WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction Order (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, has been pleased to impose restrictions upon aliens and to make various provisions for carrying those restrictions into effect:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order in Council made thereunder:

And whereas it is no longer necessary that a certificate of exemption from such of the provisions of the Principal Order as apply to alien enemies should be granted to any person recognised by the Polish National Committee or the Polish Consulate as a Pole or as a Polish citizen:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by

and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Article 25n of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and shall be omitted.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to

adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council, dated the 30th day of May, 1919:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Article 3 of the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, issued by His Majesty by Order in Council, dated the 30th day of May, 1919, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 19th day of June, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Edenbridge, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Edenbridge is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in the Reverend Walter John Nesbitt, of Number 19, Meyrick Park Crescent, Bourne-

mouth, in the County of Southampton, Clerk in Holy Orders:

"And whereas the said Walter John Nesbitt is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Edenbridge, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend John Reginald, now Bishop of Rochester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Edenbridge which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the Parish of Edenbridge:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Walter John Nesbitt, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Edenbridge, now vested in him, the said Walter John Nesbitt, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

PROCLAMATION OF PEACE.

In pursuance of a Warrant from the Right Honourable Lord Edmund Bernard Talbot, G.C.V.O., designate, D.S.O., Deputy to the Earl Marshal of England, in obedience to His Majesty's Order in Council of the 1st instant, His Majesty's Officers of Arms this day made Proclamation declaring a Definitive Treaty of Peace with the German Government.

At half-past eleven in the morning the

Deputy Earl Marshal and the Officers of Arms, habited in their tabards, accompanied by the High Steward of Westminster, assembled at St. James's Palace, and attended by the Sergeants-at-Arms carrying their maces, proceeded to the balcony in Friary Court, where, after the trumpets had sounded thrice, His Majesty's Proclamation was read by Sir Henry F. Burke, K.C.V.O., C.B., Garter Principal King of Arms.

A procession was then formed and proceeded to Charing Cross in the following order:—

At Charing Cross, York Herald read the Proclamation, looking towards Whitehall. The procession then moved on to the site of Temple Bar, where a temporary barrier had been placed across the street to mark the boundary of the City of London. Richmond Herald then advanced between two Trumpeters, preceded by two of the Life Guards, and rode up to the barrier, demanding in the ancient form admission into the City. Bluemantle was then conducted by the City Marshal to the Lord Mayor, who was in attendance in his State carriage, together with the Aldermen and Officers of the Corporation, and the Order of His Majesty in Council having been delivered to his Lordship, who read it aloud, direction was given to remove the barrier. Bluemantle Pursuivant was then conducted to his place in the procession, which moved on into the City,

the High Steward of Westminster having filed off at Temple Bar, the boundary of the City.

At the corner of Chancery Lane the Proclamation was read by Windsor Herald.

The Procession, followed by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, Sheriffs, and Officers of the Corporation, then moved on to the end of Wood Street, where the Cross formerly stood in Cheapside, and the Proclamation was there read by Chester Herald.

The Procession then proceeded to the Royal Exchange, where the Proclamation was read the fifth and last time by Norroy King of Arms.

The Trumpets sounded thrice previous to and immediately after each reading.

The Officers of Arms and the Sergeants-at-Arms were afterwards entertained by the Lord Mayor at the Mansion House.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Mr. Thomas Williams, Station Master on the Great Western Railway at Pembroke, in recognition of his gallantry in

saving life in March last. The circumstances are as follows:—

On the 13th March, as a train was entering Pembroke Station, an elderly gentleman, Canon Bowen, of Pembroke, in stepping aside to avoid a luggage barrow, fell off the platform on to the rails. The train was not more than thirty yards away from him when he fell, and was travelling fast. The Station Master, who was close by, at once jumped down in front of the engine and just succeeded in rolling Canon Bowen off the track, and held him down alongside the rails until it was safe to allow him to get up.

Although the brakes were applied it was found impossible to bring the train to a standstill until the engine and two coaches had passed the spot where rescued and rescuer were lying. Had it not been for Mr. Williams' presence of mind and courage Canon Bowen could hardly have escaped instant death.

THE COAL (PIT'S MOUTH) PRICES ORDER, 1919, DATED THE 11TH JULY, 1919, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE PRICE OF COAL (LIMITATION) ACT, 1915, AND UNDER REGULATIONS 2F, 2J, and 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

Whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied that special circumstances affect all the coal mines in the United Kingdom.

