and present members of the Fund shall have the first claim to assistance' from the interest on the investment existing on the said 28th day of July, 1915, of the said Fund:

"And whereas the said Clause (6) has been interpreted to mean that the Court of Directors have no option except to distribute in each year the whole of the income and annual subscriptions for that year:

"And whereas in framing the draft of the said Standing Orders and Regulations the Court of Directors and their advisors did not intend that the Court of Directors should be thereby compelled to distribute the whole of the income and subscriptions which should be received in or for any year (which distribution might render it possible that a smaller number of applicants in one year would receive collectively the same amount as a larger number of applicants would receive in another year) but intended rather that after due assistance had been granted to eligible applicants the surplus in any year of the Income and subscriptions in that year should, at the discretion of the Court of Directors, be invested and added to the capital of the Fund:

"And whereas by Section 1 (2) of the said Naval Medical Compassionate Fund Act, 1915, it is enacted that 'An Order in Council under this Act may be altered or revoked by a subsequent Order in Council':

"We beg leave humbly to submit that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to cancel or revoke Clause (6) of the said Standing Orders and Regulations and to substitute in its place the following clause, namely:—

"(6) Subject to the payment of all proper outgoings the Court of Directors shall in each calendar year commencing on the 1st November and at meetings to be held in the months of January, April, July and October distribute among the eligible applicants for assistance so much of the monies which shall during such year be received in respect of income from the Fund and in respect of the annual subscriptions hereinafter mentioned as the said Court shall determine to be sufficient for providing assistance to such applicants.

'The unapplied balance (if any) of the monies which shall be so received as aforesaid in any calendar year ending on the 31st October including any cash and investments in existence on the 1st November, 1919, and representing the unapplied balance of the monies which shall prior to that day have been so received as aforesaid shall be or shall be deemed to have been placed to the credit of the Fund so as for all purposes to form

part of the capital thereof: and any cash from time to time representing any such balance or balances as aforesaid shall be invested as if the same had been donated to the Fund.

'Provided always that the necessitous Orphans of persons who (a) were on the 28th July, 1915, or (b) having died prior to that day had been subscribing members of the Fund shall have the first claim to assistance from the income from such part of the Fund as shall from time to time represent the £10,600 2½ per cent. Consolidated Stock mentioned in Clause (5) and any capitalized income thereof.'"

(1) If an Officer is discharged to retired pay at his own request, or on completion of any period for which he may have been appointed, or as unfit for further employment from other cause than age, medical unfitness, or misconduct, his retired pay shall be increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment for each complete year of service subsequent to retirement from the Active List of Your Majesty's Navy.

(2) If discharged to retired pay on account of age, medical unfitness, abolition of office, or reduction, or reorganisation of establishment:—

(a) With ten or more years' service after date of retirement from Your Majesty's Navy, his retired pay shall be increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment for each complete year of such service.

(b) With less than ten years' service after such date, the increase shall be at the rate of one-fiftieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment, provided that the total addition shall not exceed ten-sixtieths of such pay and allowances.

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 18th day of December, 1918, until the 1st day of July, 1919:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision, and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1920.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the District of the County Court of Sussex held at Lewes and Eastbourne shall be divided, and the areas and parishes set out in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order shall be constituted a separate District of the County Court of Sussex, and the Court of that District shall be held at Eastbourne, and the areas and parishes set out in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Sussex held at Brighton under the name of the District of the County Court of Sussex held at Brighton and Lewes, and the Court of that District shall be held at Brighton and at Lewes.

This Order shall have effect as from the 1st day of August, 1919.

WHEREAS it is provided by section six of the Juries Act, 1918, that His Majesty may by Order in Council modify in such manner as he thinks advisable for the purpose of avoiding unnecessary expense and labour any of the provisions of the Juries Act, 1825, and the Juries Act, 1862, as to the preparation of the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as jurors, so as to provide that any such list may be prepared by altering or supplementing the last previous list and as to the place and manner of the publication thereof: and that any Order in Council made

under the said section may be varied or revoked by any subsequent Order so made:

And whereas His Majesty by the Jury List Order, 1918, made certain modifications in the provisions of the said Juries Acts, 1825 and 1862:

And whereas it is now desirable to revoke the said Order and to substitute fresh modifications for the modifications made thereby:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Jury List Order, 1918, is hereby revoked, and this Order shall have effect in substitution therefor with respect to the preparation of the jury list for the current year:

Provided that the provisions of section thirty-eight of the Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply, with the necessary modifications, to this revocation as they apply to the repeal of Acts of Parliament.

