The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 4th day of September, 1919, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and Notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 28), which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd Section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes in relation to our said University made under the said Act in manner following:—

STATUTE A.

Chapter 2, Section 18.

"Degrees and titles of Degrees conferred without the fulfilment of the usual conditions."

By repealing the 2nd paragraph of Section 18 of Statute A, Chapter 2, and substituting

therefor the following paragraph to form an amended 2nd paragraph of such section:—

The University shall have power also to grant admission to complete Degrees *honoris causa* without fulfilment of the usual conditions to persons who, having already been admitted to a Degree in the University, or having obtained some University Office or being in residence in the University, and having resided continuously for six terms, are distinguished by conspicuous merit.

STATUTE A.

Chapter 2, Section 19.

"Affiliated Colleges."

By repealing Section 19 of Statute A, Chapter 2, and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 19:—

The University shall have power to recognise as an Associated Institution any University or other Institution which is engaged in the education of adult Students, and to grant to the Students of such Institutions who shall have continued members thereof for such length of time, being not less than two years, and shall have attended such lectures and passed such examinations as may be required from time to time by Grace of
