TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

LAUNDRY TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for those branches of the trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the laundering of articles of every description and all processes and operations incidental thereto performed by way of trade for the purpose of gain), hereby give notice, as required by section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to fix General Minimum Time Rates, Overtime Rates, Guaranteed Time Rates, and Piece-work

basis Time Rates as shown in the Schedule appended hereto.

In respect to the proposed Overtime Rates and in compliance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board also propose to declare the normal number of hours of work to be as shown in the Schedule appended hereto.

SCHEDULE.

PART 1.

Proposed Minimum Rates for Female Workers other than those specified in Part 2.

Workers entering the Laundry trade for the first time may be employed, if over the age of 16 and under the age of 18 years, for six months at a rate of wages of 2s. per week less than the rate applicable under the above scale, provided that in no case shall the minimum rate be less than 15s. per week, and if over the age of 18 years, at 3s. per week less than the rate applicable under the above scale.

The normal number of hours of work per week shall be 48, and the overtime rates shall be payable in respect of time worked in any week in excess of 48.

The normal number of hours of work on Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor under Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901) shall be 5, and the overtime rate shall be payable in respect of time worked on such day in excess of 5 hours, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that for overtime after the first two hours of overtime on Saturdays or the weekly day substituted as aforesaid the overtime rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-half, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

Provided also that for all time worked on Sundays and the days which shall be allowed as holidays under Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the overtime rate shall be equivalent to double time, that is to say, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable.

The overtime rates shall not apply to piece-workers.

Guaranteed Time Rates for Piece-Workers.

The guaranteed time rates for piece-workers, to apply in the case of workers employed on piece-work for the purpose of securing to such workers a minimum rate of remuneration on a time-work basis, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

Guaranteed Time Rate per Week.

- Female Workers under 14½ years of age, 12s.
Female Workers of 14½ and under 15 years of age, 13s.

Female Workers of 15 and under 15½ years of age, 15s.
 Female Workers of 15½ and under 16 years of age, 15s.
 Female Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 16s.
 Female Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 18s.
 Female Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 20s.
 Female Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 22s.
 Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, 24s.

A piece-worker shall be entitled to be paid not less than the minimum rate applicable to a worker of her age as set out above in any case where her earnings on piece-work are less than such sum.

Provided that where short time is systematically worked by agreement in writing between an employer and the workers affected and such agreement has been approved by or on behalf of the Trade Board, such workers shall be deemed to be employed on an hourly basis and the rates applicable shall be not less than the weekly rates divided by the number of hours ordinarily worked by the laundry when not on short time.

Piece-work Basis Time Rate.

The piece-work basis time rate shall be 34s. per week of 48 hours, that is to say, in cases where a worker is employed on piece-work the piece rate shall be sufficient to yield to an ordinary worker in the circumstances of the case an amount not less than 34s. per week of 48 hours.

The general minimum time rates and guaranteed time rates for piece-workers are for a week not exceeding 48 hours, and no deduction shall be made from such rates where the number of hours worked is less than 48, except in the cases where the worker is absent from work during the normal working hours of the laundry without the permission of the employer. In such cases the rates as set out shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours worked by the worker is less than those which she had the opportunity of working. Provided that where the time lost in any week does not exceed two hours the deduction for each hour shall not be at a greater rate than 1/48th part of the weekly rate.

The guaranteed time rates for piece-workers are subject to a proportionate increase according as the number of hours worked by a worker in any week exceeds 48.

PART 2.

PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS OF 16 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER, SPECIALLY EMPLOYED FOR EMERGENCY WORK.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the following shall be the time rate for workers of 16 years of age and over who are specially employed for emergency work:

General Minimum Time Rates.

For Female Workers of 16 years and under 18 years of age, 7d. per hour.

For Female Workers of 18 years of age and over, 7½d. per hour.

Piece-work Basis Time Rate.

The piece-work basis time rate shall be 9d per hour, that is to say, in cases where the worker is employed on piece-work the piece-rate shall be sufficient to yield to an ordinary worker in the circumstances of the case an amount not less than 9d. an hour.

Overtime Rates.

For workers comprised within this part of the Schedule, the normal number of hours of work shall be the same as for workers comprised within Part 1, provided, however, that where a worker has not worked 48 hours in the week prior to mid-day on Saturday the normal number of hours of work on Saturday and Sunday shall be 9.