2. In this Order—

the expression "the 1917 list" shall mean the jury list in force for the year nineteen hundred and seventeen;

the expression "the 1918 list" shall mean the supplemental list made out in pursuance of the Jury List Order, 1918;

the expression "the existing lists" shall mean the 1917 list and the 1918 list read together as directed in the said Jury List Order, 1918;

the expression "the second supplemental list" shall mean the supplemental list authorised by this Order to be compiled.

3. The overseers in making out the jury list for their respective parishes and townships shall, as may seem to them best for avoiding unnecessary expense and labour, either:—

(1) proceed as directed by section eight of the Juries Act, 1825--

(2) take copies of the existing lists and strike out therefrom the names of all such persons appearing therein as are dead or have removed from the parish or township or have attained the age of sixty-five years or are otherwise not qualified and liable to be included in the list for the parish or township, and shall then proceed to make out a second supplemental list in which shall be included the names of all persons qualified and liable to be included in the jury list for the parish or township whose names are not included in the existing lists.

The overseers, if they make out a second supplemental list, shall do so in the same form as is prescribed with respect to jury lists by section eight of the Juries Act, 1825, as amended by any subsequent enactment.

4. Where the list is made out as authorised by Article 3 (2) of this Order the existing lists revised as aforesaid and the second supplemental list made out as aforesaid shall be read together as if the names in the 1918 list and in the second supplemental list were inserted in proper alphabetical order in their proper places in the 1917 list revised as aforesaid, and shall together constitute the jury list for the parish or township.

5. The overseers, instead of fixing a copy of the jury list upon the principal door of every church, chapel and other public place of religious worship in manner required by section nine of the Juries Act, 1825, shall before the first Sunday in September deposit

or exhibit the jury list at such place in the parish as they think most suitable for the purpose of enabling persons desirous of so doing to inspect the same, and shall on the first three Sundays in the month of September fix upon the principal door of every church, chapel or other public place of religious worship within the parish or township a notice stating that the jury list has been made out and specifying the place at which the list is deposited or exhibited in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and attention shall be called in the notice to the fact that liability for jury service has been extended by section five of the Juries Act, 1918, to persons between the ages of sixty and sixty-five.

6. Every inhabitant of the parish or township shall at any time during the three first weeks in September be entitled to inspect the jury list free of charge.

7. The precept to be issued under section four of the Juries Act, 1862, shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order, or as near thereto as may be, instead of in the form set out in the Schedule to that Act.

8. Any reference to the jury list, or to the making of the jury list, in the Juries Act, 1825, or the Juries Act, 1862, shall be construed as a reference to the jury list as made, and the making of the jury list, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and the provisions of sections forty-five and forty-six of the Juries Act, 1825, which relate respectively to penalties on overseers and to penalties on clerks of the peace and others for neglect of duty under that Act shall apply to refusal or neglect to comply with the provisions of this Order as they apply to refusal or neglect to comply with requirements of that Act.

9. This Order may be cited as the Jury List Order, 1919.

You are hereby required to make out before the first day of September next and in manner hereinafter directed a true list containing the names of all men, being subjects of the King or aliens having been domiciled in England or Wales for ten years or upwards, between the ages of twenty-one and sixty-five residing within your parish [or township] qualified to serve upon juries; that is to say, of every man who has in his own name, or in trust for him, a clear income of ten pounds by the year in lands or tenements, whether freehold, copyhold, or customary tenure, or of ancient demesne, situate in the said county, or in rents issuing out of any such lands or tenements, or in such lands, tenements, and rents taken together, in fee simple or fee tail, or for his own life, or for the life of any other person, and also of every such man who has a clear income of twenty pounds by the year in lands or tenements situate in the said county, held by lease for the absolute term of twenty-one years, or some longer term, or for any term of years determinable on any life or lives and also of every such man who is a householder in your parish [or township], and is rated or assessed to the

poor rate or to the inhabited house duty on a value of not less than twenty pounds [if in Middlesex thirty pounds].

