By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

W HEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Sec-

tion 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

Chemicals, drugs, dyes, dyestuffs, and

medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

- (B) Potash Salts and mixtures containing such Potash Salts not otherwise prohibited;
- (A) Hides, wet salted, cattle;
- (a) Leather, except chamois, skivers and seal;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:--

(A) Vegetable, fresh, of all kinds.

- (2) That the following headings should be added:—
 - (A) Hides, British and Irish cattle;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Tomatoes, fresh.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918.

The KING has been graciously pleased to grant unto Marcus Antonius Johnston de Lavis, of St. Leonard's Grange, in the parish of Beaulieu and County of Southampton, Gentleman, and unto Muriel Elizabeth, his wife, only daughter of Henry Trafford, afterwards Henry Trafford-Rawson, late of Coldham Hall, in the County of Suffolk, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace for the said County, and sometime Major and Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel, 3rd Battalion, The Prince of Wales's Own (West Yorkshire Regiment), and sister and sole heir of John Henry Edmund Trafford-Rawson, late of Coldham Hall aforesaid, Esquire, Captain The Prince of Wales's Own (West Yorkshire Regiment), both deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority that they may take and henceforth use the surname of Trafford in addition to and after that of de Lavis, that he the said Marcus Antonius Johnston de Lavis may bear the Arms of Trafford quarterly with those of his own family, and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken, borne and used by the issue of their marriage, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

The KING has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ, in the University of Oxford, to elect a Bishop of the See of Oxford, the same being void by the resignation of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Charles Gore, late Bishop thereof; and His Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Hubert Murray Burge, now Bishop of Southwark, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Oxford.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Lieutenant (acting Major) William Revell Smith, M.C., R.F.A., Sergeant Alexander Gibson, Royal Engineers, and Corporal James Smith, Military Mounted Police, in recognition of their gallantry in endeavouring to save life at Wizernes in January last.

On the 17th January, 1919, a fire occurred at the brewery at Wizernes. In the engine room a Frenchman, whose cries for help could be heard, had been entombed by a fall of masonry which completely blocked the entrance. The upper part of the building was blazing fiercely, and the only entrance to the engine room was by a small hole in the wall which carried the machinery belting. Major Smith, Sergeant Gibson, and Corporal Smith succeeded in making their way through this hole into the room, and worked for three-quarters of an hour before they exposed the head and shoulders of the entombed man, who was found to be dead.

They undoubtedly risked their lives in endeavouring to save life, for a further collapse of masonry (which appeared imminent) would have completely cut off their exit.

GENERAL LICENCE.

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY.

FEES IN RESPECT OF PATENTS, DESIGNS AND TRADE MARKS.

The Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence

- (1) To all persons residing, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to pay
 - (a) on their own behalf or on behalf of any person or persons residing, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom;
 - (b) on behalf of any person or persons residing, carrying on business or being in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom who have been authorised to make such payments by the Government of that part of His Majesty's dominions; and
 - (c) on behalf of any other person who has been authorised or is permitted to make such payments by the Government of the country in which such person resides, carries on business or is,

any fees necessary for obtaining the grant of or for obtaining the renewal of Patents, or for obtaining the registration of Designs or Trade Marks or the renewal of such registration in an enemy country, and to pay to enemy agents their charges and expenses in relation to the matters aforesaid;

- (2) To all persons residing, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to pay on behalf of an enemy any fees payable on application for or renewal of the grant of Patents, or on application for the registration of Designs or Trade Marks or the renewal of such registration
 - (a) in the United Kingdom;
 - (b) in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom where the payment of such fees on behalf of an enemy has been authorised by the

Government of that part of His Majesty's dominions; and

(c) in any other country where the payment of such fees on behalf of an enemy has been authorised or is permitted by the Government of that country;

and to pay to

- (a) agents in the United Kingdom (including themselves);
- (b) agents in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom who have been authorised by the Government of that part of His Majesty's dominions to act on behalf of enemies in connection with the matters aforesaid; and
- (c) agents in any other country who have been authorised or are permitted by the Government of that country to act on behalf of enemies in connection with the matters aforesaid,

their charges and expenses, if any, in relation to the matters aforesaid.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 and 1918. Special Order made in pursuance of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, with respect to the Jute Trade.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid;

Now, therefore. I, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to me by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf, do hereby make a Special Order that from and after the 15th day of July, 1919, the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):—

ARTICLE 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the appendix of this Order.

ARTICLE 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Jute Trade, that is to say, the preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre except flax or hemp: including:—

- (1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and
- (2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the abovementioned work,

but excluding:-

- (1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing, or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and
- (2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted, and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or remaking; and
- (3) The making or repair of sacks or bags, and also
 - (4) The weaving of carpets, rugs, or mats.

WESTPORT SPECIAL MILITARY AREA.

Whereas by Order dated the 4th day of April, 1919, the Army Council with the concurrence of the Chief Secretary declared that on and after the 4th day of April, 1919, the area specified in the Schedule thereto, being the area set forth in the Schedule to this Notice, should be a Special Military Area for the purposes of Regulation 29B of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, under the

- 2. Provided that during the first three months of a worker's employment in agriculture the minimum and overtime hourly rates set out in Clause 1 above shall be subject in each case to a deduction of ½d. an hour.
- 3. For the purposes of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—
 - (1) In all parts of England and Wales.
 - (a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment on a weekday before the hour of 7 a.m. or after the hour of 5 p.m.

- (c) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and the worker.
- (2) In the areas hereinafter mentioned (being the areas of District Wages Committees established by minutes of the Agricultural Wages Board), all employment on a weekday in excess of the number of hours hereinafter specified, that is to say:—
 - (a) In the Cambridgeshire, Hunting-donshire and Bedfordshire; Cumberland and Westmorland; Derbyshire; Devonshire; Dorset; Hertfordshire and Middlesex; Kent; Northamptonshire; Nottinghamshire and Wiltshire areas—in excess of 8½ hours in summer and of 8 hours in winter.
 - (b) In the Cheshire, Lancashire, Shropshire, Glamorgan and Monmouth, and Merioneth and Montgomery areas—in excess of 8½ hours all the year round.
 - (c) In all other areas—in excess of 8 hours all the year round.

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- 4. For the purpose of this Order the expression "summer" shall mean the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "winter" shall mean the rest of the year.
- 5. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.
- 6. This Order shall apply to all female workers of the age of 18 years and upwards who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in any area described in the Schedule to this Order during such time as they are so employed.
- 7. This Order shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of July, 1919.
- 8. From and after the date on which this Order comes into operation the Orders heretofore made by the Agricultural Wages Board and fixing minimum or overtime rates of wages or defining overtime employment shall bevaried or cancelled so far as may be necessary to give effect to this Order.

Thames Estuary—Regulations with regard to Fishing Vessels, Yachts and Pleasure Craft.

Former Notice.—No. 353 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

- 1. No vessel or boat is allowed to fish to the eastward of a line drawn through the Elbow buoy, South Knock buoy and West Shipwash buoy. (See Admiralty Orders for British Fishing Vessels.)
- 2. No vessel or boat is allowed to cruise or anchor to the eastward of the above line except in the traffic routes.
- ...3. The bye-laws of the Shoebury Artillery danger area are to be observed.
- 4. No boat may approach Osea island in the River Blackwater at any hour of the day or night within 300 yards of high-water mark or approach or pass to the northward of any of H.M. vessels moored off the south side of the island.

Mariners are warned that the danger of drifting mines still exists.

Note.—This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against these Regulations.
