

the Senate, the privilege, on their admission as Members of the University, that they shall be deemed for such purposes and under such conditions as the Senate may from time to time by Grace determine to have already kept by residence one or more terms (not exceeding three in number).

The University shall have power also at any time to withdraw the privilege of association from any Associated Institution.

The University shall have power also to admit on like conditions to the same privileges adult Students attending a course of education conducted by a Committee in concert with the University in places where there is no Associated Institution.
