Dublin, January 20.

THE Weather has been of late very Tempestuous. The last Letters from *Kinsale* and other Ports of this Kingdom bring no News:

Falmouth, January 20. The Spanish Alliance Pacquet Boat, Captain *Hutchins* Commander, failed this afternoon for the *Groyné*, the Wind being at N. W. We have an account that several empty Casks, and some with Oil in them, are driven ashore in *Mounts Bay*, which 'tis thought belonged to some Vessel that has been cast away in the late bad Weather near that place.

Plymouth, Jan. 21. The *Lenox*, *Ruby Prize*, and *Africa*, failed from hence yesterday to the Eastward, having under their Convoy, the *Fir-Tree*, *Richard Newman* Master, and the *Hope*, *Aron Everden*, both laden with Maits from *New England*; As also the *Virginia*, *Edward Whitaker* Master, from *Virginia*, and bound to *London*, with several Coasters and other small Vessels.

Barnstaple, Jan. 21. On Sunday last, by the violence of the Weather, was driven ashore near our Bar, a Portuguesè Ship of about 100 Tuns, bound from *O Porto* to *Amsterdam*,

and laden with Wine, Sugar, and Oranges; all the Men and her Lading are saved, but the Ship coming ashore at High-Water will hardly be got off. The same day came over our Bar a Pink from the *West Indies*, laden with Cotton, Indico, &c. and bound to *London*.

Newcastle, Jan. 21. His Majesty's Ship the *Winchelsea* failed hence yesterday in the Evening with a Fleet of sixty laden Colliers, the Wind at W. N. W. which is since come about to the N. W. The *Smeepstakes* will fail in few days.

Chester, Jan. 22. The *Monmouth* Yacht arrived in *Hightlake* on Monday last from *Dublin*, having been in a violent Storm the day before.

Bristol, Jan. 22. On the 20th arrived here the *Gift* of this place from *Malaga*, but last from *Lisbon*, whence she came under Convoy of the *Carlisle* Frigat. Yesterday came in the *Greyhound* in 18 days from *St. Lucar*; As also the *Eleanor* Sloop from *Cadiz*, and the *Mary* from *Cork*, who came last from *Milford*, under Convoy of the *Tyger* Frigat, who is now in *Kings-Road*, with the *Smirna* Merchant Man of War. This day came in Captain *Williams* in a Sloop from *Tinby*, which place he left yesterday; He says they have had véry Stormy Weather on that Coast; That several Ships have been lost, and two near *Milford*; And that at his coming away, they had

an account, that two French Privateers, carrying 20 and 12 Guns, were cast away on the Welsh Coast to the Eastward of *Swansey*; The 2 Commanders, with only 6 or 7 Men being Saved; There was in their Company a third Privateer of 40 Guns, which was in great distress when they parted from him. A small Vessel called the *True Love* is just now come in here from *Wexford*.

Yarmouth, Jan. 22. This afternoon came into our Road several laden Colliers. The *Rupert Prize* is still here.

Yarmouth, Jan. 24. The *Rupert Prize* failed this day with several Vessels for *Lime*.

Cowes, Jan. 22. Yesterday came into this Road from Cruising, *The Young de Ruyter* of *Flushing*, *John de Rutter* Commander; And this day a *Guernsey* Privateer, Captain *Teoper* Commander, from *Southampton*.

Portsmouth, January 24. The *Northumberland* failed the 22th out of this Harbour to *Spithead*; And yesterday came in the *Lenox* from the Westward, the Merchant Ships under her Convoy being gone on to the *Downes*. The *Prince George* failed this day out of this Harbour to *Spithead*.

Deale, January 24. Yesterday came into the *Downes* the *Ruby Prize* from the Westward; And His Majesty's Ship the *Severne* failed for the River. The *Charles Galley* and *Soldadoes* went out this morning; And the *Africa* is come in with two Mast Ships from *New England*, and several other Vessels, the Wind at West by North.

Deale, January 25. The *Crescent* Fire-Ship failed this morning for the River; and the *Carlisle* will fail to morrow. The *Charles Galley* and *Soldadoes* are returned from the Westward, the Wind blowing very hard at W. N. W.
