

gat, and a Suedish Ship, called the *Elizabeth* of *Stade*, are still in *Portland Road*.

Bristol, Jan. 25. The 23th instant in the evening, the *Russell* Frigate of *London*, *James Peacock* Commander, Burthen about 250 Tuns, laden chiefly with Oil from *Gilipoli*, being put into our Channel by stress of Weather, was unfortunately lost on a Sand called the *Welsh Hook*; all the Men are saved, but the Vessel is by this time Staved in pieces. The *Smirna* and *Tyger*, two Men of War, are now in *Kings Road*, but intend to sail with the first fair Weather.

Hull, January 27. There are now in *Humber* three of His Majesty's Frigats, the *Garland*, *Assistance*, and *Winchelsea*, with a Fleet of laden Ships bound to *London*, which will sail with the first fair Wind and Weather.

Yarmouth, Jan. 27. The *Rupert* Prize which sailed out of this Road for *Lyme*, was put back on *Friday* last, but Sailed again on *Sunday*. The same day came into our Road the *Centurion* Frigate from *Scotland*; She had under her Convoy five Ships with Recruits for *Flanders*; Three of which are come in with the Convoy, the other Two being separated from them.

Corves, January 27. On Thursday last came in here from *Spithead*, two Offend Privateers. Yesterday the Weather was very Tempestuous; but we hear of no damage, only a small Hoy in this Harbour was driven from her Anchor. The *James* and *Elizabeth*, *William Cleves* Master, and the *Keyner*, *John Munday*, are come into this Road both from *Weymouth*, and bound to *Virginia*. The *Greyhound* and *Quaker* Ketch are now passing by for *Spithead*.

Portsmouth, January 28. The *Greyhound* Frigate came in here yesterday from the Westward. The outward bound Ships continue at *Spithead*.

Dorset, Jan. 28. The *Woolwich* is coming into the *Downes* from the River, whither the *Carlisle* sailed yesterday.

London, January 29. On Monday last His Majesty's Ship the *Sovereign*, which was laid up at *Greenwich*, (having nothing on Board) not being in a Condition for the Sea by reason of her Defects, took Fire between 5 and 6 in the morning, by some light, as we are informed, which was carelessly left upon her Middle Gun-Deck by one of the Seamen belonging to her. The Flames broke out with such violence, that 'twas impossible to prevent her being Burnt; but by the Care that was taken, there hap-

pened no Damage to the other Ships that lay near her.
