PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to alter the number and boundaries of the districts and the place of holding any Court and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court, and the consolidation of any two or more districts, and the division of any district, and to order by what name and in what towns and places a court shall be held in such district:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 25th day of June, 1919, His Majesty was pleased to order that certain alterations should be made in relation to the County Court of Sussex held at Lewes and Eastbourne, and the County Court of Sussex held at Brighton:

And whereas it is desirable that the said Order should be revoked, and that the following Order should be substituted:

Now, Therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The said Order in Council dated the 25th day of June, 1919, is hereby revoked.

2. The District of the County Court of Sussex held at Lewes and Eastbourne shall be divided, and the area comprising the parishes set out in the second column of the first schedule to this Order shall be constituted a separate District under the name of the County Court of Sussex held at Eastbourne and a Court in that District shall be held at Eastbourne.

3. The area comprising the parishes set out in the second column of the second schedule to this Order shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Sussex held at Brighton under the name of the County Court of Sussex held at Brighton and Lewes, and a Court in that District shall be held at Brighton and at Lewes.

4. So much of the parish of Hadlow Down as is now in the District of the County Court of Kent held at Tunbridge Wells shall be transferred from that district to the district of the County Court of Sussex held at Brighton and Lewes.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1919.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR ALL AREAS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order shall apply to all Areas or parts of Areas situate in England and Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 2 of the Orders of the Board now in force in the said Areas, it shall be lawful to sell and supply intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises and to consume intoxicating liquor on the premises during any specified hours between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. on weekdays under a special order of exemption or licence granted in pursuance of Section 57 or Section 64 of the Licensing (Consolidation) Act, 1910, for any public ceremony or gathering or like special occasion involving the assembly of and necessitating the provision of accommodation for considerable numbers of persons.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF WOMAN CLERK IN PUBLIC DEPARTMENTS.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 18 and 30. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of July, 1919.

2. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered six months' approved service prior to 1st July, 1919, in one or more of His Majesty's Civil Departments in an established post as Typist, Shorthand Typist, Writing Assistant, Clerical Assistant or Sorting Assistant, or as Temporary Woman Clerk or Typist; or as an enrolled member of the clerical sections of the Q.M.A.A.C., W.R.N.S., or W.R.A.F.; or in a temporary clerical post in the War Department Establishments.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(a) That they are unmarried, or widows.

(b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father who is a natural-born British subject.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. English Composition (including Writing and Spelling).

2. Précis Writing.

3. Arithmetic.

4. General Knowledge.

Candidates who fail to obtain such an aggregate number of marks as may indicate in the judgment of the Civil Service Commissioners a competent amount of general proficiency will not be regarded as qualified.

5. Candidates who are unsuccessful for Woman Clerkships, but are adjudged on the result of their examination to be qualified for the situation of Writing Assistant, may be offered permanent posts of the latter grade.

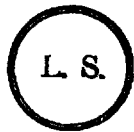

AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD
(ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY THE SPECIAL MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES AT PRESENT IN FORCE FOR SPECIAL CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS (SUCH AS HORSEMEN, SHEPHERDS, STOCKMEN, ETC.) OF 18 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER IN ANGLESEY, CARNARVON, BERKSHIRE, CAMBRIDGESHIRE, HUNTINGDONSHIRE, BEDFORDSHIRE, DENBIGH, FLINT, DERBY, DORSET, GLOUCESTER, HAMPSHIRE, LINCOLNSHIRE, MERIONETH, MONTGOMERY, NORTHUMBERLAND, DURHAM, WARWICKSHIRE AND YORKSHIRE.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give Notice, as required by the above Act, that they propose to make an Order, to come into operation on the first Monday in October, 1919, to the following effect:—

1. The wages payable for employment in agriculture in each area described in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order of male workmen of the respective classes and ages mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall be not less than wages at the respective rates specified in column 4 of that Schedule for the hours specified in column 5 thereof.

2. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall be not less than the amount

specified in column 4 of the said Schedule, and applicable to that workman, notwithstanding that those hours are less than the hours specified in column 5 and applicable to him.

3. The differential rates for overtime employment in each area described in column 1 of the Schedule hereto of male workmen of the respective classes and ages mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of that Schedule shall be the rates specified in column 6 thereof.

4. For the purpose of the above rates overtime employment shall mean (a) in the case of each of the said areas and of workmen of each of the said classes and ages such employment as is described in column 7 of the Schedule of this Order; (b) in the case of all the said areas and workmen of all the said classes and ages all employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman.

5. In the said Schedule the expression "employment in summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

6. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

RATES OF WAGES IN FORCE FOR TEAMSMEN,
SHEPHERDS, COWMEN, SHEEP-TENDERS, AND
BULLOCK-TENDERS IN NORFOLK.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give Notice, as required by the above Act, that they propose to make an Order, to come into operation on the first Monday in October, 1919, to the following effect as regards male workers of 18 years of age and over employed in agriculture in the area comprising the administrative County of Norfolk, and the County Boroughs of Norwich and Great Yarmouth, that is to say:—

(1) The wages payable for employment of male workmen of 18 years of age and over in agriculture shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates for 50 hours in summer and 48 hours in winter:—

(a) For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 33s.

