At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 8th day of August, 1919.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue

Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

- (1) That the following headings should be deleted:—
 - (A) Calves' stomachs;

Forage and food which may be used for animals, the following:

(A) Cakes and meals, the following: Biscuit meal;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:

(A) Egg, yolk and liquid;

(A) Meat of all kinds, except tinned, potted and turtle meat;

(A) Rennet powder, rennet extract and other preparations of rennet;

Silk and silk manufactures, the following: (A) Silk, raw, thrown and waste.

(2) That the following heading should be added:-

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:

(A) Meat of all kinds, except turtle meat and except potted or tinned meat other than tinned bacon and tinned ham.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

FINANCE ACT, 1919.

IMPERIAL PREFERENCE.

Order relating to Sugar and Tobacco.

In pursuance of Section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919, the Board of Trade, being satisfied that Refined Sugar, Molasses and Extracts from Sugar, and Manufactured Tobacco are to a considerable extent manufactured in the British Empire from material not wholly grown or produced within the Empire, hereby order that the preferential rates of customs duty shall, in the case of Refined Sugar, Molasses and Extracts from Sugar, and Manufactured Tobacco, be charged only in respect of such proportion of those goods as corresponds to the proportion of dutiable material used in their manufacture which is shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to have been grown or produced in the Empire.

FINANCE ACT, 1919.

IMPERIAL PREFERENCE.

Regulations as to the Proportion of Value resulting from Labour within the British Empire.

In pursuance of Section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919, the Board of Trade hereby make the following regulations:—

(1) Save as hereinafter provided goods shall not be deemed for the purposes of Section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919, to have been manufactured in the British Empire unless at least 25 per cent. of their total value is the result of labour within the British Empire.

(2) In the case of those classes of those goods in respect of which an Order has been made by the Board of Trade under Section 8, sub-section (2) of the Finance Act, 1919, no part of the goods shall be deemed to have been manufactured in the British Empire unless at least 5 per cent. of the total value of the goods is the result of labour within the British Empire.

(3) Where a number of separate articles are included in one parcel or shipment, each and every article shall be considered separately for the purpose of calculating the proportion of value due to labour within the Empire.

(4) For the purposes of these regulations the total value of an article shall be its cost to the manufacturer at the factory or works, and shall include the value of containers and other forms of interior packing ordinarily sold with the article when it is sold retail, but shall not include the manufacturer's or exporter's profit or the cost of exterior packing, carriage to port and other charges incidental to the export of the goods subsequent to their manufacture.

(5) In calculating the proportion of value which is the result of labour within the British Empire there may be included under the head of labour the cost to the manufacturer of any materials of purely Empire origin entering into the composition of the article (including the interior packing specified in Regulation (4)), the cost of manufacture including wages, proportion of fuel, supervision and other factory expenses, and the cost of the labour of packing for retail sale.

The following may not be included in the proportion of value which is the result of Empire labour, namely, any materials or interior packings not entirely of Empire origin, manufacturer's profit or the profit or remuneration of any trader, agent, broker or other per-

son dealing in the article in its finished condition, the expenses of placing the goods in outside packages for export and the cost of such packages, transportation charges, insurance and any other charges for services after the goods leave the place of production or manufacture.

(6) Any question arising on the interpretation of these regulations shall be referred to the Board of Trade, whose decision shall be final.

TRADING WITH HUNGARY.

GENERAL LICENCE.

The Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons and bodies of persons resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in Hungary:

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any transaction under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the United Kingdom or in respect of any remittance of money out of the United Kingdom covered by Regulation 41 D of the Defence of the Realm Regulations is first obtained:

Provided also that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay to or for the benefit of any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in Hungary any sum of money which by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914 and 1915, or either of them, is required to be paid to the Custodian appointed under the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914, but such sums of money must be paid to the said Custodian:

Provided further that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay or deliver any sum of money or property which is or but for the war would have been due or deliverable to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in Hungary in respect of a transaction entered into before the outbreak of war.