You are required to make out the said list in one of the two following ways, either—

(1) You shall make out the said list in alphabetical order and write the Christian and surname of every man at full length and the place of abode, his title, quality, calling or business, and the nature of his qualification, in the proper columns of the forms hereunto annexed, according to the specimens, given in such columns for your guidance,

or—

(2) You shall take copies of the jury list in force for the year nineteen hundred and seventeen (hereinafter referred to as "the 1917 list") and of the supplemental list made in pursuance of the Jury List Order, 1918 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1918 list") and shall strike out therefrom the names of all such persons appearing therein as are dead, or have removed from your parish [or township] or have attained the age of sixty-five years or are otherwise not qualified and liable to be included in the list for your parish [or township], and you shall also make such corrections or alterations therein as may be necessary and proper in respect of the place of abode, title, quality, calling or business, and the nature of the qualification of any person whose name remains therein, and you shall next proceed to make out a second supplemental list in which shall be included the names of all persons qualified and liable to be included in the jury list for your parish [or township] whose names are not included in the 1917 list or 1918 list.

If you make out the said second supplemental list you shall do so in alphabetical order and shall write at full length the Christian name and surname of every man whose name is to be included therein, and his place of abode, his title, quality, calling, or business, and the nature of his qualification, in the proper columns of the forms hereunto annexed according to the specimens given in such columns for your guidance. You shall append to the 1917 and 1918 lists revised as aforesaid and to the said second supplemental list a note stating that the 1917 and 1918 lists as revised and the second supplemental list are to be read together as if the names in the 1918 list and in the second supplemental list were inserted in proper alphabetical order in their proper places in the 1917 list, and you shall insert at the foot of each sheet in the 1917 and 1918 lists in which any names in the second supplemental lists are to be so treated as being inserted the following note:—"For further names, see the second supplemental list annexed hereto."

You are also required to specify in the list or lists (as the case may be) which of the persons named therein are, in your judgment, qualified as special jurors and to specify in every case the nature of the qualification and the occupation of the man, and the rating or assessment of every such person.

Every man is qualified and liable to serve as a special juror who is:—an esquire, or a person of higher degree, or a banker or merchant, or who occupies a private dwelling house rated or assessed to the poor rate or the inhabited house duty on a value of not less

than one hundred pounds, in a town containing, according to the last census, 20,000 inhabitants and upwards, or rated or assessed to the poor rate or to the inhabited house duty on a value of not less than fifty pounds elsewhere than in such a town, or who occupies premises other than a farm rated or assessed as aforesaid on a value of not less than one hundred pounds or a farm rated or assessed as aforesaid on a value of not less than three hundred pounds.

If you have not a sufficient number of forms you must apply to me for more; and in order to assist you in making out the list you are to refer to the poor rate, and you may, if you think proper, apply to any collector or assessor of taxes, or any other officer who has the custody of any house tax, land tax, or other tax assessment for your parish [or township], and take from thence the names of men qualified:

In making out the list you are to omit the names of any of the following persons:—

Peers.

Members of Parliament.

Judges.

Clergymen.

Roman Catholic priests.

Ministers of any congregation of Protestant Dissenters and of Jews whose place of meeting is duly registered, provided they follow no secular occupation except that of a school-master.

Barristers-at-law, certificated conveyancers, and special pleaders if actually practising.

Solicitors and proctors, if actually practising and having taken out their annual certificates, and their managing clerks; and notaries public in actual practice.

Officers of the Supreme Court of Judicature, and clerks of the peace or their deputies, if actually exercising the duties of their respective offices.

Magistrates of the Metropolitan Police Courts, their clerks, ushers, doorkeepers and messengers.

Coroners.

Gaolers and keepers of houses of correction, and all subordinate officers of the same.

Keepers in public lunatic asylums.

Members and licentiates of the Royal College of Physicians in London, if actually practising as physicians.

Members of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons in London, Edinburgh, and Dublin, if actually practising as surgeons.

Apothecaries certificated by the Court of Examiners of the Apothecaries Company, and all registered medical practitioners and pharmaceutical chemists, if actually practising as apothecaries, medical practitioners, or pharmaceutical chemists, respectively.

Officers of the Navy, Army and Air Force, while on full pay.

Soldiers of the Regular Army.

Men of the Regular Air Force.

Officers and men of the Territorial Force.

The members of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, and of the Port of London Authority.

The masters, wardens, and brethren of the corporation of Trinity House of Deptford Strond.