(b) For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 34s.

(c) For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 35s.

(d) For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 36s. 6d.

(2) Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall be not less than the amount specified in Clause (1) above and applicable to that workman, notwithstanding that those hours are less than 50 in summer or 48 in winter.

(3) The differential rates for overtime employment shall be as follows:—

(a) For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 9d. weekdays, 11d. Sundays.

(b) For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9½d. weekdays, 11½d. Sundays.

(c) For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 9½d. weekdays, 11½d. Sundays.

(d) For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 10d. weekdays, 1s. Sundays.

(4) For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between employer and the workmen, except time spent on such day by Teamsmen, Cowmen or Shepherds, or Sheep-tenders or Bullock-tenders in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock.

(c) All employment in any week (excluding Sundays) in excess of 50 hours in summer or of 48 hours in winter.

(5) Provided that in the case of workmen who are employed wholly or mainly as Teamsmen, Cowmen or Shepherds, or as Sheep-tenders or Bullock-tenders no employment in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking-out of stock, or other similar duties in

connection with the immediate care of animals shall rank as overtime employment, but in lieu of the differential rates for overtime employment above set out an additional and inclusive weekly sum of 7s. in the case of Teamsmen, Cowmen or Shepherds, and 6s. in the case of Sheep-tenders or Bullock-tenders, shall be paid to each workman so employed in respect of his employment in connection with the duties specified in this clause.

(7) Nothing in Clause (5) above shall take away from a workman his right to be paid at not less than the differential rates for overtime set out in Clause (3) above in respect of all overtime employment other than overtime employment in connection with the duties mentioned in Clause (5).

(8) For the purpose of the above rates the expression "employment in summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

(9) For the purposes of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(10) This Order shall apply to all male workers of the age of 18 years and upwards who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in the above-mentioned area during such time as they are so employed.

(3) The differential rates for overtime employment shall be as follows:—

(a) For workmen of 18 and under 19 years of age, 9d. week-days, 11d. Sundays.

(b) For workmen of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9½d. week-days, 11½d. Sundays.

(c) For workmen of 20 and under 21 years of age, 9½d. week-days, 11½d. Sundays.

(d) For workmen of 21 years of age and over, 10d. week-days, 1s. Sundays.

(4) For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment:—

(a) All employment on a Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 6½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the workman, except time spent on such day by horsemen, stockmen or shepherds in connection with the feeding and cleaning of stock.

(c) All employment in any week (excluding Sundays) in excess of 50 hours in summer or of 48 hours in winter.

(5) Provided that in the case of workmen who are employed wholly or mainly as Horsemen, Stockmen or Shepherds no employment in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding-down and mucking-out of stock, or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals, shall rank as overtime employment, but in lieu of the differential rates for overtime employment above set out an additional and inclusive weekly sum of 7s. shall be paid to each workman so employed in respect of his employment in connection with the duties specified in this clause.

(6) Nothing in Clause (5) above shall take away from a workman his right to be paid at not less than the differential rates for overtime set out in Clause (3) above in re-

spect of all overtime employment other than overtime employment in connection with the duties mentioned in Clause (5).

(7) For the purpose of the above rates the expression "employment in summer" shall mean employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the last Sunday in October, and the expression "employment in winter" shall mean employment during the rest of the year.

(8) For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(9) For the purpose of this Order a Shepherd is defined to be a workman whose whole time is occupied in looking after a flock of breeding sheep.

(10) This Order shall apply to all male workers of the age of 18 years and upwards who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in the above-mentioned area during such time as they are so employed.

GENERAL INFORMATION WITH REGARD TO WIRELESS TIME SIGNALS.

Former Notice.—No. 691 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

The accompanying list of wireless time signals is intended to provide, in a form suitable to give all information required by the wireless operator, a complete and up-to-date list of all time signals issued by wireless stations throughout the world. The details showing the method of transmission of any given time signal will be found in the "Admiralty List of Lights and Time Signals" or in the "International List of Radiotelegraph Stations" (The Berne List).

The times given in the 4th column of the list are expressed in the 4-figure notation employed for signalling during the war. The term "G.M.T." here means the civil mean time of the meridian of Greenwich, with the day commencing at midnight and the hours reckoned from 00 to 23. Where two times are joined by a hyphen, the times denote respectively the beginning and end of the signal.

Most of the wireless time signals at present transmitted are sent by means of an automatic arrangement operated by the pendulum of a chronometer situated at some observatory. In such cases absolute reliance may be placed upon the accuracy of the signal. There are, however, many stations in the world which are very suitably situated for transmitting time signals to ships which could otherwise not receive them, where it would be very difficult or impossible to establish an automatic system. In such cases "hand" signals may be provided; but in general these signals should not be trusted to be accurate within closer limits than about two seconds.

It is hoped that all wireless time signals will eventually be standardised, so that there shall be only two kinds of signals transmitted, the automatic signals being all alike and quite distinctive from the hand signals. It is further expected that arrangements will be made for all time signals to be transmitted at times so selected that a ship with only one wireless operator will be able to read them. A similar scheme for wireless weather bulletins is being evolved.