TAILORING TRADE BOARD.

(GREAT BRITAIN.)

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act for certain branches of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by

male persons as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 10th January, 1914, hereby give notice as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time Rates for female workers other than female cutters, trimmers, and fitters-up, from 5d. to 8½d. per hour, with variations in the rates fixed for learners, and to vary the Minimum Rate fixed for female cutters, trimmers, and fitters-up of 20 years of age and over from 6d. to 9½d. per hour, with variations in the rates fixed for younger workers.

The Trade Board also propose to fix a piecework basis time rate for female workers of 9½d.

The Trade Board give similar notice that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time Rate fixed for male workers other than learners as follows:—

A. Cutters, Knifemen, Tailors, Fittersnp, Passers, Pressers, and Machinists from 8d. to 1s. 5d. per hour.

B. Hand Pressers and Plain Machinists from 8d. to 1s. 3d. per hour.

C. All other male workers (other than learners) from 8d. to 1s. 1d. per hour.

learners) from 8d. to 1s. 1d. per hour. Variations are also proposed in the General Minimum Time Rates fixed for younger male workers.

The Trade Board propose to fix a piece work basis time rate for male workers of 1½d. per hour above the General Minimum Time Rates set out above for male workers.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to vary and fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 2nd August, 1919. Such objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, W.C. 2, from whom full particulars of the Board's proposals may be obtained.

CHAIN TRADE.

HAND-HAMMERED SECTION.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act for the Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-making Trade, hereby give Notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary the General Minimum Time Rates for Hand-Hammered Chain-making as follows, the minimum rates to be operative from the date on which they become effective until the 21st March, 1920: By increasing the minimum or lowest time-rate for making from iron supplied by the employer Hand-Hammered Chain up to and including 11-32 inch:—

Where the employer provides (in addition to the iron) the workshop where the work is

carried on and tools and the fuel, from 4d. per hour to $7\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

Where the worker provides (in respect of iron provided by the employer) the workshop where the work is carried on and the tools and fuel or any one of these heads of outlay, from 5½d. per hour to 10d. per hour (free and clear of all deductions).

The latter variation is proposed on the basis that any carriage to or from the premises of the employer is performed by the worker, or that if performed by the employer, the latter is entitled to receive 2d. per cwt. either way.

Variations are also proposed in the General Minimum Time Rates fixed for learners.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the General Minimum Piece Rates for making Hand-Hammered Chain by the addition of sums varying from 77-98 per cent. to the rates set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board on 1st March, 1918.

On application to the Trade Board further information will be given as to the variations proposed, if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposals to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 2nd August, 1919. The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The requirements imposed by the London, Middlesex and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2), that (subject to certain exceptions) a dog shall be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment whilst in or on any public place in the Area to which that Order for the time being applies, shall not apply to a dog whilst in or on any public place in any of the boroughs or parishes specified in the Schedule hereto, unless the dog is being moved temporarily for the purpose of exercise from some part of the said Area to which this Order does not apply.
- 2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of August, nineteen hundred and nineteen.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the London, Middlesex and District (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 8).

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND AUGUST 1919.)

WARWICKSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are

therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:

- (i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the
- (ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

- 3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:
 - (a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the notice, dogs on such premises;

or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure:

or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises . to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access ;

and if any occupier after service of any such notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local

Authority.

(4.) A copy of every notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority. Offences.

- 5.-(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act,
- (2.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the WARWICK-(FOOT-AND-MOUTE AND District DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement of Animals into certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Warwickshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway from outside the Scheduled District described in the Schedule to that Order to a railway station situate within any borough mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within the same borough if accompanied by a movement licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

2.—(1) The movement of an animal with a movement licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained, and shall be slaughtered within four days of its arrival thereat.

(ii) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a licence under this Order.

- (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.
- (2) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by a notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

- 4.—(1) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority. produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of August nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Amendment of Rabies Order of 1919.

