tively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the Principal Outer Door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union, and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only":

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provi-

sions of the said Act, hath duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 11th day of November, 1918, in the words following:—

“We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“That the Right Reverend Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the vicarage of Vernham Dean and the Rectory of Linkenholt, both in the County of Southampton having represented unto us that the said Benefices are contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That your Grace as such Archbishop as aforesaid is the Patron of the said Vicarage of Kings Langley, and I, as such Bishop as aforesaid am the Patron of the said Vicarage of Abbots Langley:

"That the Reverend Canon Arthur Henry Parnell is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Abbots Langley, and the Reverend John Parker Haythornthwaite is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Kings Langley:

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.
