WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and

Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council dated the 18th August, 1919:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that paragraph one of the Order in Council of the 18th day of August, 1919, shall extend to the Isle of Man.

DORSETSHIRE (FOOT - AND - MOUTH  
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 7).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Modification of Existing Orders.*

1. The Dorsetshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, the Dorsetshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 2 to 6) hereinafter referred to as "the existing Orders," are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

*Withdrawal of Restrictions from Zone III.  
Contraction of Scheduled District.*

2. The restrictions imposed by the existing Orders shall cease to apply to the Zone III described in the Schedule to Order (No. 6), and that Zone shall accordingly cease to form part of the Scheduled District.

*Free Movement into and within Zone II.*

3. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the existing Orders shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II; or

(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

*Regulation of Markets, &c., in Zone II.*

4. (1) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II except in accordance with the following provisions:—

(i) A market or sale may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Order.

(ii) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Order and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(2) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Order shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of Order (No. 3).

*Commencement.*

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of October, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

*Short Title, &c.*

6. This Order may be cited as the DORSETSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 7), and shall be read with the existing Orders.