1. The Rabies Order of 1919 shall be read and have effect as if after Article 1 the following Article were there inserted:-

Isolation of Dogs and Cats pending Slaughter or Veterinary Inquiry.

- 1a.—(1) Every person who shall have given notice under the preceding Article that a dog or cat in his possession or under his charge is affected with or suspected of rabies shall forthwith-
 - (a) detain and isolate the dog or cat in a kennel, shed or other building, and shall not permit any other animal to come in contact therewith, until the Authority shall either cause the dog or cat to be slaughtered or notify the person that as a result of the inquiry made under Article 5 it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Local Authority that the dog or cat was not affected with rabies;
 - (b) detain and isolate in a kennel, shed or other building any dog or cat which has been in the same kennel, shed or building or otherwise in contact with the dog or cat to which the notice of disease related, until the Local Authority shall either cause a notice to be served under Article 7 in respect of the dog or cat so detained and isolated, or notify the person that as a result of the inquiry made under Article 5 it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Local Authority that the dog or cat to which the notice of disease related was not affected with rabies.
- 2) Nothing in this Article shall prevent the owner from slaughtering at any time any dog or cat to which this Article relates.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of August, nineteen hundred and nineteen.



The provisions of the Sheep-Dipping (North Wales) Order of 1915, as amended by the Sheep-Dipping (North Wales) Order of 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders "), shall, in their application to the area described in the Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Double Dipping Area "), be modified in the manner provided in

Double Dipping in Double Dipping Area from 1st September to 15th October, and before exposure at markets.

2. The provisions of the existing Orders which prescribe the general dipping of sheep, and which impose restrictions on the exposure of sheep at any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition during the prescribed dipping period, shall, in their application to the Double Dipping Area, be read and have effect as if the words, "dipped twice with an interval of not less than seven days between the dippings," were substituted for the word "dipped."

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Double Dipping Area from 1st September to 15th October.

3. The restrictions on the movement of sheep out of the Dipping Area imposed by the existing Orders shall apply to the movement of sheep out of the Double Dipping Area, and the requirement of dipping imposed as a condition precedent to the granting of a licence authorising such movement shall have effect as if it referred to double dipping within an interval of not less than seven days between the dippings.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped as Required by this Order.

4. Where any Notice (Form E.) is served under Article 11 of the Sheep Dipping (North Wales) Order of 1915, in respect of sheep in the Double Dipping Area, the dipping required by the Notice shall be a double dipping with an interval of not less than seven days between the dippings.

· Farms on Borders of Double Dipping Area.

5. Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside the Double Dipping Area the whole farm or holding, and the sheep thereon, shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Area.

Short Title, etc.

6. This Order may be cited as the Sheep Scab (North Wales Double Dipping Area) Order of 1919, and shall be read with the existing Orders.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of Scheduled Area.

2.—No dog shall be moved out of the area described in the Schedule hereto unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement and signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to:-(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or (b) the movement of a dog through such area by railway from a place outside the area to another place outside the area without unnecessary delay and without being rebooked within the area.

Control and Muzzling of Dogs in Scheduled Area.

- 3.—(1) A dog in the Area described in the Schedule hereto shall at all times
 - (a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle, and shall also be led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment: Provided that the requirement as to leading shall not apply to a dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep;
 - (b) whilst in or on any other place be-(i) confined in a kennel or other en-
 - closure from which the dog escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar

and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle:

Provided that paragraph (b) shall not apply to any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants or to any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for the capture or destruction of vermin or rabbits.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or

(3) Article 4 (Control of Doys in Scheduled Districts) of the Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 5), hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," shall not apply to the Area described in the Schedule to this Order.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

4.—(1) Any dog found in or on any public place in the area described in the Schedule hereto, in respect of which the provisions of this Order as to control or muzzling are not being complied with, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority in the manner directed by Article 5 of the principal Order (Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs), which Article shall apply accordingly.
(2) Articles 2 and 3 of the principal Order

shall apply to dogs moved in contravention of

this Order.

Offences.

