ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH SEPTEMBER 1919.)

BRISTOL (CUMBERLAND BASIN, HOTWELLS)
IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Revocation of certain Orders.

1. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

Definition of Landing Place for Irish Animals at Bristol (Cumberland Basin, Hotwells)

2. The following part of the port of Bristol is hereby defined as a landing place for Irish animals; that is to say:—

All those premises situate between Merchant's Dock and Cumberland Basin, Hotwells, in the city of Bristol, which are coloured pink and green on the plan sealed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the office of the Board.

Special Provisions applicable to Landing Place.

3. Such part of the Landing Place as is not coloured pink on the plan may be used for the landing of animals other than Irish animals if such part has since it was last used for the land-
