THE MOST EXCELLENT ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

Notice is hereby given that no individual may concurrently hold appointments to both the Military and Civil Divisions of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire.

(1) In any case in which an individual holding an appointment in one of the Classes of a Division is promoted to a higher Class in the other Division, such promotion is to be regarded as a transfer, and the original appointment consequently lapses; but the date of such original appointment is recorded in the Chancery of the Order. In such a case, in accordance with the Statutes of the Order, the Insignia of the lower Class from which transfer has been made on promotion shall be returned to the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood.

(2) In any case in which an individual holding an appointment in one of the Classes of a

Division is appointed to the same Class of the other Division, such appointment shall be regarded as a transfer from one Division to the other, the date of the transfer being recorded in the Chancery of the Order, but without affecting the date of the original appointment to the Order. In such a case the individual so transferred should have the ribbon of his Insignia altered, the cost of which will be met free of charge to the following extent:—

(3) No transfer from the Civil to the Military Division is permissible unless the individual to be transferred is eligible for appointment to the Military Division under Clause 5 of the Statutes of the Order.

The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

WHEREAS We have taken into Our Royal consideration the faithful and devoted service rendered by members of the Special Constabulary during the War:

And whereas we are desirous of distinguishing such service by some mark of Our Royal Favour and also of providing a means of recognising continued and efficient service which may be rendered in the future by members of any Special Constabulary Reserve hereafter constituted:

We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded for such service as aforesaid.

I. It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Special Constabulary Medal."

II. It is ordained that the Special Constabulary Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Silver with Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse an appropriate design or inscription, and shall bear on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal is awarded.

III. It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who being or having been members of the Special Constabulary during the War or of any Special Constabulary Reserve shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:—

(1) Shall have served as a Special Constable without pay during the War for not less than three years, and shall during that period have performed not less than 150 police duties; or

(2) Shall have served in a Special Constabulary Reserve for not less than nine years, and shall have (a) taken an approved course of training in Police duty, (b) voluntarily performed such actual police duty as may be required by the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with any general regulations made by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, (c) been annually certified as efficient by the Chief Officer of Police.

Provided that in the case of a man who has served both in the Special Constabulary during the War and in a Special Constabulary Reserve, one year of service during the War (with not less than 50 police duties in such year) shall be reckoned as equivalent to three years' efficient service in the Reserve, and less periods in the same proportion.

IV. It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, and that the names of the persons to be so recommended to Us shall be submitted to Our said Secretary of State by the Chief Officer of Police under whom such persons have served.

V. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a

riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one-third of the whole) shall be red, while the remaining parts shall each have three longitudinal stripes of equal width, the central stripe being black and the other two white; and further that in the case of those to whom the Medal is awarded for service during the War a bar or clasp shall be attached to the riband; bearing the words "The Great War, 1914-1918."

VI. It is ordained that if any person to whom this Medal is awarded shall be guilty of any crime or disgraceful conduct which in Our judgment disqualifies him for the same, his Medal shall, by an Order of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, be forfeited and the name of such person shall be erased from the record of those to whom the Medal shall have been awarded. It is hereby further declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be the sole judges of the circumstances demanding such forfeiture, and that every person whose Medal shall be so forfeited shall on being required so to do by Our said Secretary of State deliver up his Medal to such person as Our said Secretary of State may direct.

VII. Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department is hereby authorized to make such regulations as may be necessary for the better carrying out of this Our Warrant.

BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of *Lionel Max Ettlinger*.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied as the result of an enquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee that *Lionel Max Ettlinger*, to whom a certificate of naturalization, numbered 16,385, was granted on the 18th October, 1906, has shown himself by act or speech to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty.

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certifi-

cate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

MUNITIONS OF WAR ACTS, 1915 TO 1917.

CONTROLLED ESTABLISHMENTS.

THE MUNITIONS (ORDERING OF WORK IN ADMIRALTY ESTABLISHMENTS) REGULATIONS, 1919, DATED THE FOURTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1919, MADE BY THE ADMIRALTY IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 4 (5) OF THE MUNITIONS OF WAR ACT, 1915 (5 & 6 GEO. 5, c. 54), AND OF SECTION 20 OF THE MUNITIONS OF WAR (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1916 (5 & 6 GEO. 5, c. 99).

