

week to *Dunkirk*, and 'tis said he is to go and Cruise to the Northward. Several small Squadrons are fitting out to be Commanded by the Marquis de *Hemond*, and others, which is done chiefly at the Charge of particular Persons. The Advices from *Provence* of the 20th instant say, That several Vessels laden with Stores and Provisions for the Ships sitting at *Toulon*, which they expected by the Canal of *Languedoc*, were not yet arrived, by which means the Fleet cannot be ready till the month of *March*. The French King has not yet declared the Generals to Command his Armies this Summer in *Germany* and *Catalonia*, but 'tis said at Court, that the Duke of *Vendome* is designed for the first, and the Duke of *Maine* for the last. 'Tis at last resolved to continue the Poll Tax this year, upon the same Foot as the last.

Brussels, *Febr. 1.* The Earl of *Athlone* having taken a Review of the Dutch Cavalry quartered in this Province is gone to do the like in *Beaumont*, and the Country of *Liege*. A great quantity of Ammunition and Provisions has been sent lately from *Masfricks* to be laid up in the Magazines at *Namur*. The Marechal de *Boufflers* having visited the French Garisons between the *Meuse* and the *Sambre*, is gone from thence into *Flanders*, to visit in like manner the Garisons on that side. We have Advice, That the French Troops which are quartered at *Doway*, *Arras*, and other Places of the Province of *Artois*, are ordered to march towards the Frontiers of *Flanders*.

Hague, *Feb. 3.* N.S. There has happened a great Tumult at *Amsterdam*; The occasion of which was, that the States of *Holland* having some time since laid a Tax upon Burials, the Magistrates of that City thought it necessary to appoint certain Officers to be employed as Bearers on such Occasions, which before used to be done by the Poorer sort of People. This Regulation began to take place on the 31th past at the Burial of a Poor Man, and the Magistrates by way of Precaution, had ordered a Guard near the *Alms House* from whence the Corps was to be carried; Hereupon the Rabble got together, and having forced the said Guard to leave their Station, they went to the Houses of two of the Burghermasters and plundered them, as they did afterwards to one or two other Houses. The Burghers were ordered to their Arms to suppress this Disorder; And the Chief of the Inhabitants got on Horseback, and Riding through the Streets dispersed the Rabble; The Tumult lasted Tuesday and Wednesday, during which time several of the Mutineers were killed, and many taken, five of which have been already Hanged, and several of the rest will be likewise Executed. The Regiment of Horse Guards that is quartered here marched on Wednesday night towards *Amsterdam*, but came back again this afternoon, there being no occasion for them; And we hear by the Letters of this day, that all is now appeased and quiet there; And that yesterday the 4 new Burghermasters were Chosen very orderly, who Thanked the Burghers for the great Zeal they have shewed in this occasion.

Pembroke, *Jan. 28.* The Joseph of New England is arrived in this Harbour; And the Tyger is fitted for Bristol.

Weymouth, *Feb. 1.* The strong S.W. Winds continue, and keep both the Spanish Packet Boats, with several Mails in this Port.

Plimouth, *Feb. 2.* Yesterday came in here the West India ship of *St. Michaelborough*, laden with Sugars from the *West Indies*.

Weymouth, *Febr. 1.* VVe have recd of an account yesterday, that a Danish Ship of about 120 Tons, laden with Wine and Brandy, was cast away on the coast of *Parish*, but the Men with some part of the Cargo, are saved. The *Armed frigate* sailed hence 2 days ago to the *Westward*.

Yarmouth, *Feb. 3.* Yesterday sailed out of this Road His Majesty's Ship the *Centurion*, with 3 Transport Ships under her Convoy for *Ostend*; as likewise 20 laden Colliers for the River. This day came in the *Assistance*, with several laden Ships from *Humber*, bound to *London*.

Cowes, *Feb. 3.* On Saturday morning came in here a French Privateer from *Spithead*, and in the evening two other Dutch Privateers from the *Eastward*. Yesterday the Swallow Prize and Mary Anne put in here from *Southampton*; as also the Elizabeth Hoy of and for *Amsterdam*, from *Weymouth*.

Portsmouth, *Feb. 4.* The outward bound Ships continue at *Spithead*; the *Wind* at N.N.W.
