And whereas it is further provided that His Majesty may by Order make such incidental, consequential and supplemental provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to any transfer of powers or duties as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919.

2. The date upon which the powers as aforesaid of the Board of Trade are transferred to the Minister of Transport shall be the Twenty-third day of September, 1919.

3. The particular powers and duties specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be excepted from the powers and duties of the Board of Trade transferred by the said Act to the Minister of Transport.

1. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Transport (Ministry of Health Exception of Powers) Order, 1919.

2. The date on which the powers as aforesaid of the Minister of Health are transferred to the Minister of Transport shall be the Twenty-third day of September, 1919.

3. There shall be excepted from such transfer

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(i) the powers and duties of the Minister of Health in regard to the matters aforesaid of giving sanction to the borrowing of money by Local Authorities;

(ii) the powers and duties of the Minister of Health under the Housing Acts, 1890 to 1919

(iii) the powers and duties of the Minister of Health with respect to the confirmation of by-laws made by Local Authorities other than by-laws made under Section 26 of the Highways and Locomotives (Amendment) Act, 1878, and by-laws made under Section 6 of the Locomotives Act, 1898.

Provided that in the exercise of the powers so excepted so far as they relate to roads, bridges, vehicles and traffic thereon the Minister of Health shall act in consultation with the Minister of Transport.

HEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 11 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is enacted that the Act shall come into operation upon such day or days as may be appointed by Order in Council, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and provisions of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The appointed day shall be the first day of October, 1919, in the case of the following paragraphs of the said Act, namely:

(a) Paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Act, which relates to the powers of the Board of Education with respect to attending to the health of expectant mothers and nursing mothers, and of children who have not attained the age of 5 years, and are not in attendance at schools recognised by the Board of Education; and

(b) Paragraph (f) of the same sub-section, which relates to powers of supervising the administration of Part I. of the Children Act, 1908, heretofore exercised by the Secretary of State.

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, (Date of Commencement) Order (No. 2), 1919.

The following fee is hereby established, and shall be deemed to be substituted for Fee No. 75 in Part II of the Table of Fees annexed respectively to "The Consular Fees (General) Order in Council," "The China (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1906," and "The Japan (Consular and Marriage Fees) Order in Council, 1906 '':-

"75. Visa of a passport valid for a single journey, five shillings (5s.). "Ditto, valid for more than a single

journey, one pound (£1.)."

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the fee directed by this Order to be varied in the tables of fees annexed to the said Orders shall be thus varied.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE SORTING ASSISTANT IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, LONDON, AND IN THE GENERAL REGISTER OFFICE, LONDON.

#### These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any If an Examination year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Muni-cipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners

That they are unmarried or widows.

b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject.

3. At each Examination the number of

- 3. Spelling.

Candidates must pass in Writing and obtain such an aggregate number of marks as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to Examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates for the Post Office Service must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the competition.

8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and iu such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners

10. A fee of 3s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

#### Extension of Scheduled District.

1. The North Essex and Suffolk (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included in, and formed part of, the Scheduled District part of, District described in the Schedule to that Order.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of September, nineteen hundred and nineteen: Provided that until the twenty-seventh day of that month a dog in or on any public place in the Area described in the Schedule hereto need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

#### Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the North Essex and Suffolk (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1. ### ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH SEPTEMBER 1919.)

#### DORSETSHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Modification of Order.

1. The Dorsetshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

#### Movement into the Zone for Immediate Slaughter.

2.---(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises, not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Footand-Mouth Disease, to a railway station or landing-place situate within the Zone described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Zone"); and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing-place to any slaughterhouse situate within the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing-place is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises, not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, to any slaughterhouse in the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

# Movement within the Zone or within the Isle of Portland.

3. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Zone to any other premises in the Zone, or from premises in the Isle of Portland to any other premises in the Isle of Portland, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

## Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals.

4. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Zone, or in any other part of the Scheduled District.

#### Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement by road into the Zone or is movement to a slaughterhouse in the Zone from premises in the Zone other than a railway station or landing-place, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following :—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow about six inches long on the left hindquarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in the Scheduled District which is not in the Zone, or in the Isle of Portland, as the case may be.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A. Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

#### Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

7. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot-andmouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

#### Saving for Orders and Regulations.

8. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.---(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Offences.

10.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each

according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894." "The Board "means the Board of Agri-

"The Board " means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

"Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of September, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

#### Short Title, &c.

13. This Order may be cited as the DORSET-SHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

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#### To be Printed as Indorsement on Licence.

The movement of animals under this Licence is subject to any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, and also to any Regulation made by a Local Authority for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

This Licence does not authorise movement of an animal which is affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease or movement into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, or movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by a notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries given under any Order of the Board.

Animals while being moved under this Licence must be accompanied by the Licence and must, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. They must be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house or bacon factory they must be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence must forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an Officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same district by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

This Licence is not available if it is granted by the owner of the animals to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animals, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animals are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Caution.—Persons acting without a Licence where a Licence is necessary, or acting thereon after the Licence has expired, or counterfeiting, fabricating, or altering, or obtaining or endeavouring to obtain a Licence by means of a false pretence, or granting or issuing a Licence knowing the same to be false in any respect, or committing other offences with respect to a Licence, are liable under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, to fine and imprisonment.

Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915: Extending Time for operation of certain provisions of the Tynemouth Corporation Act, 1916.

BOROUGH OF TYNEMOUTH.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Tynemouth ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

W HEREAS by virtue of the provisions of Section 19 of the Tynemouth Corporation Act, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1916"), the time limited for the exercise by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Tynemouth (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") of their powers for the compulsory purchase of lands or easements under the Act of 1916 expired on the 3rd day of August, 1919;

And whereas by virtue of the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 36 of the Act of 1916, and of an Order dated the 26th day of June, 1918, issued by the Local Government Board under Section 1 of the Special Acts (Extension of Time) Act, 1915, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1915"), the time within which the Corporation are required to serve effective notices to treat for the purchase of or otherwise acquire the lands and easements necessary for the construction of certain works authorised by the Act of 1916 and specified in the said sub-section (1) expired on the 3rd day of August, 1919:

And whereas in pursuance of Section 1 of the Act of 1915 the Corporation applied to the Ministry of Health before the expiration of the times limited as aforesaid for an Order extending the same:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers given to him by Sec-

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tion 1 of the Act of 1915, and of any other powers in that behalf, hereby extends until the 31st day of July, 1920-

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(a) the time limited by Section 19 of the Act of 1916 for the exercise of the powers of the Corporation for the compulsory purchase of lands or easements under that Act; and

(b) the time limited by sub-section (1) of Section 35 of the Act of 1916 for the exercise of the powers of the Corporation to construct the works specified in that sub-section and to supply water within the Urban District of Ashington; and

(c) the time limited as aforesaid within which the Corporation are required to serve notices to treat for the purchase of or otherwise acquire the lands and easements necessary for the construction of certain works authorised by the Act of 1916 and specified in sub-section (1) of Section 36 of that Act.