Whereas in pursuance of section 20 of the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, the Minister of Munitions has made an arrangement with the Admiralty for the exercise by the Admiralty of the power conferred on the Minister by section 4, sub-section (5) of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, of making regulations with respect to the general ordering of work in any shipbuilding or ship-repairing yard or marine engineering or other Admiralty Establishment being a Controlled Establishment.

Now therefore the Admiralty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by section 4, sub-section (5), of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and the said arrangement and of all other powers them thereunto enabling make the following Regulations:—

1. The Munitions (Ordering of Work in Admiralty Establishments) Regulations, 1918, as amended by Order dated October 2nd, 1918, made by the Admiralty pursuant to the said sections of the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 to 1917, are hereby revoked.

This Regulation may be cited as the Munitions (Ordering of Work in Admiralty Estab-

ishments) Regulation, 1919, and shall come into force on the fifth day of September, 1919.

THE MUNITIONS (ORDERING OF WORK) REGULATION, 1919, DATED THE FOURTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1919, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF MUNITIONS, IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 4 (5) OF THE MUNITIONS OF WAR ACT, 1915 (5 & 6 GEO. 5, c. 54).

Whereas the Minister of Munitions, in pursuance of Section 4 (5) of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, made the Munitions (Ordering of Work) Regulations, 1916, and the Munitions (Ordering of Work) Amendment Regulation of 1916, and an Order of the 3rd day of July, 1917, made in pursuance of the last-named Regulation. And whereas the said Minister, in pursuance of Section 20 of the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, made an arrangement with the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty for the exercise by them (*inter alia*) of the following powers of the said Minister—namely, in respect of shipbuilding and ship-repairing yards and marine engineering establishments, the powers conferred on the Minister by Section 4 (5) of the Munitions of War Act, 1915. And whereas the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 4 (5) and the said arrangement, made on the 29th day of July, 1918 the Munitions (Ordering of Work in Admiralty Establishments) Regulations, 1918. Now the said Minister of Munitions hereby, in pursuance of Section 4 (5) of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Regulation:—

1. The Munitions (Ordering of Work) Regulations, 1916, and the Munitions (Ordering of Work) Amendment Regulation, 1916, and the said Order of the 3rd day of July, 1917, are hereby revoked.

2. Nothing in this regulation contained shall affect the Munitions (Ordering of Work in Admiralty Establishments) Regulations, 1918.

3. This Regulation may be cited as the Munitions (Ordering of Work) Regulation, 1919, and shall come into force on the fifth day of September, 1919.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

Temporary (Reconstruction) Regulations for the selection of Male Clerks in the Employment and Irish Departments of the Ministry of Labour.

1. AGE.—The limits of age for this situation are 19 and 24, and candidates must be of the prescribed age at the date of their qualifying examination.

2. NATIONALITY.—A candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and the son of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception to the latter condition may be made in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the War.

3. MILITARY SERVICE.—Candidates must have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces.

4. HEALTH AND CHARACTER.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. APPLICATION.—Candidates must make application on the appropriate form, which may be obtained from the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, 6, Burlington Gardens, London, W. 1.

6. If the number of candidates greatly exceeds the number of vacancies, the Commissioners may reduce that number by selecting, on a consideration of the application forms, a sufficient number of the best qualified, and only admitting those so selected to the qualifying examination. In making this selection particular regard will be had to the candidates' educational record.

7. QUALIFYING EXAMINATION.—Those candidates who on their application forms and any necessary inquiries appear to the Civil Service Commissioners to be eligible, or those who are selected in accordance with the preceding clause, will undergo a qualifying examination in the following subjects:—

English,
Arithmetic,
General Knowledge,

and those whom the Civil Service Commissioners judge to attain a suitable standard will be passed. No candidate will be allowed more than one attempt at the qualifying examination.

8. COMPETITIVE SELECTION.—Candidates who pass the qualifying examination will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board. Before candidates recommended by the Selection Board are appointed, the Civil Service Commissioners must be satisfied that they satisfy all the conditions laid down in these Regulations.

9. A proportion of the vacancies under these Regulations will be reserved for men disabled in the war who are physically fit for ordinary clerical duties.

10. WARNING.—Any attempt on the part of the candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament, or other influential persons, will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work whether at school, at the university, in the Forces, or otherwise.

11. FEE.—Every candidate is required to pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence, payable when the application form is sent in.

GENERAL ORDER OF THE MINISTRY
OF HEALTH.

THE HOUSING ACTS (COMPULSORY
PURCHASE) REGULATIONS, 1919.

The Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the First Schedule to the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—These Regulations may be cited as “The Housing Acts (Compulsory Purchase) Regulations, 1919.”

ARTICLE II.—The Housing, &c. (Form of Compulsory Purchase Order, &c.) Order, 1911, made by the Local Government Board on the 14th day of June, 1911, is hereby revoked, except so far as it relates to any Compulsory Order made thereunder before the date of these Regulations.

ARTICLE III.—An Order made by a Local Authority under the First Schedule to the Housing, Town Planning, &c., Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as “the Compulsory Order”) shall be in the Form set forth in the Schedule hereto, or in a Form substantially to the like effect.

ARTICLE IV.—(1) Before submitting the Compulsory Order to the Minister of Health for confirmation, the Local Authority shall cause the same to be published by advertisement in two successive weeks in one or more of the local newspapers circulating in the District of the Local Authority and in the Parish or Parishes in which the land to which the Compulsory Order relates is situated.

(2) The advertisements shall be headed respectively “First Advertisement” and “Second and Last Advertisement,” and the first of the said advertisements shall be published not later than the seventh day after the making of the Compulsory Order.

(3) Each of the said advertisements shall contain in addition to a copy of the Compulsory Order a notice setting out the following particulars:—

(a) a statement that any objection to the Compulsory Order must be presented to the Minister of Health within the period of fourteen days from and after the date of the publication of the first advertisement; and

(b) a statement of the period, times, and place or places during and at which the deposited plan referred to in the Schedule to the Compulsory Order may be inspected by or on behalf of any person interested in the land to which the Compulsory Order relates.

(4) The plan referred to in the Schedule to the Compulsory Order shall be deposited by the Local Authority not later than the seventh day after the making of the Compulsory Order at a place convenient for the purposes of inspection, and shall be kept deposited thereat for a period not being less than fourteen days from the date of the publication of the first advertisement; and the said plan shall be open for inspection by any person interested or affected, without payment of any fee, at all reasonable hours on any week-day during the said period. The Local Authority shall also make suitable provision for affording to any such person inspecting the said plan any necessary explanation or information in regard thereto.

ARTICLE V.—(1) The Local Authority shall, not later than the seventh day after the making of the Compulsory Order, cause notice thereof to be given to every owner, lessee, and occupier of the land to which the Compulsory Order relates, and every such notice shall include a copy of the Compulsory Order, to which shall be appended a notice containing the particulars mentioned in paragraph (3) of Article IV. of these Regulations.

(2) The Local Authority shall furnish a copy of the Compulsory Order, free of charge, to any person interested in the land to which the Compulsory Order relates, upon his applying for the same.

ARTICLE VI.—The period within which an objection to a Compulsory Order may be presented to the Minister of Health by a person interested in the land to which the Compulsory Order relates shall be the period of fourteen days from and after the date of the publication of the first advertisement of the Compulsory Order.

ARTICLE VII.—(1) The Local Authority shall as soon as practicable after the confirmation of the Compulsory Order cause a copy of the Compulsory Order as confirmed to be served on every owner, lessee, and occupier of the land to which the Compulsory Order relates.

(2) A copy of the Compulsory Order as confirmed shall be furnished free of charge by the Local Authority to any person interested in the land authorised to be purchased upon his applying for the same, and a copy of any plan to which reference is made in the Compulsory Order as confirmed shall also be furnished by the Local Authority to any such person upon his applying for such copy and paying the reasonable cost of preparing the same.

ARTICLE VIII.—Every notice or other document which in pursuance of paragraph (1) of Article V. or of paragraph (1) of Article VII. of these Regulations is required to be given or served by the Local Authority to or on an owner, lessee, or occupier, shall be served:—

(a) by delivery of the same personally to the person required to be served, or, if such person is absent abroad or cannot be found, to his agent; or

(b) by leaving the same at the usual or last known place of abode of such person as aforesaid; or

(c) by post as a registered letter addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of such person; or

(d) in any case to which the three preceding paragraphs are inapplicable, by affixing the notice or other document upon some conspicuous part of the land to which the notice or document relates; or

(e) in the case of a notice required to be served on a local authority or corporate body or company, by delivering the same to their clerk or secretary or leaving the same at his office with some person employed there, or by post as a registered letter addressed to such clerk or secretary at his office.

ARTICLE IX.—Articles III. to VIII. of these Regulations shall not apply to any Compulsory Order made before the date hereof.
