A PROCLAMATION

For Apprehending and Securing the Person of Robert Fielding.

WILLIAM R.

WHEREAS His Majesty hath Received Information, That Robert Fielding did, on the Eleventh Day of this Instant January, Challenge, and in a Violent manner Assault and dangerously Wound Sir Henry Dutton Colt, One of His Majesties Justices of the Peace for the County of Middlesex, for doing his Duty in the Execution of his said Office of Justice of Peace, and that he the said Robert Fielding hath since withdrawn himself from his usual Place of Abode, and is fled from Justice; His Majesty therefore being Resolved to Protect all His Officers and Ministers, in the Execution of Publick Justice, from all Insolencies and Affronts that shall be offered to them by any Ill disposed Persons, and that all such Offenders should be Punished according to their Demerits, and the utmost Severity of the Law, hath thought fit, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to Issue this His Royal Proclamation, hereby Commanding and Requiring all His Loving Subjects to Discover and Apprehend the said Robert Fielding where ever he may be found, and to Carry him before some Justice of the Peace, or Chief Magistrate of the County, Town or Place where he shall be Apprehended, who is hereby Required to Secure him, and thereof give Speedy Notice to His Majesty's Privy Council, or One of His Principal Secretaries of State. And for the Encouragement of all Persons to be Diligent and Careful in endeavouring to Discover and Apprehend the said Robert Fielding, His Majesty doth hereby Declare, That whosoever shall Discover and Apprehend the said Robert Fielding, and shall bring him before some Justice of the Peace or Chief Magistrate, as aforesaid, shall Have and Receive as a Reward the Sum of Two hundred Pounds; which said Sum of Two hundred Pounds shall be forthwith Paid to him or them by the Commissioners of Our Treasury for the time being, who are hereby Authorized and Required to Pay the same accordingly. And His Majesty doth hereby justly Charge and Command all His Loving Subjects, as they will Answer the contrary at their Perils, that they do not any ways Conceal, but do Discover the said Robert Fielding, to the End he may be Secured and Proceeded against according to Law.

Given at Our Court at Kensington, the Sixteenth Day of January, 1695. In the Seventh Year of Our Reign.

Rome, Dec. 31. Such of the last promoted Cardinals as are now in this City, being 7 in number, have received and paid the usual Compliments; There are two Caps still undisposed of; and 'tis believed, they are designed by the Pope for Don Livio Odescabaldi, Nephew to Pope Innocent XI, and for Pignatelli, Archbishop of Trent, which latter is earnestly Recommended by the Spanish Ambassador. The Pope has given Orders for putting his Gallies in a readiness to return to the Levant early in the Spring.

Genova, Jan. 1. A Vessel arrived here this Week from Provence, the Master whereof says, the French are very busie in fitting out their Fleet at Thoulon. The French have several Privateers in these Seas.

Milan, Jan. 2. Recruits arrive daily from Suifferland and Germany, for the German Regiments, and those in the Service of this State. They prepare here a very fine Train of Artillery for the Service of the next Campagne. Our Governor went the last Week to Turin to adjust some Matters with the Duke of Savoy relating to the War, and is expected back in 2 or 3 days.

Venice, Jan. 6. Several Companies of new raised Soldiers are come hither this Week, and others are daily expected, who will be sent with the next Convoy to the Levant. The new Ships and Gallies that are fitting in this Arsenal may be ready to Sail by the beginning of March, and 'tis hoped the Men of War that lately arrived here from the Levant to repair the damage they sustained in the last Fight with the Turks, will be in a Condition to return thither by that time. We have Advice from Barbary, That as well the Tripolins, as the Government of Argiers, are fitting out a Squadron of Ships to joyn the Ottoman Fleet the next Summer, according to the Directions they have received from the Ottoman Port for that purpose.

Vienna, Jan. 7. Several Officers who lately arrived here from Hungary, (where their Troops are in Winter-quarters) are gone to raise Recruits in the Hereditary Countries, and in Germany, being all Commanded to have their Troops compleat by the beginning of April. The Letters from Peter Waradin of the 26th past, say, a Party of that Garrison had been as far as the Save, and had brought back some Pri-
