The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 4th day of September, 1919, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and Notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 28), which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd Section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes in relation to our said University made under the said Act in manner following:—

STATUTE A.

Chapter 2, Section 18.

"Degrees and titles of Degrees conferred without the fulfilment of the usual conditions"

By repealing the 2nd paragraph of Section 18 of Statute A, Chapter 2, and substituting

therefor the following paragraph to form an amended 2nd paragraph of such section:—

The University shall have power also to grant admission to complete Degrees honoris causa without fulfilment of the usual conditions to persons who, having already been admitted to a Degree in the University, or having obtained some University Office or being in residence in the University, and having resided continuously for six terms, are distinguished by conspicuous merit.

STATUTE A.

Chapter 2, Section 19.

"Affiliated Colleges."

By repealing Section 19 of Statute A, Chapter 2, and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 19:—

The University shall have power to recognise as an Associated Institution any University or other Institution which is engaged in the education of adult Students, and to grant to the Students of such Institutions who shall have continued members thereof for such length of time, being not less than two years, and shall have attended such lectures and passed such examinations as may be required from time to time by Grace of

the Senate, the privilege, on their admission as Members of the University, that they shall be deemed for such purposes and under such condutions as the Senate may from time to time by Grace determine to have already kept by residence one or more terms (not exceeding three in number).

The University shall have power also at any time to withdraw the privilege of asso-

ciation from any Associated Institution.
The University shall have power also to. admit on like conditions to the same privileges adult Students attending a course of education conducted by a Committee in concert with the University in places where there is no Associated Institution.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (DATED 11TH SEPTEMBER 1919.)

WARWICKSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 7).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

Modification of Orders.

1. The Warwickshire and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, and the Warwickshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 2 to 6) are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Free Movement into and within Zone II.

- 2. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the Orders referred to in Article 1 shall not apply to any movement of animals-

 - (a) within Zone II; or
 (b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

Prohibition of Movement out of Zone II.

3. No animal shall be moved out of Zone III for any purpose.

Regulation of Markets, &c, in Zone II.

- 4.—(1.) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II, except in accordance with the following provisions:-
 - (i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(2.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Order shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 4 of Order (No. 3).

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of September, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title, etc.

6. This Order may be cited as the Warwickshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 7), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH SEPTEMBER 1919.)

DORSETSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

- 1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be landed in or moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; providedthat nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District, without unnecessary delay, and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.
- (2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to Restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

- 2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, profibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right-of-way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:
 - (i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.
 - (ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.
- (3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

- 3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Eocal Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a Notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—
 - (a) to keep in confinement, or under con-

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- trol, as may be prescribed by the Notice, dogs on such premises;
- or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;
- or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;
- and if any occupier after service of any such Notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof; he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by Notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such Notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such Notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (3.) Every Notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further Notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.
- (4.) A copy of every Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 5.—(1.) If an animal is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner, and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Dorset-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

Vessels proceeding into the North sea which wish to obtain the latest Mine Warnings to Mariners or other information regarding routes in order to check, correct, or amplify the instructions already in their possession, must pass through the Downs, and should:

- (a) By day, fly Y flag, International Code.
- (b) By night, make the flashing signal "Y" by Morse code, until attended to, to indicate that they wish to be boarded for this purpose. They should approach the boarding vessel, which will exhibit:
 - (a) By day, 3 black balls horizontally.
 - (b) By night, 3 red lights horizontally.
- 3. On and after 1st October, 1919, the Boarding Service in the Downs will be discontinued, and the arrangements notified in paragraph 2 above will then cease.

Vessels requiring the latest Mine Warnings to Mariners must then obtain them through the same sources by which they obtain Admiralty Notices to Mariners under normal peace arrangements.

4. British merchant vessels approaching the Straits of Dover are to hoist their number in the International Code.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.

CLOSING OF PORTS.

Former Notice.—No. 1 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

- (1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III. of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being disthe port or locality should played, approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.
- (2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.

(3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III. of this Notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing movable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

PART II. EXAMINATION SERVICE.

- (4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad, referred to in Part III. of this Notice.
- (5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.
- (6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III., serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two red and two white, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

RED BLUE

By night the steamer will carry: -

- (a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.
- (b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

- (8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the distinguishing signal of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal.
- (9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that they must not lower any boats, communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer (except to avoid accident).

(10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the port should be approached with caution.

The order prohibiting merchant vessels from making use of private signals when approaching ports is no longer in force.

(12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

Notice is hereby given that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force

H.M. Vessels are constantly engaged, both singly and in pairs, in sweeping operations off the coasts of the United Kingdom, and whilst so engaged they are hampered to a very considerable extent in their maneuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which they are engaged, these vessels will show the signals hereinafter mentioned, and for the public safety all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying these signals and not approach them inside the distances mentioned herein, specially remembering that it is dangerous to pass inside these distances or between the vessels of a pair, as the vessels may have mines trailing in their sweeps and also on account of the danger caused to traffic if minesweepers have to slip their sweeps to get out of the way of vessels.

1. SIGNALS THAT WILL BE SHOWN BY DAY.

(a) By vessels working singly:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at each yardarm or where they can best be seen.

Vessels showing this signal are not to be approached nearer than 300 yards.

(b) By vessels working in pairs:

A' black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yardarm or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous to pass.

. Vessels are not to pass within a distance of 400 yards astern of a single pair of sweepers, or when more than one pair are working in company within a distance of 400 yards astern of rear pair. They are on no account to attempt to pass between pairs working in company.

2. Signals that will be Shown by Night.

As for day, except that all round green lights will be used in place of the black balls.

Caution

Part IV. of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in Part IV. of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
