#### TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board established under that Act for certain branches of the Machine-made Lace and Net Finishing Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade, and dated 16th March, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they propose to vary the following General Minimum Piece Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedules of their Notices dated 13th August, 1917, and 2nd May, 1919.
