By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of

Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamations dated respectively the 18th day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of March, 1919, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

(A) Aeroplane engines and their component parts;

(A) Aircraft, other than balloons, of all kinds and their component parts, together with accessories and articles suitable for use in connection with aircraft;

(A) Beer and ale;

Forage and food which may be used for animals, the following:—

(A) Cakes and meals, the following:—

Fishmeal and concentrated fish;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Fish, except tinned, preserved, or frozen fish, chinchards, sprats and herrings;

(A) Salmon, tinned;

(A) Fruit and fruit preserves, except olives;

(A) Malt;

(A) Telegraphs and telephones, wireless, and instruments and material for wireless telegraphic and telephonic apparatus, including valves;

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

(B) Aeroplane engines and their component parts;

(B) Aircraft, other than balloons, of all kinds and their component parts, together with accessories and articles suitable for use in connection with aircraft;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Fish, except chinchards, sprats, herrings and crayfish, and except preserved, frozen or tinned fish other than tinned salmon;

(A) Tinned salmon;

(A) Fruit and fruit preserves, except olives and except the following fresh fruits:—

Apricots, grape fruits, green figs, peaches, pears, pineapples, nectarines, imported plums (South African), and imported melons.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The following STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Trinity Hall, Cambridge, on the 14th day of June, 1919, and sealed on the 20th day of September, 1919, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

STATUTE

To alter and amend the Statutes of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College or Hall (specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the 14th day of June, 1919) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of all persons

present and voting, and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College or Hall in the following manner:—

By adding to Statute XVII., intituled "Supernumerary Fellows," the following Section to form Section 2 of that Statute:—

2. An ex-Fellow shall be eligible for election or re-election to a Supernumerary Fellowship, and shall hold his Fellowship for life or for such period as shall be fixed at the time of his election or re-election by the vote of the majority of the Governing Body, provided, however, that the combined number of Fellowships held under this Section of this Statute shall never exceed three at any one time.

MARRIAGES IN THE UNITED KINGDOM BETWEEN BELGIAN SUBJECTS AND OTHERS.

An Agreement was concluded in 1888 between His Majesty's Government and the Belgian Government whereby the Belgian Legation in London were to furnish parties to marriages in this country between British and Belgian subjects with certificates attesting the fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by Belgian law, the omission of which might give rise to proceedings for nullity.

This Agreement has been modified in so far that certificates of the kind in question will

now be issued by the Belgian Consulate-General in London and not by the Belgian Embassy.

Whereas under Section 1 (1) (a) of the Profiteering Act, 1919, the Board of Trade have power in respect of any article to which the Act is applied to investigate prices, costs and profit at all stages and on any such investigation by Order to fix maximum prices:

And whereas by Order dated the 1st October, 1919, the Act was applied to motor spirit used or capable of being used for supplying motive power to vehicles whether taxed or not.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in the exercise of the above recited powers do hereby fix the prices set out in the Schedule hereto as the maximum prices which may be charged on the sale of such spirit.

This Order shall come into force forthwith, and may be cited as the Profiteering Act, 1919, Maximum Prices Order (No. 1).

Whereas Section 1 of the Profiteering Act, 1919, provides that the Act may be applied by

order of the Board of Trade to any article or class of articles declared by the Order to be one or one of a kind in common use by the public, or being material, machinery or accessories used in the production of such articles, but that the Act shall not apply to any articles which are from time to time declared to be controlled articles.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby declare motor spirit used or capable of being used for supplying motive power to motor vehicles, whether taxed or not, to be an article in common use by the public, and do hereby order that the Profiteering Act, 1919, shall apply to such motor spirit.

This Order shall come into force forthwith, and may be cited as the Profiteering Act, 1919, Order (No. 3).