Pilots licensed by the Trinity House of Deptford Strond, Kingston-upon-Hull, or Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and all masters of vessels in the buoy and light service em-

played by either of those corporations, and all pilots licensed under any Act of Parliament or charter for the regulation of pilots.

The Household servants of His Majesty.

Officers of the Post Office.

Commissioners of Customs and Excise and officers, clerks, or other persons acting in the management and collection of the Customs and Excise.

Commissioners of Inland Revenue, and officers or persons appointed by the Commissioners of Inland Revenue or employed by them or under their authority or direction in any way relating to the duties of Inland Revenue.

General and Additional Commissioners of Income Tax holding certificates under the Income Tax Act, 1842.

Sheriffs' officers and servants.

High Constables.

Officers of the rural and Metropolitan police.

You are to note that under the provisions of section five of the Juries Act, 1918, persons between the ages of sixty and sixty-five are qualified and liable for jury service, and you shall therefore not strike out of the existing lists the name of any person by reason only that he has since the date on which those lists were made attained the age of sixty years, and you shall take care to include in the new list or in the second supplemental list (as the case may be) the names of all persons between the ages of sixty and sixty-five, being persons otherwise qualified and liable to be included in the jury list and whose names are not included in the existing lists.

When you have made out such list or such second supplemental list you are authorised to order a sufficient number of copies thereof to be printed, the expense of which printing will be allowed you by the parish [or township] except that if you have not made a new list but have made a second supplemental list only you are not authorised to order such supplemental list to be printed unless it contains thirty names or upwards.

You are next required before the first Sunday in September to deposit or exhibit a copy of the new list or if you have not made a new list then copies of the 1917 and 1918 list revised as aforesaid and signed by you with a copy of the second supplemental list appended thereto at such place within your parish [or township] as you shall think most suitable for the purpose of enabling persons desirous of so doing to inspect the same, and you shall also on the first three Sundays in September fix upon the principal door of every church, chapel or other public place of religious worship within your parish [or township] a notice to the following effect, inserting in the first paragraph the time and place of which you will be previously informed by the Clerk to the Justices:—

"Take notice that the jury list for the parish [or township] of has been made out and is deposited or exhibited at and that all objections to the list will be heard

by the Justices of the Petty Session on the day of September next, at the hour of at

"The attention of all persons concerned is called to the fact that liability for jury service has been extended by section five of the Juries Act, 1918, to persons between the ages of sixty and sixty-five, and the names of all such persons, being otherwise qualified and liable for jury service have been included in the said list."

You must allow any inhabitant of your parish [or township] at any time during the first three weeks in September next to inspect the list so deposited or exhibited as aforesaid free of charge; and you must also produce the said list at the Petty Session and there answer all such questions as shall be put to you by His Majesty's Justices of the Peace there present touching the list: And these several matters you are in nowise to omit, upon the peril that may ensue.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (herein-after called 'the said Benefice') of Church Lawford (being a Rectory) with the Vicarage of King's Newnham annexed, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in the Most Noble John Charles Duke of Buccleuch and Queensberry (hereinafter called 'the said Duke of Buccleuch'):

"And whereas the said Duke of Buccleuch is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, now Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the herein-before mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham, which is herein-before mentioned and herein-after recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Church Lawford and King's Newnham:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Duke of Buccleuch (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Church Lawford with King's Newnham now vested in him, the said Duke of Buccleuch, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 29th day of May, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Bispham, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Bispham is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Bispham which is herein-after mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed separate District there has been contributed a sum of £3,700 India £3 per centum per annum Stock and the same has been transferred into our name to be held by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock and to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of £111.

"And whereas the said sum of Stock has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund

created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of £1,000 sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed as before mentioned, a yearly sum of £40, and upon the further understanding and condition that (such appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said Grant of £1,000 sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Commissioners under Our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty chapter 111.

"And whereas the contributors of the major part of the said sum of £3,700 India £3 per centum per annum Stock have nominated the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, the Reverend George Leighton, of the Vicarage, Bispham, Clerk in Holy Orders, Charles Hesketh Fleetwood-Hesketh, of Meols Hall, Southport, Esquire, David Lindsay Harbottle, of Number 54, Warbreck Hill Road, Blackpool, Esquire, and John Chadwick, of Number 28, Cornwall Avenue, Blackpool, Esquire, as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall be assigned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Bispham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the *map* or *plan* hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Stephen, Blackpool.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Barnes, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Barnes, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, which is bounded upon the south