And whereas the Board of Trade deem it expedient to make further exercise of the

powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations for the purpose of maintaining and regulating the supply of coal

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Section 1, Sub-section 2, of the Price of Coal (Limitation) Act, 1915, and by Regulations 2F, 2J, and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Board of Trade hereby order as follows:—

1. For the standard amount of four shillings fixed by Section 1, Sub-section 2, of the Price of Coal (Limitation) Act, 1915, there shall be substituted in the case of mines in the South Wales, Monmouthshire and the Forest of Dean districts, and in South Staffordshire and East Worcestershire south of a line drawn from Bushbury Station on the London and North Western Railway to Streetly Station on the Midland Railway, and in so much of the area in South Staffordshire and East Worcestershire north of this line as is comprised in the Wolverhampton Union for poor law purposes or the east division of Wolverhampton for Parliamentary purposes, a standard amount of nineteen shillings, and in the case of mines situated elsewhere a standard amount of sixteen shillings and sixpence.

2. The price at which coal may be sold or offered for sale at the pit's mouth for use in the United Kingdom shall be the price at which coal of the same description was sold in similar quantities and under similar conditions affecting the sale at the pit's mouth at the same coal mine on the corresponding date (or as near thereto as having regard to the course of business may be practicable) in the twelve months ended the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and fourteen, increased by the amounts mentioned in paragraph 1, and such price shall be both the maximum and, unless the Controller of Coal Mines in any particular case otherwise orders, the minimum price. The price of all such coal dispatched from the Colliery on or after the 16th July under any existing contract shall be increased accordingly.

3. Where in consequence of this Order the price paid or to be paid by any person to whom coal is or has been sold is increased, the price paid or to be paid by any person to whom the coal is or has been sold in pursuance of any subsidiary contract, shall be increased by the same amount, and all contracts for the purchase and sale of coal shall remain in force subject to such modification as aforesaid.

4. This Order shall come into force on the 16th day of July, 1919, and may be cited as the Coal (Pit's Mouth) Prices Order, 1919.

TRADING WITH GERMANY.

GENERAL LICENCE.

The Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons and bodies of persons resident carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in Germany:

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any transaction under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the United Kingdom or in respect of any remittance of money out of the United Kingdom covered by Regulation 41D of the Defence of the Realm Regulations is first obtained:

Provided also that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay to or for the benefit of any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in Germany any sum of money which by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914 and 1915, or either of them, is required to be paid to the Custodian appointed under the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914, but such sums of money must be paid to the said Custodian:

Provided further that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay or deliver any sum of money or property which is or but for the war would have been due or deliverable to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in Germany in respect of a transaction entered into before the outbreak of war.

TRADING WITH GERMAN AUSTRIA.

GENERAL LICENCE.

The Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers

reserved in the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons and bodies of persons resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom, to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in German Austria:

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any transaction under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the United Kingdom or in respect of any remittance of money out of the United Kingdom covered by Regulation 41D of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, is first obtained.

Provided also that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay to or for the benefit of any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in German Austria any sum of money which by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914 and 1915, or either of them, is required to be paid to the Custodian appointed under the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914, but such sums of money must be paid to the said Custodian:

Provided further, that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay or deliver any sum of money or property which is or but for the war would have been due or deliverable to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in German Austria in respect of a transaction entered into before the outbreak of war.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION ONE OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, WITH RESPECT TO THE ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE.

Whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, apply to the trades specified in the schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and to the trades specified in the schedule to the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, and the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply, if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, and the Minister of Labour as respects that trade is of the opinion aforesaid:

Now, therefore, I, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers given to me by Section One of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and by any other statute in that behalf do hereby make a Special Order that from and after the 18th day of July, 1919, the following provision shall have effect (that is to say):—

Article 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909

and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the appendix of this Order.

Article 2.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Rope, Twine and Net Trade, that is to say:—

1. The making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted, and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes; (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles.

2. The bleaching, teasing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above when carried on in the same factory or workshop as such making or re-making.

3. The manufacture of packings, gaskins and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or re-making of any of the articles (a) to (g) above.

4. The braiding or spicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net.

5. The mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles, where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or re-made.

but excluding

the making of wire rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp or similar rope or core for wire rope), and also excluding the making of net in connection with the lace curtain trade, and the weaving of cloth.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE LEARNER IN LONDON, IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 14 and 16. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September of that year.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject.

3. At each examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her parent or guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons who may have accepted a situation as Learner in any London office will not be eligible to compete.