5.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 1 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any dog is not kept under control in manner prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases

of Animals Act, 1894.

1. A port, harbour, creek or dock wholly or partly situate in or adjoining an area or district out of which the movement of dogs is prohibited by an Order made by the Board under the said Acts, shall for the purposes of such Order be deemed to be wholly excepted from the area or district.

Restriction of Landing of Dogs.

- 2.—(1) The provisions of this Article shall apply to any dog which at any time within the last preceding six months has been on board a vessel in any port, harbour, creek or dock to which Article 1 of this Order applies.
- (2) A dog to which this Article applies shall not be landed from any vessel at any place which is not within an area or district out of which the movement of dogs is prohibited by an Order made by the Board under the said Acts.
- (3) A dog to which this Article applies shall at all times while on board a vessel in any port, harbour, creek or dock in Great Britain be
 - (a) secured to some part of the vessel or led by a collar and chain, and muzzled with a wire cage muzzle so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while wearing the same to bite any person or animal but not so as to prevent such animal from breathing freely or lapping water; or
 - (b) confined in an enclosed part of the vessel from which the dog cannot escape
- (4) If any dog to which this Article applies shall die, or be lost from a vessel, in any port in Great Britain, the person in charge of the dog shall forthwith give notice of such death or loss to the Board.

Offences.

3. If a dog is landed in contravention of this Order or is not secured or confined as required by this Order, the owner or person in charge of the dog, and the master of the vessel from which the dog is so landed, or on which the dog is not so secured or confined, shall, each according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of August, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-one ("The Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850"), of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, and of the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen ("The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868 "), do out of the moneys which have been paid over to us by the Dean and Canons of the Cathedral Church in Manchester, under the provisions of the hereinbefore first-mentioned Act, hereby grant to the respective Incumbents for the time being of the several benefices situate within the original limits of the Parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, which are named in the first column of the First and Second Schedules hereunto annexed, the several sums, the amounts of which are set opposite to the names of such benefices in the second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth columns of the First Schedule, and the second column of the Second Schedule, the said sums to be payable for and in respect of the year ending the first day of May in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty, the sums specified in the second, third, fifth and sixth columns of the First Schedule, and in the second column of the Second Schedule, to be receivable by the respective Incumbents in equal quarterly portions on the first day of August, the first day of November, the first day of February, and the first day of May now next ensuing, and the sums specified in the fourth column of the First Schedule to be receivable by the respective Incumbents on the first day of May now next ensuing, but nevertheless to be deemed to ac-

crue from day to day, and to be apportionable accordingly. Provided always, that the sum specified in the second column of the said First Schedule shall be taken and received by the several Incumbents to whom the same are hereby made respectively payable in the substi-tution for and not as additional to any grants, which Instruments heretofore sealed by us have purported to charge permanently on the capitular revenues of Manchester other than by way of relief to our Common Fund under the thirteenth section of the Act firstly hereinbefore recited: Provided also that every sum specified in the fourth column of the said First Schedule shall be payable only on the production to us, on or after the said first day of May now next ensuing, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of Manchester that the Incumbent has complied with the Bishop's requirements as to residence: Provided also that every sum specified in the fifth column of the said First Schedule shall be payable only upon the production to us, or on after each of the four above-mentioned days, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of Manchester that with his licence or permission an Assistant Curate has been employed within the Parish during the quarter of the year then ended, and that such Assistant Curate is in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided lastly, that of the sums specified in the second column of the said Second Schedule proportionate parts only shall be payable in the event of the pensions now charged on the said benefices respectively in favour of retired Incumbents ceasing or being reduced before the first day of May next ensuing.

THE STEYNING WEST RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

W HEREAS the Rural District Council of Steyning West have applied to the Local Government Board to declare Section 19 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force in the contributory place of Lancing, within the Rural District of Steyning West.

And whereas proof having been given to the satisfaction of the Minister of Health of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of Section 3 of the said Act, the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers given to him in that behalf, has made an Order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of July, 1919, whereby he declared, specified and directed:—
