War Office, 15th October, 1919.

The Secretary of State for War has received the following Supplement to the Despatch, dated 1st December, 1918, from General Sir George F. Milne, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., D.S.O., Commanding-in-Chief, Army of the Black Sea:—

Great praise is due to the units of the Machine Gun Corps for the high standard of efficiency which has always been maintained during the arduous period of defence, and also for the admirable manner in which all ranks performed their duties in the attack and subsequent pursuit.

The British Labour Companies and the Macedonian Labour Corps, under very difficult conditions, worked most efficiently in the construction of roads and communications. They were called on to undergo the most severe physical effort during the advance, notably on the Doiran-Strumnitza Road, and responded admirably to every call made on them.
