

commended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaonries of Gloucester and Cirencester are desirable and should be carried into effect; and secondly, that in the event of such arrangements being effected a change in the name of the said Archdeaconry of Cirencester is also desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may properly be carried into effect.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the Rural Deaneries of Cheltenham and Tetbury, in the said Archdeaconry of Gloucester, shall be transferred from such Archdeaconry and shall be included in the said Archdeaconry of Cirencester and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Archdeacon of such Archdeaconry, and secondly, the name of the said Archdeaconry of Cirencester, shall be altered so that such Archdeaconry shall henceforth be called 'The Archdeaconry of Cheltenham.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas notices of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Archdeacons affected by the Scheme, that is to say, the Archdeacon of Gloucester and the Archdeacon of Cirencester, and they have severally expressed their approval of the same:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 3rd day of July, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parish of Saint Mary Newington, in the County of Surrey, now vested in us:

"Whereas under and by virtue of the two Indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, the lands tenements and hereditaments situate in the Parish of Saint Mary Newington aforesaid, and particularly described in the same Indentures and Schedule became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us:

"And whereas none of the said lands tenements and hereditaments are subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands tenements and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands tenements and hereditaments, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by Instrument or Instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands tenements and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said Indentures, or either of them, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable. it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other Public Securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.
