The KING has been pleased to give directions for the appointment of Captain Maxwell Hendry Anderson, R.N., O.B.E. (Attorney-General) to be of His Majesty's Counsel for the City and Garrison of Gibraltar.

An Order in Council was passed on the 25th instant bringing into immediate operation sections one and three of the Scottish Board of Health Act and fixing the 1st July as the date of transfer to the new Board of the powers and duties of the Local Government Board for Scotland, the Scottish Insurance Commissioners, and (so far as relating to the medical inspection and treatment of children and young persons) the Scottish Education Department.

The KING having been pleased, in pursuance of section one of the Act, to approve the appointment of a Scottish Board of Health, the Board is now in being and its personnel (so far as not already laid down in the Act) will shortly be completed under the advice and direction of the Secretary for Scotland as President of the Board.
