I. If steerage passengers, through no default of their own, are not received on board on the day named in their contract tickets or fail to obtain a passage in the ship, they should apply to the Emigration Officer at the port, who will assist in obtaining redress under the Merchant Shipping Acts.

2. Steerage passengers should carefully keep this part of their contract ticket till after the end of the vovage

This contract ticket is exempt from stamp duty.
