Deal. Mov. 23. . He last night failed out of the Downs the Succefs Fregas with the seft of the Fleet of Merchant thips gutward bound with a fair wind. On Saturday laft, a thip bound from Hambourgh for Legorn, fell upon the Goodmin fands, where the ran much hazard, but by the affiftance of fome Boats which were timely fent out from hence to her affiftance, got off again with the lols onely of her Rudder.

On Sunday last arrived here by post Monsieur Claret one of the Chamber to the Queen Christina of Swedeland, in-forming that her Majefiy left Hambourgh the 16 of the laft Moneth, and was upon her way hither ; the Pope received the News with much fatisfaction, gratifying the faid Clarea with a Medal of Gold, and another of Si ver : giving order to the Governours of all places under his Domanion by which the was to pais, to receive her with honour, and to defray her Expences.

The Republick of Genous leems inclinable to concur with the Popes defires, in permitting their disbanded forces to pais into the Venetian Service under the Popes Name, but have ordered their Refident to exhibit their Complaints against the Governour of Milan, who has made a ftop up-on the interest of their Bank of St. Ambraini, upon pretence that the Republick has feiled two Spanish Barkes. whole Captains endeavoured to have got away without paying their Cuftoms.

-The Pope feens selolved to proceed to the promotion of Cardinals the next Ember Weeks which Father Mitard the Queen of Spiin's Confessor y endeavours to "anticipate : hoping by virtue of a Cap, the better to fecure himfelffrom the ftorms which threaten him in that Kingdom.

A Defamatory and Satirical Libel being lately foread abroad under the Name of a Journal of the Voyage of D: Era. Vinconzo, feveral perfons have been examined and imprifoned about it, but as yet the Author nor diff covered.

Legorn, Nov. 5. Yesterday arrived here part of the Dutch Convoy from Holland, viz. two men of War and one Merchant thip, the seft of them being put into Genoua. The fame day came in two French thips, one from Cypruss the other in 37 days from Alexandria, and in 18 front Maltha, the Captain of this latter informing, that at his departure from Alexandria, there entred a French Polach, in 8 days from Candia, affirming that the Viller was not dead (as was reported) but had cauled the head of one of the Ballas to be cur off, for making an affault without Otders and with ill fuccels upon the Town , that many of the Turks had left their Colours, and were leattered in leveral parts of the Ifland, but that the Vifier had used all methods to induce them to return 3 bus that his ferenity in putting to death fee veral of them, when returned to the Camp, had cauled the seft of them to fecure themfelves in the Mountains. He fases ther tells us, that the 13th of Offober, three French men of War and a Firethip went out from Maltha, intending for Conftantinople to take in their Ambaffadors who was to be recalled from that employment; and that the day following put to fea from thence the other four French fhips, whereon were embarked the fuccors defigned for Candia.

A Dark arriving here from Cefalonia and Zante in 30 dayes, tells us, that a Feluca touching at Cerigo in her way from Candia, affured them the Turks were torced by the rains to quit their Posts before Candia ; upon which News all the Guns were fired from the Fortrels in demonstration of their joy : farther laying, that the Captain of the Gulfe was arrived at Zante with three Gallies and 600 men, bound for Candia ; and that Quarters were taken up at Zante for 5000 men, which were in little time expected there from leveral parts.

By a ship arriving here in 16 dayes from Meffina, we are adviled, that on the day of her departure thence, there pur in the St. Dominico a Genouele thip from Smirna, affirm-I ing, that three Corfairs of Tripoli, had off Sapienga taken the Segnora di Miferica dia a great Genouele Ship of 26' Guns , on her return from Constantinop'e and Smirnk , to the value of 100 thouland Dollars ; but this thip and another, of her company had happily efcaped them.

Hambourgh, Nov. 23. The Swedift forces which were removed out of the Dutchy of Bremen are shipped away for Swedeland, Liefland, and other places where they are to be disposed of into their quarters.