The overtime rate shall be time-and-a-quarter for all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours, provided that where a worker has worked 48 hours in the week preceding mid-day on Saturday, the overtime rate payable after the first 2 hours' overtime on Saturday shall be at the rate of time-and-a-half, and for all time worked on Sunday, double time. Where the worker has not worked 48 hours in the week preceding mid-day on Saturday, the overtime rate shall be payable for all time exceeding 9 hours on Saturday or Sunday, and shall be at the rate of time-and-a-half.

The above minimum rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than such deductions as are provided for above, deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions, authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or any provident fund.

The above minimum rates are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals, which may be lodged with them within two months from 17th July, 1919.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, the Minister of Labour is pleased to establish a Trade Board for the Paper Bag Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag Trade) Order, 1919, namely, the manufacture from paper (including gauze-lined or cloth-lined paper) of any bag or container without a gummed flap, including the operations of packing, parcelling, warehousing, receiving, store-keeping, despatching, time-keep-

ing, lift-operating, and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper-bag manufacture, and *including* the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus; but *excluding* the manufacture of bags or containers with unglummed flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same processes as gummed envelopes, and *excluding* the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

In accordance with the regulations with respect to the constitution and proceedings of the above-mentioned Trade Board, dated 10th July, 1919, the Trade Board shall consist of:—

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirtmaking trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 26th December, 1913, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time Rate for female workers from 6d. to 8d. per hour, and to vary correspondingly the General Minimum Time Rates fixed for younger female workers.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to fix General Minimum Time Rates for Male Workers as follows:—

Male Workers of 22 years of age and over, who are employed during the whole or substantial part of their time in Cutting, 1s. 6d. per hour.

The term Cutting shall be deemed to include the operations of Hooking-up, Folding, Marking-in or Marking-out, and Dividing.

ALL OTHER MALE WORKERS.

When employed under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

When employed at 15 and under 16 years of age, 4d. per hour.

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age, 5d. per hour.

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age, 6d. per hour.

When employed at 18 and under 19 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

When employed at 19 and under 20 years of age, 9d. per hour.

When employed at 20 and under 21 years of age, 10½d. per hour.

When employed at 21 and under 22 years of age, 1s. per hour.

When employed at 22 years of age and upwards, 1s. 1¾d. per hour.

OXFORDSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of the Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*police*);

Section forty-four (*General Administrative provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the OXFORDSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919.

(CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919
(No. 10).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of Scheduled Area.

1. No dog shall be moved out of the area described in the Schedule hereto unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement and signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay

and without being rebooked within the area, nor apply to the movement of a dog:—

(a) out of the said area temporarily for the purpose of exercise; or

(b) through the said area from a place outside the area to another place in the same Scheduled District outside the area;

if in either case it is efficiently muzzled with an effective wire-cage muzzle, and also led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

Control and Muzzling of Dogs in Scheduled Area.

2.—(1) A dog in the Area described in the Schedule hereto shall at all times

(a) whilst in or on any public place, be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire-cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;

(b) whilst in or on any other place be—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire-cage muzzle:

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

(3) Article 4 (Control of Dogs in Scheduled Districts) of the Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 5), hereinafter referred to as the principal Order, shall not apply to a dog in the area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

3.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place in the area described in the Schedule hereto, in respect of which the provisions of this Order as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs), which Article shall apply accordingly.

(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of this Order.

Offences.

4.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 1 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contraven-

tion as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of July, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

1. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) while bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Orfordness or *vice versa*, must be con-

ducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

Clauses 1 and 2 above do not apply to British ships whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Gravesend or between Gravesend and Orfordness or between Orfordness and the Downs Pilot Station, provided that they do not make use of any port in the London Pilotage District within these limits.

4. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

5. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Orfordness, or between those places and any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

6. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

7. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Orfordness, and also Pilots for the River Thames, and Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamer attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal pier.

(b) ORFORDNESS, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer will cruise in the vicinity and south of Orfordness.

(c) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON for the Downs, and Orfordness (including the River Thames and approaches).

8. The Trinity House Pilot Stations at Dungeness and the Sunk have been temporarily discontinued.

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

II.—RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &c.—SPECIAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS NO LONGER IN FORCE.

The regulations with regard to traffic into and out of the River Thames, published in the former Notice, are no longer in force.

Mariners are notified that the navigational marks are in process of replacement, and that further Notice will be given as soon as any channel is sufficiently marked for it to be used with safety.

Note. This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against these Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
