Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Fish, except chinchards, sprats, herrings and crayfish, and except preserved, frozen or tinned fish other than tinned salmon;

(A) Tinned salmon;

(A) Fruit and fruit preserves, except olives and except the following fresh fruits:—

Apricots, grape fruits, green figs, peaches, pears, pineapples, nectarines, imported plums (South African), and imported melons.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The following STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Trinity Hall, Cambridge, on the 14th day of June, 1919, and sealed on the 20th day of September, 1919, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

STATUTE

To alter and amend the Statutes of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College or Hall (specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the 14th day of June, 1919) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of all persons

present and voting, and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College or Hall in the following manner:—

By adding to Statute XVII., intituled "Supernumerary Fellows," the following Section to form Section 2 of that Statute:—

2. An ex-Fellow shall be eligible for election or re-election to a Supernumerary Fellowship, and shall hold his Fellowship for life or for such period as shall be fixed at the time of his election or re-election by the vote of the majority of the Governing Body, provided, however, that the combined number of Fellowships held under this Section of this Statute shall never exceed three at any one time.
